Subject: Objection to alcohol licensing 856 kings road

[REDACTED] wish to submit a formal objection to the request for an alcohol licence for the above named property.

We see the approval of such a request to be damaging to the local area, encouraging the gathering of groups of individuals wishing to use the venue as an off licence rather than the proposed and agreed property change of use to a food takeaway. All planning proposals we have seen and have been approved for this property do not in any circumstance offer the option of clients eating in a restaurant setting, and therefore all alcohol sales are likely to be takeaway thus encouraging street drinking and antisocial behaviour.

We see no justifiable reason why a takeaway establishment would need to sell alcohol, and the conservation fringe area in which this sits does not suit such a use.

The sales of alcohol will further increase our previous represented concerns around litter, in particular now broken glass, in an area of green belt popular with wildlife, dog walkers, ramblers, cyclists on a recognised cycle route and family pets. What assurances can the business offer that the environment, members of the public and local residents have been considered in this application?

This proposal will also increase traffic and parking issues with clients now using the outlet for the sole purpose of alcohol purchasing. Indeed if this was the intended use, this was the original use of the establishment before CHANGE of use was granted, casting much doubt over the credibility of the whole planning process.
