Detail	I have concerns about the location of the polling station for GRI in my ward. This represents a considerable walk to The Green in an area where a significant number of residents do not have a car and where turnout tends to be lower. This would be the case particularly in any winter election when it is dark at night and residents may well feel uncomfortable travelling such a distance. An obvious solution to this could be to have the polling station at Queensway School which is a well-known local building and within much easier walking distance. There is the additional advantage that this venue is already being used as a polling station in Otley and Yeadon ward, however it is almost on the boundary between two wards. Given that this box tends to have a lower turnout (in both wards), I do not see this as creating disproportionate strain and in any event, the polling station at The Green also includes more than one box.

In relation to TNJ, the PS on Selby Road is not directly connected to Templenewsam Road, the main access route for the PD. Irwin Approach is a one-way system and a large number of residents must therefore drive down Halton Hill on Selby Road and turn back up the other side of the dual carriageway. Otherwise, they drive south on Templenewsam Road before turning east on Plantation Avenue or New Templegate, before heading northwards up Grove Road. This is in stark contrast to the previous TNJ PS in the accessible clubhouse of <b>Temple Newsam Golf Club</b> (Templenewsam Road LS15 0LN) with a large car park. The main function room is owned by Leeds City Council and the Golf Club have been happy to discuss other options too. TNGC would be a more feasible PS compared to the current situation at Halton Library.

Detail	Merging TNI and TNK into a single enlarged PD for Halton Moor ought to be explored due to their comparative size and inconsistent boundaries. The new PD would sit geographically between the Wyke Beck to the west, Selby Road to the north, its distinct border with TNJ to the east and Halton Moor Wood to the south. It would have a respective total and in-person electorate of 2,265 (5th highest in the ward) and 1,787 (2nd highest). By contrast, the paired TNE/TNF and TND/TNJ have far higher overall voter registrations with 3,111 and 2,882 electors each. Beside this, TNE/TNF has the most in-person voters with 2,073. TND/TNJ has the third largest amount but only 107 less than TNI/TNK combined. Following this review, should both comparators continue to share a PS across two PDs, it is unjustifiable for TNI and TNK to retain their individual polling places. Sutton Park Community Centre at Harefield West would likely be the obvious choice to continue as the PS with more accessible facilities and parking than Lakeland Court.



Detail	If the council chooses to maintain the two PDs, however, the boundary between TNI and TNK must be rerouted. Taking their separate sizes into consideration, TNK has just over half (58.8%, 662) of the number of in-person voters of TNI (1,125). Its overall voter register equates to 60.1% of TNI too. TNK has the 2nd smallest total and 3rd smallest in-person register, beaten only by both TNA and TNB with clear geographical boundaries of their own. The arbitrarily drawn border between them does not follow a clear pattern or any obvious geographical feature. A potential alternative is to split TNI and TNK along Neville Road (LS15 0NN) and Ullswater Crescent (LS15) or the full length of Coronation Parade (LS15 0BE, 0BN, 0BX, 0AY). The nine properties between 75-91 Cartmell Drive (LS15 0DB) should be in the same PD with the rest of their street or the neighbours' properties opposite them. The PD boundary divides down the middle of Cartmell Drive and along the garden boundary fences between the properties and Grayrigg Close, a cul-de-sac to their rear. After following the fence-line southward, the boundary re-emerges and, in this instance, the 12 properties from 27-49 Coronation Parade (LS15 0BX) should not be separated from the 34 other properties on the same western section of their road. The borderline later splits 96 and 98 Halton Moor Road too.
