Inner West Community Committee

Since 6th September 2023 the Inner West Community Committee Facebook page has gained: **40 new followers**, and now has a total of **1,927 followers**.

There are two things to note in general:

- 'reach' is the number of people the post was delivered to
- 'engagement' is the number of reactions, comments, or shares

Engagement tends to be a better way of gauging if people are interested and have read the posts because they wouldn't have interacted with it otherwise. For example, a post might reach 1,000 people but if they all scroll past and don't read it, the engagement is 0 and it hasn't been an effective way for the Community Committee to communicate.

Having said that, all posts can be read without any further interaction!

The most popular post since the 6th September 2023 is the post promoting the Bramley Forum. It has received 66 link clicks, been liked or shared 10 times and has reached a total of 3,200 people.

The following below are screenshots of the most popular three posts since the 6th September 2023. Alongside this are the figures for how many people were 'reached' and how many people 'engaged' with the post.

Armley Leisure Centre has again teamed up with Armley pro-boxer Josh Wisher to offer local youngsters a chance to learn some basic boxing from one of Yorkshire's top rising boxing prospects.

Wisher is running introductory non-contact boxing sessions free of charge up until Christmas at Armley Leisure Centre (ALC) on Thursdays for one hour beginning at 3.45pm.

The sessions are aimed at pupils aged 11 through 16 with further information given on the attached poster. He is a fully qualified boxing trainer with England Boxing and is manager of The Ministry of Boxing which he opened in Armley just over a year ago. He has his fifth professional bout on 17 November and is running a number of initiatives to combat anti-social behaviour through boxing for Leeds Youth Services as well as these sessions at ALC.

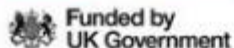
