Summary of main issues

1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2.0 History of Premises

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence

3.0 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Tippletreat Ltd,
- 3.2 The application form may be found at Appendix **A** to this report.
- 3.3 In summary the application is for

Sale of alcohol

Every Day 08:00 to 18:00

4.0 Other matters relevant to the application

- 4.1 It is not proposed to permit the general public to enter the premises to purchase goods. The primary operation of the business is the sale of gifts, including fine wines and champagnes but not limited to Internet sales, mail order and telephone sales.
- 4.2 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

5.0 Steps to promote the Licensing Objectives

5.1 The applicant proposes to take specific steps to promote the licensing objectives identified in section "P" of the application form.

6.0 Proposed Designated Premises Supervisor

6.1 Adam Franks intends to be the Designated Premises Supervisor.

7.0 Location

7.1 A map which identifies the location of this premise is attached at Appendix **B.**

8.0 Representations

- 8.1 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or other persons. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of an other persons must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 8.2 Representations from Responsible Authorities
- 8.2.1 There has been representation from Noise Protection Team in their capacity as a responsible authority.
- 8.2.2 The representation submitted by the Noise Protection Team remains a matter for Members consideration. A copy of the same may be found at Appendix **C**
- 8.3 Representations from other persons
- 8.3.1 There has been representation from other persons on the grounds of crime and disorder, public nuisance due to deliveries and public safety to residents in the cul-de-sac.
- 8.3.2 The Licensing Section is in receipt of a letter from a local resident. We have received other representations but they wished to remain anonymous and so could not be taken into account.
- 8.3.3 Copy of the representation will be available at the hearing for Members consideration.

9.0 Options Available to Members

- 9.1 The Licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - Reject the whole of the application.
- 9.2 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.
