# Summary of main issues

This is an application for the grant of a premises licence for Jills Stores, 37 Hough Lane, Bramley, Leeds, LS13 3PS

This is the first application for a Premise licence. The premise currently operates as a convenience store and adjoins a takeaway sandwich shop which is owned by the applicant.

8.1 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or interested parties. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of an interested party, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

#### 8.2 Representations from Responsible Authorities

- 8.2.1 Any representations submitted may be agreed prior to a hearing. In this instance the operating schedule has been amended to include measures agreed with West Yorkshire Police. A copy of which may be found at **Appendix C**.

## 8.3 Representations from Interested parties

The application has attracted representations from interested parties.

The Licensing Section is in receipt of six individual letters of objection. The main concern is the nuisance currently experienced by local residents of traffic pulling up outside, leaving car engines running, and the smell from the current extraction fans. The residents currently suffer from problems arising from litter discarded around their properties and are concerned that this would only escalate.

There is a concern with regards to the incitement of under age drinking and the possibility of vandalism and drunken behaviour.

Copies of the representations will be available at the hearing for Members consideration.

#### 9.0 Options Available to Members

- 9.1 The Licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - Grant the application as requested.
  - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
  - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
  - Reject the whole or part of the application.

9.2 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.
