# Summary of main issues

This is an application to vary a premises licence held by Co-op Village Store 52 Street Lane, Roundhay, Leeds, LS8 2ET

The variation is to extend the hours of the sale by retail of alcohol and opening hours in the mornings as detailed in 3.3 of the report.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted a representation from Environmental Protection Team as a responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2003.

### 1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

# 2.0 History of Premises

2.1 The premises benefits from a Premise Licence and is licensed to sell alcohol for consumption off the Premise.

  - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 8.2 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.
