<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The grant will be used to subsidise a 5 day All Sports & Cooking camp. • The funding is to provide nan affordable service for children in the local area to learn how to cook healthy snacks and meals whilst having time to join in sporting activites in a team environment. • The camp will run from 10am – 3pm. • Children will spend tither the morning cooking and the afternoon will consist of taking part in a sporting activity in their allocated group. • Qualifeied member of ACES will devliver the cooking programme. • Level Two qulaified sports coaches will take all sporting sessions. • ACES have designed numerous, easy and affordable healthy meals to be created for 6-14 year olds. (The recipe booklet can be forwarded across if required). • Sporting sessions, that will include, team building, dodge ball, evasion games, football and tag rugby. • At the end of the week children will be provided with a certificate to merit the children’s achievement throughout the week. Special awards will be provided to children who have provided the most effort and been good team players. • We propose that this camp is completely free to 30 children between the ages of 6 – 14 and that hold a valid Breeze Card
