Project Title: St Peters Court

Name of Group or Organisation: Alpha Homes

Total Project Cost: £925

Project Summary: This project is to install a gate to deter rough sleepers and drug users, vandalism and anti-social behaviour.

Project Title: Lodge Terrace Bin Yard

Name of Group or Organisation: Friends of Trentham Park

Total Project Cost: £3,989

Amount proposed from Wellbeing Budget 2022/23: £3,609

Wards Covered: Hunslet & Riverside

Project Summary: This bin yard was recently cleared by LCC after it had been a dumping ground for fly tipping over the last few years. It was attracting rats and also anti-social behaviour in its previous state. In order for the space not simply to be re-fly tipped we feel it is vital that action is taken to make the space look and feel used and loved.

We are hoping to get the floor of the yard levelled out as it is currently uneven and patchy. We would be looking, after that, to work with residents and members of FOTP to make it used. Once the floor of the bin yard is levelled, we also thought of it being made a more attractive space through spray painting the walls and completing a participatory (yet tasteful) graffiti display.

Project Title: Belle Isle Kicks

Project Summary: The grant will be used to provide a Kick Project in Belle Isle. The project will be for Young people aged 8-18 in the local area. Young people will be able to participate in constructive sporting and educational activities in a safe local environment. The kicks project aims to deliver high quality coaching as well as informal and social education. The sessions will run throughout the year.

The kicks projects regularly meet up with other projects throughout the city and further afield to hold tournaments.

The venue would be the Multi Use Sports area at Springwell school on Belle Isle road managed by South Leeds Youth Hub.
