The reason for confidentiality or exemption is stated on the agenda and on each of the reports in terms of Access to Information Procedure Rules 9.2 or 10.4(1) to (7). The number or numbers stated in the agenda and reports correspond to the reasons for exemption / confidentiality below:

9.0 Confidential information – requirement to exclude public access

9.1 The public must be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that confidential information would be disclosed. Likewise, public access to reports, background papers, and minutes will also be excluded.

9.2 Confidential information means

- (a) information given to the Council by a Government Department on terms which forbid its public disclosure or
- (b) information the disclosure of which to the public is prohibited by or under another Act or by Court Order. Generally personal information which identifies an individual, must not be disclosed under the data protection and human rights rules.

10.0 Exempt information – discretion to exclude public access

- 10. 1 The public may be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that exempt information would be disclosed provided:
 - (a) the meeting resolves so to exclude the public, and that resolution identifies the proceedings or part of the proceedings to which it applies, and
 - (b) that resolution states by reference to the descriptions in Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (paragraph 10.4 below) the description of the exempt information giving rise to the exclusion of the public.
 - (c) that resolution states, by reference to reasons given in a relevant report or otherwise, in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.
- 10.2 In these circumstances, public access to reports, background papers and minutes will also be excluded.
- 10.3 Where the meeting will determine any person's civil rights or obligations, or adversely affect their possessions, Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998 establishes a presumption that the meeting will be held in public unless a private hearing is necessary for one of the reasons specified in Article 6.
- 10. 4 Exempt information means information falling within the following categories (subject to any condition):
 - 1 Information relating to any individual
 - 2 Information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual.
 - Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information).
 - Information relating to any consultations or negotiations, or contemplated consultations or negotiations, in connection with any labour relations matter arising between the authority or a Minister of the Crown and employees of, or officer-holders under the authority.
 - Information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings.
 - 6 Information which reveals that the authority proposes
 - (a) to give under any enactment a notice under or by virtue of which requirements are imposed on a person; or
 - (b) to make an order or direction under any enactment
 - Information relating to any action taken or to be taken in connection with the prevention, investigation or prosecution of crime

Executive Summary

To advise the Licensing Sub Committee Members of an application for the certification of a film titled, The Annihilation of Fish, to be screened on the 6th September 2024, at Hyde Park Picture House, Brudenell Road, Headingley LS6 1JD.

1.0 Purpose of this Report

1.1 This report informs Members with the background, history and issues of an application made under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for the certification of films that do not currently have a BBFC (British Board of Film Classification) certification. Finally, this report informs Members of the options available to them when considering an application for the certification of films.

2.0 Background Information

- 2.1 The Licensing Act 2003 applies to premises which provide film exhibitions. At present there are a total of 8 cinemas licensed in the Leeds district.
- 2.2 The majority of films shown in cinemas will carry a certificate from the BBFC, the categories of which are as follows:

Category U Universal. Suitable for all.

A U film should be suitable for audiences aged four years and over, although it is impossible to predict what might upset any particular child. U films should be set within a positive framework and should offer reassuring counterbalances to any violence, threat or horror.

Category PG Pai

Parental Guidance. General viewing, but some scenes may be unsuitable for young children.

A PG film should not unsettle a child aged around eight or older. Unaccompanied children of any age may watch, but parents are advised to consider whether the content may upset younger or more sensitive children.

Category 12A/12 Suitable for 12 years and over.

Films classified 12A and video works classified 12 contain material that is not generally suitable for children aged under 12.

No one younger than 12 may see a 12A film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult. Adults planning to take a child under 12 to view a 12A film should consider whether the film is suitable for that child. To help them decide, the BBFC recommend that thy check the ratings info for that film in advance.

No one younger than 12 may rent or buy a 12 rated video work.

Category 15 Suitable only for 15 years and over.

No one younger than 15 may see a 15 film in a cinema.

No one younger than 15 may rent of buy a 15 rated video work.

Category 18 Suitable only for adults.

No one younger than 18 may see an 18 film in a cinema.

No one younger than 18 may rent of buy an 18 rated video work.

Category R18

To be shown only in specially licensed cinemas, or supplied only in licensed sex shops and to adults only.

