I am the above named person. I am employed full - time as a Senior Liaison and Enforcement Officer with Leeds City Council's Entertainment Licensing Section. My duties include investigating licensed and unlicensed premises contrary to the Licensing Act 2003. I have delegated authority under the said Act.


Since the 24th November 2005, licensable activities have been regulated under the Licensing Act 2003. This means that a premises carrying on these activities require a Premises Licence or Temporary Event Notice (T.E.N.) authorising the activities.

On the 28th November 2008 Leeds City Council (LCC) Entertainment Licensing Section (ELS) received an application for the grant of a premises licence for premises known as La Liga, Soccer Centre, Gallagher Park, Dick Lane, Thornbury, BD3 7AT.

This application was made by Kirsty Stagg of Inncourt, acting as agent for the proposed premises licence holders Kelvic Leisure Limited, The Coachhouse, Tyresal Hall Farm, Bradford, BD4 0RE.

As part of this application Mr Robert Stewart Blackburn signed a Part B (agreement to premises licence conditions) document on behalf of Kelvic Leisure Limited.

This application was granted on 5 January 2009 and given the unique reference number PREM/02689. The licence was dispatched to the agent on the 6 January 2009.

I exhibit a copy of the application as JPR1. I exhibit a copy of the Part B agreement with West Yorkshire Police signed by Mr Blackburn as JPR2. I exhibit a copy of the covering 

letter and premises licence sent to the agent as JPR3.

On the 11 September 2009, following information received from a local publican regards advertisement for an under 18 nightclub event, I attended at the subject premises. I spoke to the manager a Mr Akeroyd and advised him that the premises licence did not authorise facilities for dancing ie a dance floor and also how to rectify the situation with a minor variation to the licence. I also advised that historically under 18 events were very difficult to control and normally I would advise premises to avoid such events.

On 30 September 2009 an application for a minor variation to the premises licence PREM/02689 was received by Entertainment Licensing. This application made by Kirsty Stagg as agent for Kelvic Leisure Limited was to add the Facility for Dancing to the activities authorised by the premises licence. I exhibit a copy of the application as JPR4.

This application was granted on the 15 October 2009 and a premises licence produced and posted to the agent on 20 October 2009. I exhibit this licence and covering letter as JPR5.

On the 11 February 2010 it was found that the company Kelvic Leisure Limited had been dissolved on 22 December 2009. This being the case the premises licence having not been transferred in the prescribed time period ceased to have effect. I spoke to personnel from the premises and company both on the telephone and in person over the next few days and advised that all licensable activities should cease with immediate effect.

On the 18 February I wrote to Mr Kevin Hainsworth in his capacity as a company director confirming the conversation we had had on the 12 February 2010. I exhibit a copy of the letter as JPR6.

On 24 March 2010 Entertainment Licensing received a fax from R Blackburn indicating instruction to an agent to apply for grant of a new premises licence. I exhibit a copy of the document as JPR7.

On 16 April 2010 Entertainment Licensing received an application for the grant of a premises licence for the La Liga, Soccer Centre, Gallagher Leisure Park, Dick Lane, Thornbury, BD3 7AT. This application was again made by Kirsty Stagg of Inncourt, acting as agent for the applicant (Premises Licence Holder) Mr Robert Stewart Blackburn. Mr Blackburn had also consented to be named on the licence as Designated Premises

Supervisor.

This application was given the unique reference number PREM/02876. I exhibit a copy of the application as JPR8.

This application generated a number of representations (some deemed invalid) from members of the public, and more qualified ones from Environmental Health and Planning.

This application went to a Sub Committee hearing on 7 June 2010 and was granted. I exhibit a copy of the decision letter as JPR9.

Stated as part of the conditions attached to the licence, as offered by the applicant on page 19 section P. (b) The prevention of crime and disorder, the premises agree,
"Alcohol shall not be removed from the premises unless in a sealed container."
"Member of a pubwatch if a scheme exists."

On 15 June 2010 Entertainment Licensing received an application made by John Cordingley acting as agent for Mr Blackburn to vary the Designated Premises Supervisor for the subject Premises Licence. A Mr Graham Howard Cadman consented to be the DPS. I exhibit a copy of this as JPR10.

This transaction took place before the Premises Licence for the premises had been produced / printed and therefore I exhibit as JPR11 a copy of the Premises Licence PREM/02876 as dispatched showing Mr Cadman as DPS.

