Article 6 also sets out the Council's agreed 'Vision for Scrutiny'.


Transparency & Accountability

Membership of all Scrutiny Boards broadly reflects the political balance of the Council and cannot include members of the Council's Executive.


There is provision for Scrutiny Boards to appoint additional Co-opted Members.

Completed Work Schedule for the 2022/23 Municipal Year

Each Scrutiny Board schedules eight formal meetings throughout the course of a municipal year. The Local Government Act 1972 requires formal meetings to be held in person to enable members of the public to be admitted as observers wherever the meeting is being held. To further promote access and engagement, formal meetings are also webcast.

In addition, the Scrutiny Board may choose to carry out additional work using alternative methods including site visits, working groups and remote consultative meetings (consultative sessions do not constitute formal meetings but do enable public access via a webcast).

The completed work schedule of the Scrutiny Board (Environment, Housing and Communities) for the 2022/23 municipal year has been provided as part of this summary. This presents an overview of all meetings held throughout the year and the work items considered at each meeting. Environment, Housing and Communities Scrutiny Board Statement from the Chair



"Over the last twelve months, the primary focus of our Scrutiny Board has been on the support provided to some of the most vulnerable residents in Leeds, many of whom are finding the current economic climate especially challenging.

We maintained the Board's long-standing commitment to scrutinise the local approach to reducing poverty and improving financial inclusion, and received an update on the Local Welfare Support Scheme. We also developed recommendations in relation to reducing gambling harm.

Similarly, housing activity has been a significant, long-term priority for members. This year, we have examined tenancy management, performance in relation to repairs and maintenance, how best to 'turn around' void properties, and the HRA investment programme.

The growing pressure on Leeds Housing Register is just one example of the huge challenges facing our organisation. However, alongside the many and varied challenges we have seen some excellent examples of innovation, creativity and passion — such as the excellent work being carried out to prevent homelessness in Leeds.

The Scrutiny Board has explored ways to develop resilient waste services in response to the climate emergency, reduce anti-social behaviour and improve air quality. We have also scrutinised the action the Council can take to support a resilient, thriving third sector.

The Scrutiny Board has fulfilled its responsibilities under the Budget and Policy Framework, providing feedback on the initial budget proposals and considering regular performance data.

I want to put on record my thanks to the officers, Executive Members and partners who have taken the time to share their expertise, experience and insight with Scrutiny Board members. I know the challenge from our Scrutiny Board is robust, in part because we aim to reflect the concerns of the public through our work. However, I also continue to believe that holding decision makers to account is an important way of improving public services and outcomes for citizens in Leeds.

Finally, I want to thank Scrutiny Board members for their time, thoughtful contributions and commitment over the last year. I am once again very proud of our work."