The R18 category is a special and legally restricted classification primarily for explicit works of consenting sex or strong fetish material involving adults. Films may only be shown to adults in specially licensed cinemas, and video works may be supplied to adults only in licensed sex shops. R18 video works may not be supplied by mail order.

- 2.3 In addition to licensing premises for film exhibitions, the licensing authority has a duty under Section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003 to categorise a film which is absent of a certificate from a film classification body such as the BBFC. The licensing authority may also reject or modify a film which has received certification from the BBFC.
- 2.4 A copy of the current BBFC Classification Guidelines are available <u>here</u>.

3.0 Main Issues

- 3.1 An application has been received from Hyde Park Picture House to have a film certified as it is not currently certified by the BBFC. The screening is scheduled to take place at Hyde Park Picture House, Brudenell Road, Headingley LS6 1JD on 6th September 2024.
- 3.2 A report detailing the film requesting certification, including a synopsis and the applicant's recommended rating, can be found at **Appendix A**.
- 3.3 To assist members with their deliberation officers of the Licensing Authority will view the film and provide comments in accordance with BBFC, this can be found at **Appendix B**.
- 3.4 Details of each film including advance screeners have been provided to the Licensing Sub Committee Members in advance of the hearing.
- 3.5 A representative of Hyde Park Picture House will be available via phone.

4.0 Implications for Council Policy and Governance

4.1 There are no implications for Council policy and governance in respect of determining this application.

5.0 Legal and Resource Implications

5.1 There is no right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the decision of the Licensing Sub Committee.

6.0 Recommendations

Certification Controls at Hyde Park Picture House

As per our premises licence, the Hyde Park Picture House follows BBFC certification guidance, which is listed with each individual film on our <u>website</u>.

We have several checks in place to manage access to films based on this guidance. These checks are as follows:

- Our <u>terms & conditions page</u> includes clear guidance on certification in a way audiences can understand and which includes a link to the BBFC if further information is required.
- Certificates are added to every listing on our box office system in addition to our website and
 this limits the tickets available to films where appropriate. E.g. An audience member can't buy
 a child's ticket for a 15 or 18 certificate film.
- We have also established a Content Guidance system which allows us to give additional
 content information to audiences to help them make informed choices about what they
 watch. Full guidance on this can be found on our website.
- Adding the cert to the Box Office system also enables our Front of House staff to identify the
 age restrictions for films. All staff are fully trained to both understand and then manage
 certification and age restrictions for films, so we can both advise on entry and appropriateness
 of a film and refuse sales where required.
- All tickets bought in advance or on the day are checked by a staff member on the door to the
 cinema auditorium so if an underage person has bought a ticket over the phone or internet in
 advance they would have to engage with a staff member at ticket check point and entry
 would be refused and ticket refunded.

Summary of Main Issues

This is an application to vary a premises licence held by New Middleton, 4 Thorpe Street, Middleton, Leeds, LS10 4HD, to specify a new individual as the Designated Premises Supervisor.

The application is to specify Michaela Grainger as the Designated Premises Supervisor.

West Yorkshire Police have been served a copy of the application and served an objection notice to the grant of the application.

1 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 37 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a premises licence in order to specify Michaela Grainger as the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 1.2 The Licensing Sub Committee is required to consider this application due to the receipt of an objection from West Yorkshire Police.

