premises	9 <sup>th</sup> January 2024, Trading Standards Officers carried out a test purchase operation at the for illegal tobacco. The officer was sold a packet of cigarettes for £3.50. These were illicit s by nature of not having UK Duty paid on them.			
On the 24 <sup>th</sup> January 2024, Trading Standards carried out an inspection of the premises in conjunction with West Yorkshire Police. Whilst waiting at the premises, Ismail Mostafa was present and told Police he did not sell cigarettes despite customers attending asking to buy them. Trading standards uncovered a concealment of 117 packets of cigarettes and 10 pouches of hand rolling tobacco inside a specially constructed door frame hiding the products. There were also 119 oversized vapes on site				
The sale of smuggled goods that have not had UK duty paid is a criminal offence which must be taken especially serious given that K & B stores currently holds a premises licence. The premises is not promoting the licensing objectives, being involved in serious criminality.

I am a Trading Standards Assistant employed by West Yorkshire Trading Standards Service, Nepshaw Lane South, Morley, Leeds, LS27 7JQ. I am an authorised officer for the purposes of the Trade Marks Act 1994, Tobacco and Related Products Regulations 2016, Standardised Packaging of Tobacco Regulations 2015 and The Consumer Rights Act 2015.

On 19th January 2024 I was wearing plain clothes when I attended the premises of KB Off Licence, 31C Harehills Road, Leeds, LS8 5HR, to carry out a test purchase for illegal tobacco. I approached the counter and asked to purchase a packet of Richmond cigarettes. In the shop were two females, one behind the counter and one in front of the

counter. The female behind the counter took £3.50 payment for the cigarettes and the female in front of the counter made her way to the storeroom at the back of the shop. She appeared approximately 20 seconds later with the cigarettes in her hand which she passed to me. I took them from her and left the store. The cigarettes were sealed in a signed evidence bag and later placed in secure storage. The genuine retail price for this item is around £12.00, with around £8.00 of this being excise duty.

On 24/01/2024 an	inspection visit was conduc	ted at KB Store	es Off Licence, 31c Harehills Road,		
Leeds, LS8 5HR by Trading Standards Officers and West Yorkshire Police. The owner,					
Designated Premises Supervisor and Premises Licence Holder was present and working behind					
the counter. Illegal disposable electronic cigarettes (vapes) were found behind the counter and					
illegal tobacco was found hidden in a concealment built in to the door frame of the bathroom. A					
total of 117 x 20 packets of cigarettes, 10 x 50g pouches of Hand Rolling Tobacco & 119 oversize					
disposable electronic cigarettes were seized.

Continuation Statement of: Babul Hussain

The disposable electronic cigarettes contained nicotine and the volume of liquid appeared to be greater than the legal limit of 2 millilitres, making them non-compliant with Regulation 36 of the Tobacco and Related Product Regulations 2016 in that the nicotine containing liquid in the disposable electronic cigarette was presented for retail sale in a volume exceeding 2 millilitres.

I visually examined the tobacco products that were seized from the store. I could see they were not in the standardised format as required by The Standardised Packaging of Tobacco Products Regulations 2015 and were in violation of the Tobacco and Related Products Regulations 2016 as the prescribed health warnings were not present in English. From discrepancies in the packaging on some cigarettes and from the foreign excise stamps present on others it was clear to me, the cigarettes were a mix of counterfeit and smuggled items

The sale of Counterfeit/Illicit Tobacco products is not a minor breach of regulations but is in fact serious organised criminality. These items which cannot be legally sold in the UK are smuggled into the country on a vast scale. The profits of this illegal trade going to criminals while the treasury is deprived of the Tax/Excise. The current yearly loss in revenue is in excess of £2.5 billion which in turn deprives public services of funding.

Smoking is the leading cause of preventable diseases in the UK and over half of long term smokers will die prematurely from smoking related diseases. Tobacco taxes are a proven strategy to reduce smoking and extend lives. The illegal, cheap sale of this product removes this incentive of helping people to quit and also makes cigarettes more affordable to children, making it more likely they will start.

The supply of illegal tobacco not only causes harm to people but also causes genuine businesses to lose income and potentially close. This damages local communities with reduced employment and the loss of essential services.

The owner and Licensee of this business is trading in illicit goods. West Yorkshire Trading Standards therefore fully supports a review of its alcohol licence.