On the evening of 30 July 2010 in company with West Yorkshire Police I visited the premises to conduct a risk based inspection of the premises and the conditions attached to the Premises Licence. This visit followed concern expressed by the local Neighbourhood Policing Team regards issues arising over under 18 events. At the time of the visit the DPS was not on site and a Mr Simon Akeroyd was in charge. He was advised re the correct display of the Part B licence which was, I believe, incorrectly certified, as was the produced copy of the Part A licence. (Under the Licencing Act 2003 only the Licensing Authority, a solicitor, or a notary, may certify a copy of the original as a true likeness). Akeroyd advised that the previously advertised under 18 Thursday nights had been cancelled and the premises opened nearly exclusively for booked events.

On the 13 August 2010 a member of the public living in the close vicinity of the premises

rang Entertainment Licensing to complain about loud music from the venue until 00:00am on the evenings of 23 July and 31 July 2010. This was beyond permitted hours.

In response to this complaint I produced and posted a warning letter which reminded the reader of the times authorised by the Premises Licence and possible penalties for non-compliance. This letter was sent to the DPS Mr Cadman, the manager Mr Akeroyd and the Premises Licence Holder Mr Blackburn. I exhibit copies of these letters as JPR12.

On 9 Feb 2011 John Cordingley acting as agent for Mr Blackburn applied to vary the named DPS for the premises in order to name Mr Blackburn as DPS. I exhibit a copy of the application as JPR13.

On 4 March 2011 I visited the premises in order to deliver the newly produced Premises Licence and discuss the conditions attached to said licence. I spoke to Mr Blackburn in his capacity as both Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor also present were Simon Baker and a manager named Danielle Green. I advised all present regarding the conditions on the licence and of the past issues regarding noise and under 18 events. At this time Mr Blackburn stated that the 18th parties and under 18 events would cease.

I formed the opinion that the persons present were telling me what they believed I wanted to hear.

I exhibit a copy of the Premises Licence delivered that day as JPR14. This licence is current as no further variations or changes have been made since.

At around this time in 2011 changes in staffing within Entertainment Licensing meant that my specific postcoded area of responsibility changed and I had no further dealings with the premises until the meeting called by PS Fullilove and PC Dobson held on 15 February 2012.

The minutes of this meeting are included in the Review file and I agree the content is an accurate version.

I formed the opinion at the time that the representatives of the premises refused to accept any responsibility for any of the issues raised by the police officers and in fact disbelieved that the issues had even happened.

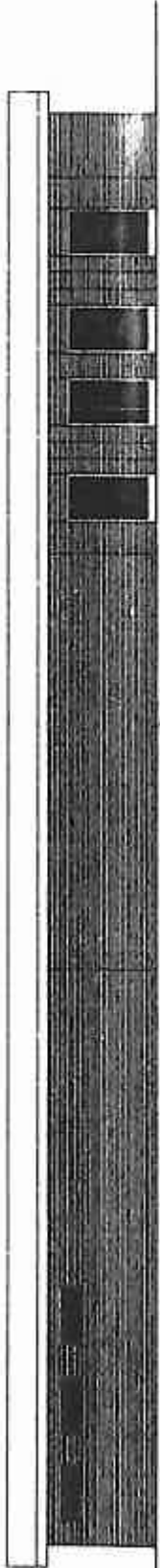

Existing Side Elevation (to soccer courts)