2 History of the Premises

- 2.1 On the introduction of the Licensing Act 2003 the premises were known as the Middleton Social and Welfare Club and benefitted from a Club Premises Certificate. The certificate was surrendered and a Premises Licence applied for in November 2007.
- 2.2 In January and February of 2014 applications were successfully made to transfer the licence to Julie Jackson and to appoint Julie Jackson as the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS).
- 2.3 On 13 February 2020 Entertainment Licensing submitted an application to review the premises licence. The application followed several action plan meetings providing the licence holder at the time with multiple opportunities to operate in accordance with the hours authorised by the licence, and to comply with the four licensing objectives and the conditions attached to the licence. Incidents of increasing concern however continued at the premises undermining the four licensing objectives.
- 2.4 The Licensing Sub Committee considered the review application on 7 Oct 2020 (delayed due to the pandemic) and resolved to revoke the premises licence.
- 2.5 On 20 May 2022 an application for the grant of a new premises licence was applied for by the current holder, Tanya Clowes, and representations objecting to the application outright were received from West Yorkshire Police and Entertainment Licensing. Following receipt, discussions did take place between the Police and the Applicant's representative to mitigate some of the concerns that led to the Police representation.
- 2.6 The Licensing Sub Committee met on the 14 July 2022 to consider and determine the new premises licence application and acknowledged the seriousness of the issues which had led to the previous licence being revoked. Ms Clowes was aware of the history and it was imperative that appropriate and proportionate measures were in place, enforced and their effectiveness kept under review to ensure there was no return to previous issues at the premises.
- 2.7 The Committee accepted Ms Clowes assurances, including conditions offered that the husband (since bereaved) of the holder of the revoked licence would have no day-to-day involvement in the operation of the premises and he was not permitted on the premises during times when licensable activities were taking place. Furthermore, the Committee considered that it would be unfair to have allowed the past issues to taint Ms Clowes' application and unanimously resolved to grant the application, subject to the conditions agreed with West Yorkshire Police and refined by the Applicant's representative.

- 2.8 On 23 May 2024 West Yorkshire Police submitted an application for summary review on the grounds of serious crime and disorder. The licence was suspended with immediate effect following the meeting to consider interim steps.
- 2.9 The Licensing Sub Committee considered the substantive review on 18 June 2024 and resolved to:
 - Suspend the licence for a period of 2 months from Tuesday, 18th June 2024, during which time:
 - a. the licence holder, DPS and all staff currently employed at the premises will receive full training on all aspects of licensing responsibilities from a professional licensing training provider;
 - b. the premises licence holder shall arrange a meeting with representatives of West Yorkshire Police and the Licensing Authority to take place no less than 14 days before the premises re-opens following the period of suspension to discuss what further steps, if any, are necessary to ensure public safety is maintained.
 - To modify the conditions of the licence so that the condition in relation to SIA accredited door supervisors reads:

"The minimum number of door supervisors for the premises is 2. All such door supervisors shall be independent Security Industry Accredited security staff. The days and hours door supervisors shall operate on the premises are:

- a. Friday, Saturday and Sunday 20:00 until close.
- b. From 20:00 on any day where a temporary event notice is in force that permits the sale of alcohol beyond that permitted under the premises licence.

In addition to a. and b. above, the premises licence holder shall provide independent Security Industry Accredited security staff on the occasions and to the numbers as identified through a risk assessment."

3 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant's name is Ms Tanya Clowes.
- 3.2 The proposed Designated Premises Supervisor is Michaela Grainger.
- 3.3 A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A of this report.

4 Representations

- 4.1 Under the Act, representations can be received from West Yorkshire Police only and the grounds for objection must be relevant to the prevention of crime and disorder.
- 4.2 West Yorkshire Police are satisfied that the exceptional circumstances of the case are such that granting the application would undermine the crime prevention objective. A copy of the police objection can be found at Appendix B.

4.3 Further to their objection, West Yorkshire Police have provided the document at Appendix C indicating they hold multiple pieces of intelligence relating to the premises which they intend to share during closed session only.

5 Equality and Diversity Implications

At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub Committee will be in accordance with the relevant licensing objective(s) as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

6 Option Available to Members

- 5.1 Members of the Licensing Sub Committee must make a decision with a view to promote the relevant licensing objectives which, in the case of a change of Designated Premises Supervisor, is the prevention of crime and disorder. Members may decide to:
 - Grant the application as requested; or
 - Reject the application to specify the said person as the Designated Premises Supervisor.

I Sarah Blenkhorn as a Leeds District Licensing Officer for West Yorkshire Police serve notice of objection to this application.

