The Parks and Countryside service in Leeds has led the way in developing innovative ways to develop the financial value of park assets whilst improving and sustaining community parks. This includes successful projects at Tropical World, Lotherton Wildlife World, the Arium, Middleton Park, Golden Acre and Temple Newsam along with broader initiatives that utilise park assets for additional income.

The Future Parks Accelerator (FPA) is a new national initiative to develop ambitious solutions to secure and enhance the future of public parks and greenspaces for long term public benefit with up to £1m funding. An expression of interest was submitted to the Future Parks Accelerator initiative on 19th November 2018. Confirmation has now been given by HLF that Leeds are one of ten applicants out of a total of ninety who will be invited to submit a full application. There is scope within this initiative to link this with a proposed bid of a maximum £250k to the Resilient Heritage grant fund for Temple Newsam Estate, which would add strength to both bids needing to be submitted mid-

January 2019. Successful bids would provide additional capacity to fund posts in the Parks and Countryside service along with research and benefit from other expertise, including the National Trust.
