### 2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

In August 2010 Executive Board agreed to a £2.9 million injection into the capital programme to fund the installation of mercury abatement equipment into exiting crematoria sites in order to comply with European mercury emissions legislation. The legislation states that 50% of all mercury emissions must be abated by December 2012.

It was also acknowledged in the August 2010 Executive Board report that the cremators would require replacing by 2016 as they were beyond economical repair.

During the past two years the cremators at Cottingley have failed the emission tests and subsequent re-tests have also failed. The Environmental Health Officer has agreed the council may continue with operations provided that we are actively working to replace the cremators in the near future.

This permit may be revoked if no action is taken to resolve the failures. Should this happen the EHO could than enforce closure of the affected cremators

It is therefore intended to replace the cremators at Cottingley Crematorium with equipment that is best value for the council and that can mercury abate in order to comply with EU legislation and able to abate by 50% without the need for a trading partner.