If granted, West Yorkshire Police are satisfied that the exceptional circumstances of the case would undermine the crime prevention objective, for the following reasons:

In 2020 the licence for the above premises was revoked. The licence holder and DPS at that time was Julie Jackson. The reasons for the revocation included but are not restricted to, continuous and repeat breaches of the premises licence including serving beyond permitted hours, no drug safe, non – attendance at pub watch meetings, no gaming permits, unable to operate the cctv, cctv not working correctly, non-compliance with action plans. Additionally, the licensing objectives were not being upheld as the premises was linked to multiple counts of crime and disorder, public nuisance, noise nuisance, allowing drunk parents on the premises who were not supervising their children who in turn were responsible for much of the anti-social behaviour in the area and therefore not upholding the protection of children form harm objective. West Yorkshire Police, Entertainment Licensing and Environmental Protection had continued visits with the premises throughout Julie Jackson and her family's reign from when she was first granted the licence in 2014 up to the point in 2020 when the licence was eventually revoked. The Jackson family simply did not care about complying with the law and had no respect for the

authorities' input, their premises licence or indeed the licensing authority. They did not comply with Action Planning over these years and eventually the licensing sub-committee deemed the premises so badly run that the licence should be revoked.

Tanya Clowes applied for the premises licence around in 2022 and was subsequently granted the licence despite police objections. She now wishes to transfer her position as Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) back to the Jackson family with Michala Grainger now being the proposed DPS. Michala Grainger is the partner of Colin Jackson. Colin Jackson is the brother of the late David Jackson and the uncle of David Jackson junior who both ran the premises with Julie Jackson. Due to the serious nature of the issues when the Jackson's were in charge, in 2022 when Tanya was granted the licence, a condition was added to the licence which stated that David Jackson was not to be involved with the running of the business. It should be noted that David Jackson owns the premises.

The Jackson family have shown they cannot run a licensed premises properly and put the licensing objectives at the forefront of their operation. Taya Clowes now wishes to hand the position of DPS right back to the hands of the Jackson family.

Therefore, West Yorkshire Police would ask any presiding sub-committee at a hearing, to refuse this application outright with a view to promoting the crime and disorder licensing objectives.

Summary of Main Issues

This is an application to vary a premises licence, made by Antonio Carlos Duarte Soares, for Sabura, 246 Dewsbury Road, Hunslet, Leeds, LS11 6JQ.

The applicant has applied for the following:

- To amend the plans to include the outdoor eating area at the front of the premises;
- To add conditions to the premises licence; and
- Extend the licensable activities on the licence.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted representations from West Yorkshire Police, the Environmental Protection Team and other persons.

The representations by the two authorities have been withdrawn following agreements reached.

The representations by other persons remain a matter outstanding for the Sub Committee's consideration.

1 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2 History of Premises

- 2.1 The application for the grant of a premises licence was served to the licensing authority in July 2019 which attracted representations from West Yorkshire Police and a local ward councillor. Agreements were reached between all a parties and the licence was granted.
- An application to vary the licence was then submitted in February 2021. The application sought to extend the hours for licensable activities. The application attracted representations and scheduled for a hearing. The Sub Committee resolved to grant the licence to reducing the hours applied for and imposing additional conditions.
- 2.3 Applications to transfer the licence to the current holder and to specify the current designated premises supervisor were received by the Licensing Authority in July 2023. Both were granted as applied for.
- 2.4 A copy of the existing licence is attached at Appendix A.

3 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Antonio Carlos Duarte Soares.
- 3.2 Briefly the application is to:
 - Alter the plans to include the outdoor eating area at the front of the premises;
 - Add additional conditions to the licence:
 - Extend the existing hours for the sale by retail of alcohol and late night refreshment.
- 3.3 A copy of the redacted application form is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.3 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the additional steps identified document attached at Appendix C.

4 Location

4.1 A map which identifies the location of this premises is attached at Appendix D.

5 Representations

5.1 Under the Act representations can be received from anyone but must be relevant and, in the case of members of the public, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

Representations from Responsible Authorities

- 5.2 Representations have been received from West Yorkshire Police and the Environmental Protection Team in their capacity as responsible authorities.
- 5.3 Any representation may be negotiated prior to the hearing and in this instance agreements to adopt additional measures have been reached between with each authority
- A copy of the representation and agreement reached with West Yorkshire Police may be found at Appendix E.
- 5.5 A copy of the representation and agreement reached with the Environmental Protection Team can be found at Appendix F.

