My comments on the above.

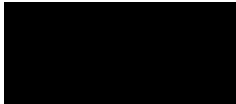
My wife and I regularly use facilities in Leeds Dock such as Nova Bakehouse, Fearn's and North Star and most days pass through. We've often spoken about the need for additional commercial facilities that would be useful and or attractive to people and hoped more would come to Leeds Dock. We may enjoy some features ourselves this application from Allied London might bring such as live music and street food.

Against that, consumption of alcohol also can lead to challenges. I'm acutely aware noise can disturb local residents who need rest but note the 10pm cut off time and don't think that is unreasonable.

Another likely issue is Litter. I'd expect the extra foot fall to put additional strain on all the bins near the venue but also notably two Canal River Trust litter bins along the tow path. These two overflow on a regular basis. Some people also see the river as a place to dispose of waste and I hope the debate will take the challenge of waste disposal/collection into consideration.

Having a year to see how this turns out, if approved, would seem ideal. We'd be happy to join the debate again at a suitable later date to give you our impressions in the light of experience.

I support the proposal and hope this response is helpful in arriving at a decision.
