No non- standard timings for bank holidays or special occasions are proposed.

Other matters relevant to the application

- 3.4 The premises is already trading as a Dominos Pizza but the applicants wish to trade beyond 23:00 hours hence this application.
- At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

4.0 Steps to promote the Licensing Objectives

4.1 The applicant has not offered any specific steps to promote the licensing objectives.

- 7.1 The Licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 7.2 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.