Other Representations

The application has attracted two representations from local ward councillors (described as 'other persons' in the legislation) which are opposed to this application on the grounds of public nuisance. Redacted copies of the representations are available at Appendix G.

6 Licensing Hours

- 6.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.8 to 6.15 for the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- 6.2 In brief the Policy states at 6.14 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so. The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not impact on the licensing objectives.
- 6.3 A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at appendix H.

7 Equality and Diversity Implications

7.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the licensing subcommittee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

8 Options Available to Members

- 8.1 The licensing subcommittee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the variation as requested.
 - Grant the variation whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.

- 1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:
 - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
 - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
 - c. damage
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
 - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

- a. games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage individuals to -
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c. provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorize anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- e. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date or birth and either -

- a. a holographic mark, or
- b. an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that -
 - a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii. still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - b. these measures are displayed in a menu; price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - c. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 8. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 of this condition -

- a. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- b. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$ where
 - i. P is the permitted price,
 - ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - i. the holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question;
- e. "value added tax" mean value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

General – All four licensing objectives

- The premises licence holder/designated premises supervisor will provide regular training to staff on all alcohol related issues.
- 10. The premises is a restaurant & café and primary sales are targeted towards serving high quality food. Alcohol sales are therefore ancillary to the restaurant.
- 11. Only alcohol purchased on the premises will be permitted on site at anytime.

The prevention of crime and disorder

- 12. A suitable closed circuit Television (CCTV) system will be in operation at the premises at all times when it is being used for the provision of licensable activities and/or when members of the public are permitted to be on the premises. The CCTV system will record images to cover all areas of the premises to which the public have access (save for toilets), including any external areas of the premises such as car parks and beer gardens. The CCTV system will be capable of retaining images for a minimum of 31 days, will be of good quality and will contain the correct time and date stamp information. The CCTV system and images will be kept in a secure environment to which members of the public will not be permitted access. At least one member of staff will be on duty at the premises who is capable of operating the system and downloading images recorded by it. These images will downloaded and provided, on request, to an officer of a responsible authority.
- The premises licence holder and/or designated premises supervisor will ensure that an Incident Report Register is maintained on the premises to record incidents such as anti-social behaviour, admissions refusals and ejections from the premises. The Incident Report Register will contain consecutively numbered pages, the date time and location of the incident, details of the nature of the incident, the names and registration numbers of any door staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and personal licence numbers (if any) of any other staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and numbers of any police officers attending, the police incident and/or crime number, names and addresses of any witnesses and confirmation of whether there is CCTV footage of the incident. The Incident Report Register will be retained for a period of twelve months and produced for inspection immediately on the request of an authorised officer.
- 14. The age verification policy adopted by the premises, in respect of the sale or supply of alcohol will be Challenge 25, which means that those seeking to purchase alcohol at the premises who appear to be under the age of 25 will be required to provide acceptable evidence (as approved by West Yorkshire Police) that they are 18 years of age (or older) before any alcohol is sold or supplied to them.

- 15. The premises shall be and remain predominantly food led.
- 16. The sale/supply of alcohol shall only be made to accompany the sale of food. This does not preclude the sale/supply of alcohol to a person waiting to be seated in the restaurant or at the conclusion of the meal.
- 17. A supervisor's register will be maintained at the licensed premises, showing names, addresses and up to date contact details for the DPS and all personal licence holders.
- 18. The supervisors register will state the name of the person who is overall charge of the premises at each time that licensed activities are carried out, and this information will be retained for a period of twelve months and produced for inspection on request to an authorised officer.

Public safety

- 19. Drinks, open bottles and glasses will not be taken from the premises at any time. Empty bottles and glasses will be collected regularly and promptly. Glass and other sharp objects will be stored and disposed of safely using suitable receptacles. Receptacles will be secured and not accessible to the customers.
- 20. The premises licence holder/designated premises supervisor will prominently display notices which inform customers that open bottles or glasses may not be taken off the premises.

