

## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:-
  - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
  - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
  - c. damage
2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4. The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made
  - a. By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC,) Where the film has been classified by the Board, or
  - b. By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or,
  - c. where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20 (3) (b) (74 (3) (b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.
5. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

- a. games or activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
  - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- c. provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- d. provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a

sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -

- i. the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
  - ii. the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- e. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
7. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
8. Conditions Effective from 1st October 2010
9. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
10. The responsible person shall ensure that -
- a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
    - i. beer or cider. 1/2 pint;
    - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - iii. still wine in a glass:125 ml; and
  - b. customers are made aware of the availability of these measures

#### **11. Sale by retail of alcohol**

##### Non Standard Timings:

From the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the commencement of permitted hours on New Years Day.

Christmas Eve/Boxing Day until 01:30 hours.

#### **12. Provision of late night refreshment**

##### Location where activity will take place:

This activity will take place indoors.

Activity Details:

Provision of hot food and drinks available particularly during the wind down period.

Non Standard Timings:

New Years Eve until 05:00 hours.

Christmas Eve/Boxing Day until 02:00 hours.

**13. Exhibition of a film**

Location where activity will take place:

This activity will take place indoors.

Activity Details:

Video entertainment on TV screens.

Non Standard Timings:

From the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the commencement of permitted hours on New Years Day.

Christmas Eve/Boxing Day until 01:30 hours.

**14. Indoor sporting events**

Activity Details:

To permit pub games that attract an audience either by advertisement or spontaneous.

Non Standard Timings:

From the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the commencement of permitted hours on New Years Day.

Christmas Eve/Boxing Day until 01:30 hours.

**15. Performance of live music**

Location where activity will take place:

This activity will take place indoors.

Activity Details:

Live acoustic/amplified music and voice.

Non Standard Timings:

Christmas Eve/Boxing Day until 00:30 hours.

New Years Eve until 01:30 hours.

**16. Performance of recorded Music**

Location where activity will take place:

This activity will take place indoors.

Activity Details:

To provide recorded music including jukebox and karaoke if required.

Non Standard Timings:

From the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the commencement of permitted hours on New Years Day.

Christmas Eve/Boxing Day until 01:30 hours.

**17. Entertainment similar to live music, recorded music or dance**

Type of entertainment taking place:

Quizzes, comedians, speciality acts (not adult entertainment).

Location where activity will take place:

This activity will take place indoors.

Non Standard Timings:

From the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the commencement of permitted hours on New Years Day.

Christmas Eve/Boxing Day until 01:30 hours.

**18. Provision of facilities for dancing**

Location where activity will take place:

This activity will take place indoors.

Non Standard Timings:

From the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the commencement of permitted hours on New Years Day.

Christmas Eve/Boxing Day until 01:30 hours.

**19. Concerns in respect of children**

None defined

**Conditions consistent with the operating schedule relating to the licensing objectives**

**The prevention of crime and disorder**

20. CCTV is installed at the premises in accordance with guidelines issued by West Yorkshire Police and tapes/DVD's to be kept for a minimum of 31 days.
21. The Designated Premise Supervisor maintain an incident report for staff to record any incidents on the premises.
22. If door staff are used there will be a record register retained for 1 year and to be produced for immediate inspection on request of any official of the SIA, Police or Licensing Authority.

23. Alcohol shall not be removed from the premises unless in a sealed container.
24. There shall be a zero tolerance to drugs, violence and any form of anti-social behaviour.
25. Check 21 proof of age scheme in accordance with guidance issued by West Yorkshire Police.
26. Member of Pub Watch if a scheme exists.

#### **Public safety**

27. Health and Safety at work/fire procedures posters.
28. Accident book/first aid kit.
29. Fire/workplace risk assessment.
30. Fire Alarm/Fire Extinguishers/Smoke Detectors tested regularly.
31. Emergency lights tested regularly.

#### **The prevention of public nuisance**

##### **32. Noise and Vibration**

Noise from a licensable activity at the premises shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises after 23:00 hours and at all times if entertainment takes place on more than 30 occasions per year.

33. Noise from plant and machinery shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant and machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
34. The PLH/DPS will ensure patrons use, external areas in a manner which does not cause disturbance to nearby residents and business in the vicinity. Patrons will not use such areas after 23:00 except for the ingress and egress of smokers.

##### **35. Litter**

The PLH/DPS shall ensure that litter arising from people using the premises is cleared away regularly and that promotional materials such as flyers do not create litter.

##### **36. Transport/Pedestrian Movement**

A facility will be provided for customers to order Hackney taxis/private hire vehicles. Telephone numbers for taxi firms/private hire companies will be displayed in a prominent position on the premises.

37. There shall be placed at all exits from the premises prominent, clear and legible notices that can be easily read by the public requiring customers to leave the premises quickly and the area quietly.
38. The Premise Licence Holder or their representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause disturbance to local residents.
39. Refuse, including bottles, shall not be removed from the building for disposal between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 hours.
40. There shall be no external loud speakers.

### **The protection of children from harm**

41. Premises to have house rules relating to children and to be the responsibility of the DPS.
42. Challenge 21 scheme in place. The scheme shall require any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years to produce a recognised proof of age card accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) or if a proof of age card is not available a photo driving licence, passport or accredited student card.
