Late Item

Capital and CIL Ring-fences

Members are asked to consider the proposed ringfence set out below for 2023/24.

- Members are asked to consider ringfencing £6,000 from their CIL budget towards the costs of replacing the canopy to the Watsonia (Beeston & Holbeck and Hunslet & Riverside - £3,000 per ward)
- 2. Members are asked to consider ringfencing £3,000 from their CIL budget for improvements works on Fulham Street which would include re-instating this grass verge and to install 23 metres of post and rail fencing to prevent cars parking on the verge. (Hunslet & Riverside)
- Members are asked to consider ringfencing £20,000 from their Capital and CIL budget for Climate, Energy, Environment and Green Space to develop a new park for young people on Low Grange View, Belle Isle and to repair & improve the park on Ring Road, LS10. (Middleton Park - £14,000 Capital and £6,000 CIL)

Project Title: Space Pizza Project II

Name of Group or Organisation: Salvation Army South Leeds Initiative

Total Project Cost: £2,798

Amount proposed from CIL Budget 2023/24: £1,338 (£669 per ward)

Project Summary: The grant will be used to purchase further equipment for our pizza project and to replace broken equipment. The project will initially focus on young people who are part of our Space Youth Programme with small groups of young people given the opportunity to develop skills in making dough and then pizzas before taking part in wider community events.

Project Title: Middleton Park Ward – Boulders to deter quad bikes & motorbikes

Total Project Cost: £1,300

Project Summary: In an effort to tackle nuisance quad and motor bikes the below locations have been identified to place large stone boulders to prevent access:

- 1. Westwood Court/ Helston Road path (gap at side of A-frame).
- 2. Waggon Road (between A-frame and properties) on the footpath between 94/96 Waggon Road, LS10.
- 3. Orion Walk, LS10, (gap on left side of A frame) on the footpath between 45/47 Orion Walk.
- 4. Acre Road Roundabout, using 3 rocks at Lingwell Road junction to stop entry onto the grassed roundabout