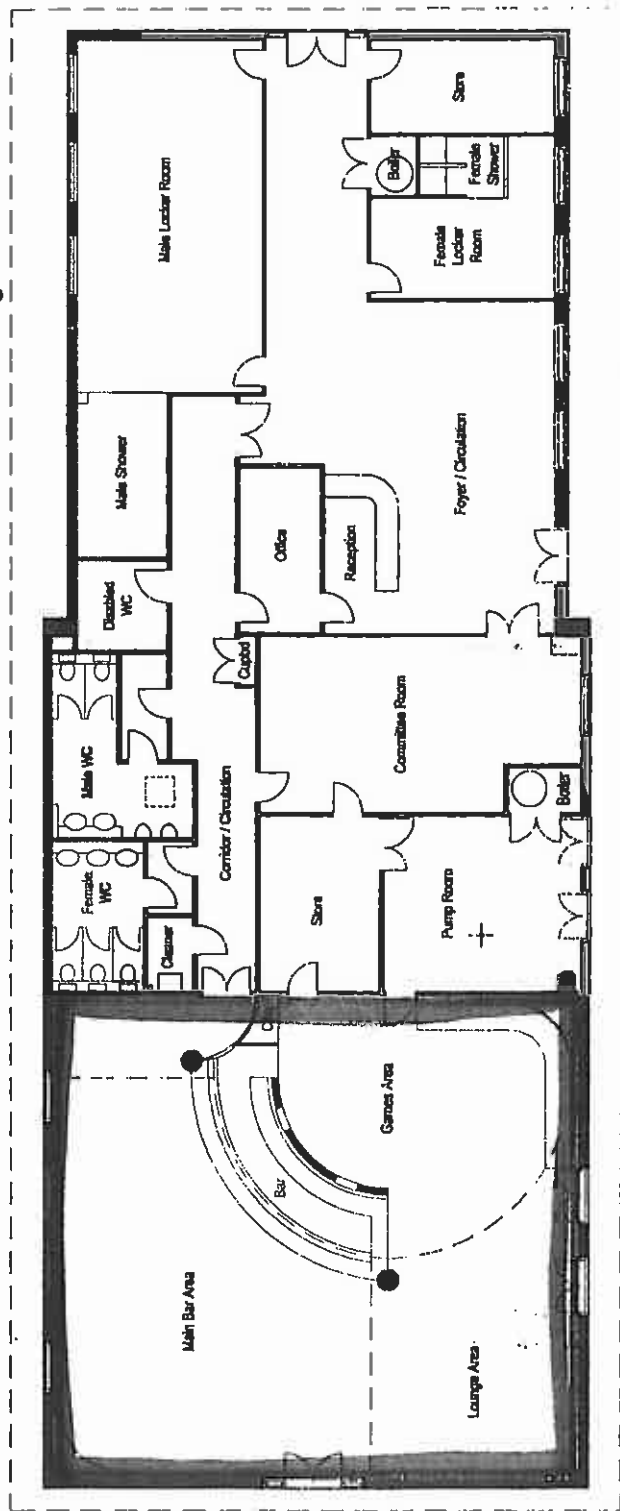
Existing Principle Entrance Elevation

The reason for this decision is as follows:

The Licensing Sub-Committee have heard from responsible authorities and the applicant as well as considered the letters from the objectors.

They have specific concerns with regards to public nuisance and the incident of 20 May 2010 at 23:15 hours when a statutory nuisance was witnessed by the Environmental Protection Team.

The Sub-Committee have also heard from the Planning Department and note that their objections are also based on noise nuisance.

The Committee are concerned that there have been admissions that the building has a tin roof and the building structure was not designed to contain music.

Therefore, the decision of the Licensing Sub-Committee is to grant the Licence for all activities from 10:00 hours every day until 23:30 hours Monday to Saturday and 22:30 hours on a Sunday, each day to have 30 minutes drinking up time. The Licence is also to incorporate the conditions offered by the applicant at Part P and those proposed by responsible authorities, these are deemed necessary and proportionate in their licensing objectives.

Where there is a conflict on conditions those proposed by the responsible authorities will take precedent.



33. Noise from plant and machinery shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant and machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
34. The PLH/DPS will ensure patrons use, external areas in a manner which does not cause disturbance to nearby residents and business in the vicinity. Patrons will not use such areas after 23:00 except for the ingress and egress of smokers.

35. Litter

The PLH/DPS shall ensure that litter arising from people using the premises is cleared away regularly and that promotional materials such as flyers do not create litter.

36. Transport/Pedestrian Movement

A facility will be provided for customers to order Hackney taxis/private hire vehicles. Telephone numbers for taxi firms/private hire companies will be displayed in a prominent position on the premises.

37. There shall be placed at all exits from the premises prominent, clear and legible notices that can be easily read by the public requiring customers to leave the premises quickly and the area quietly.
38. The Premise Licence Holder or their representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause disturbance to local residents.
39. Refuse, including bottles, shall not be removed from the building for disposal between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 hours.
40. There shall be no external loud speakers.

The protection of children from harm

41. Premises to have house rules relating to children and to be the responsibility of the DPS.
42. Challenge 21 scheme in place. The scheme shall require any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years to produce a recognised proof of age card accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) or if a proof of age card is not available a photo driving licence, passport or accredited student card.
