<p><b>Roles and Responsibilities of Area Lead Members</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To provide local leadership and champion the agenda at the area committee.</li> <li>• To represent the area committee at relevant meetings, forums and local partnerships.</li> <li>• To build links with key services and partners.</li> <li>• To provide a link between the area committee and the Executive Member to ensure local needs are represented, issues are highlighted, best practice is shared and to facilitate local solutions to any issues.</li> <li>• To maintain an overview of local performance.</li> <li>• To consult with the area committee and represent local views as part of the development and review of policy.</li> </ul>
