Wellbeing projects for consideration for approval from the Inner East Community Committee 2021/2022 Wellbeing allocation.

1. **Project Title:** Money Buddies

Name of Group or Organisation: Inner East Community Projects

Total Project Cost: £31,205

Amount approved (Wellbeing): £15,189

Wards covered: Killingbeck and Seacroft; Burmantofts and Richmond Hill

Project Description:

Funding will be used to deliver the money buddies service providing emergency debt advice and financial capability service. The goal of the support is to help those in need to stabilise their finances, maximises their income, improves their money skills and develops confidence with money. Funding will be used to provide regular money buddies sessions in locations Richmond Hill Academy and Ebor Gardens Advice Hub in the Burmantofts and Richmond Hill ward and in Deacon House in the Killingbeck and Seacroft ward.

2. **Project Title:** Friday Youth HUB

Name of Group or Organisation: Street Works Soccer

Total Project Cost: £6,720

Amount approved (Wellbeing): £5,720

Wards covered: Killingbeck and Seacroft

Project Description:

Funding to support weekly youth sessions at the Denis Healey Centre on a Friday evening. As well as football coaching the Friday Youth Hub will include arts and crafts activities, board games and cooking as well as delivering sessions to young people on topical issues such as anti-social behaviour, hate crime and community cohesion.

3. **Project Title:** Lincoln Green Park Play
Name of Group or Organisation: Active Leeds
Total Project Cost: £5,000
Amount approved (YAF): £2,500
Wards covered: Burmantofts and Richmond Hill

Project Description:

Funding will be used to fund a youth worker to deliver regular play park sessions in the Lincoln Green area. The sessions will take place each weekend on green space in-between Lincoln Green tower blocks. The hope is that with sessions being delivered on the doorstep of many families that this will remove many barriers to participation including travel. Local young people can turn up any week and join in the informal play session, which gives them an opportunity to do something together and meet other young people.

4. **Project Title:** Summer Youth Project
Name of Group or Organisation: New Horizons
Total Project Cost: £5,352
Amount approved (YAF): £1,691
Wards covered: Gipton and Harehills

Project Description:

Funding will be used to deliver a programme of youth activities throughout the summer holidays including:

- Providing sensitive and empathetic support and 1 to 1 counselling services

- Sessions around using meditation techniques, creative arts, and creative writing
- Outdoor pursuits like gardening, nature, and horticulture
- Sports activities including kick boxing, boxing, football, basketball, cricket, team building exercises,
- Outdoor cooking, litter picking, gardening such as planting flowers, herbs, fruits and vegetables to attract wild life. This will introduce essential life skills and assist to tackle mental health issues.

5. Project Title: Bridging the Gap

Name of Group or Organisation: Chapeltown Youth Development Centre

Total Project Cost: £4,740

Amount approved (CIL): £3,240

Project Description:

Funding will be used to purchase and install a 20ft storage container on Oxton Fields in Burmantofts. The container will provide a storage facility for the Leeds Swahili Group to keep football equipment which will help them to continue to develop the football sessions taking place on Oxton Fields by having a safe place on site to store equipment for sessions.
