Good morning,
Thank you for your email.
In relation to condition 1, we do not have a set decibel level of what would be considered too noisy, we usually ask operators to walk around the perimeter of their premises listening out for noise and if this is clearly audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises then they would need to turn the volume down till the noise isn't clearly audible. Vibrational noise usually derives from low frequency noise which would be the bass vibrating through the building structure so in the instance that there are complaints related to vibration, the music would need to be turned down or speakers fitted with anti-vibration mounts.
Condition 2: the nearest noise sensitive premises can be located anywhere in the vicinity of the premises and this would be the local residential properties.
Condition 6,7: will be withdrawn.

Leeds City Council's Environmental Action Service Proposed Controlled Measures under the Licensing Act 2003 Name and Address of Premises: 4 Eastgate, Leeds, LS2 7JL,

Japanese fine dining restaurant, serving Japanese food and alcohol. The premises are split into two areas, a sitting area with a bar at the front of the restaurant and a dining room at the rear. There will be one sitting at lunchtime and two sittings in the evening. There will be a maximum of 40 people including staff and customers. There are also potential residential areas in the same building or in the vicinity of the building.

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, we consider that the following measures are relevant and reasonable in order to meet the following aim of the licence:

• Prevention of public nuisance

Noise and Vibration

- Licensable activities shall be conducted and the facilities for licensed activities shall be designed and operated so as to prevent the transmission of audible noise or perceptible vibration through the fabric of the building or structure to adjoining properties.
- 2. Noise from a licensable activity at the premises will not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.
- 3. There shall be no external loudspeakers
- 4. Bottles will not be placed in any external receptacle between 11 pm and 7 am the following day to minimise noise disturbance to neighbouring properties.
- 5. Noise from plant or machinery shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant or machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
- 6. The PLH/DPS will ensure patrons use beer gardens, external areas and play areas in a manner which does not cause disturbance to nearby residents and business in the vicinity. Patrons will not use such areas after 11 pm*.
- 7. The activities of persons using the external areas shall be monitored after 11 pm and they shall be reminded to have regard to the needs of local residents and to refrain from shouting and anti social behaviour etc when necessary.
- 8. The PLH/DPS will adopt a "cooling down" period where music volume is reduced towards the closing time of the premises.

Litter

The PLH/DPS shall ensure that litter arising from people using the premises is cleared away regularly and that promotional materials such as flyers do not create litter.

Transport / Pedestrian Movement

- 10. Clear and legible notices will be displayed at exits, car parks and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly having regard to the needs of local residents, in particular emphasising the need to refrain from shouting, slamming car doors, sounding horns and loud use of vehicle stereos and anti-social behaviour.
- 11. The designated premises supervisor and any door supervisors will monitor the activity of persons leaving the premises and remind them of their public responsibilities where necessary.
- 12. SIA registered door staff will be employed and used where queues are likely to form to manage the queues and ensure that queues are restricted to cordoned areas to prevent them obstructing footpaths and spilling out onto roads, and to keep noise and obstructions away from residential property.
- 13. A facility will be provided for customers to order hackney taxis/private hire vehicles. Telephone numbers for taxi firms/private hire companies will be displayed in a prominent position on the premises.