The prevention of public nuisance

- 21. The premises licence holder/designated premises supervisor will ensure that litter arising from people using the premises is cleared away regularly and that promotional materials such as flyers do not create litter.
- 22. Deliveries to and from the premises will be made between 07:00 and 19:00 only.
- 23. Noise from plant or machinery shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant or machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
- 24. Staff will make hourly checks around the premises and remove any litter, including food wrappers, cans and bottles.
- 25. Licensable activities shall be conducted and the facilities for licensed activities shall be designed and operated so as to prevent the transmission of audible noise or perceptible vibration through the fabric of the building or structure to adjoining properties.
- 26. Noise from a licensable activities at the premises will not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises at Rowland Road and the first floor flat 254 Dewsbury Road, LS11 6JQ.
- 27. The activities of persons using the external areas shall be monitored after 11pm and they shall be reminded to have regard to the needs of local residents and to refrain from shouting and anti-social behaviour etc when necessary.
- 28. The designated premises supervisor and any door supervisors will monitor the activity of persons leaving the premises and remind them of their public responsibilities where necessary.

Protection of children from harm

- 29. Alcohol will not be displayed next to the public entrance/exit of the premises.
- 30. All alcohol sale refusals will be recorded in a register which will be retained on the premises for inspection by responsible authorties.







However, we are of the opinion that the licensing objectives could be met should the applicant be prepared to incorporate certain identified measures within their operating schedule as additional conditions. West Yorkshire Police have no objections to the last sale of alcohol, Friday to Sunday, being at 0200 hrs however closing hours of the premises should move to 0230 hrs to allow sufficient time for customers to vacate the premises in an orderly manner.

Please find enclosed a document which at **Part 1** contains the suggested measures which this authority considers are proportionate and appropriate to the nature of the application.

Should the applicant be in agreement with the suggested measures then they should signify this by completing and signing **Part 2** of the enclosed form and return the complete document to this office as soon as possible.

Details to be recorded shall include the date, time, name if known, physical description of the person, the reasons, and staff involved and whether CCTV of the incident is available. Any identification document coming into the possession of a member of staff including security staff shall be recorded in the register, including the name of the person/name on the identification document. The register shall be available for immediate inspection by any authorised officer of the responsible authorities and shall be securely retained by the licence holder for a for a period of 12 months from the date of the last entry. The licence holder shall provide secure storage for identification documents and a system for safe disposal, which may include returning to the originating organisation, e.g. DVLA/HM passport office.

A minimum of 2 Door supervisors shall be provided on, Fridays, Saturdays and Sunday's from 20:00 until closing time and also on special occasions including Christmas Eve / New Years Eve or pre-booked functions that have been assessed to require additional security following a risk assessment with regard to the type of function.

Security staff shall be provided with induction training so that they have a full understanding of their roles and

responsibilities and are fully conversant with the policies and procedures unique to the premises, including safeguarding and welfare arrangements, communication methods and emergency response procedures.

The CCTV shall be checked weekly to ensure it is working correctly and a log maintained of those checks. This log will be kept on the premises for a 12 month period and produced for inspection when requested to do so by an authorised officer.

All staff deployed in the serving of alcohol and for managing admission to age restricted premises shall be trained on the correct procedures for age verification, the prevention of proxy sales, the prevention of sales to those who appear intoxicated and for dealing with false and any surrendered identification documents. Staff training shall take place at regular intervals, endorsed by staff, maintained on the premises for 12 months and produced for inspection immediately when requested to do so by an authorised officer.

There will be seating for 40 people inside the premises and for 30 in the external area at all times the premises is open to the public.



Please see our objection below:
We object to all proposed changes of hours for the sale of alcohol, with the exception of Monday to Thursday, where we are comfortable with the amendment to 11:00–00:00. We are content for the later night refreshment to be amended from Monday to Thursday to 23:00 to 23:30 to support this, but we object to the other proposals.
This is a dense residential area with properties surrounding the venue on all sides, and the proposed change of hours would constitute a new public nuisance to these residents. Customers at a venue are likely to need taxis to get home, to congregate outside to wait for this, or to smoke. It is unreasonable to assume they will do this in silence while outside if they have had a long evening of drinking.
Dewsbury Road is still relatively active until 00:00 during the week, so the modest increase in time is not objectionable. But the increase at weekends moves noise deeper into a much quieter period.
