I am writing to make an objection to the application for planning permission for this venue to open at the stated address. As a leaseholder and resident of an apartment in the building, I am concerned that having an entertainment venue inside the building will have a significant negative impact on the quality of life for residents, in particular:

- increased noise and disturbance from patrons, especially late at night on weekends.
 There are already entertainment venues in the vicinity and many tall buildings in close proximity, resulting in sound travelling upwards. Having crowds of people entering / leaving the building will likely exacerbate this more so by being so close.
- reduced safety and cleanliness from having crowds of people, possibly drinking, coming and going, and loitering outside.
