

1. **Project Title:** How To Jump Over The Moon

Project Summary:

This will be the 11th instalment of Slung Low's twice-yearly family-friendly festival, which is called How To... because of the combination of participatory and entertaining events. Each day-long festival is themed around an idea; this time we have programmed two performances that relate to outer-space, giving children and their families the opportunity to imagine other worlds. This has led us to the event title How To..Jump Over The Moon.

We will deliver a day of family-friendly workshops and performances in and around The Holbeck on Saturday 19th October. All of the activities, performances and catering will be offered to participants on a Pay What You Decide basis, meaning that participants decide how much they anonymously contribute after taking part. This will ensure that the day will be accessible to people from all economic backgrounds.

Events will include:

- At 11am - Children's Music Workshop, led by the How To House Band. A fun and inclusive workshop aimed at 3-7-year-olds.
- At 12.15pm – A lunch of vegetarian and vegan sandwiches, snacks and drinks will be provided in the bar of The Holbeck with accompanying music from the How To House band.
- At 1.00pm – Goblin Theatre presents Hey Diddle Diddle! A hilarious adventure filled with music and puppetry, for ages 3+.
- At 3.00pm – Manic Chord Theatre presents The Unknown. The Unknown is a 2 chapter alien adventure story where you play the detectives. It's aimed for children aged 7-12 and perfect for all the family. The first part takes place in the car park of The Holbeck and the second part takes place on Holbeck Moor.
- At 4.30pm – How To Make Your Own Alien (participatory workshop for children aged 7+)
- At 6.00pm – Family Pop Concert - The How To House Band return for an upbeat gig to get families singing along and dancing together. They'll cover a set of familiar songs with a couple of their own thrown in to create a friendly and celebratory atmosphere.
