With reference to the above application.

I am not familiar with your procedures etc, therefore I would be obliged if you could enlighten me on the following points:

Why is there a discrepancy re: closing times between the public display and the details stored online?

Point 2 of the application states: "extended hours at bank Holidays and on other limited days".

What specifically does this mean?

Point 4 of the application states: "provision of late night refreshments".

What specifically does this mean?

The proposal outlined by Lidl was to incorporate a 'Family pub' (see attached). So why would a 'Family pub' need or indeed want to remain open until the early hours?

If you reject the application. Does the applicant have the 'right of appeal'?

If everything is accepted without exception. Is there a 'right of appeal'?

If the application is rejected. Is it your prerogative to suggest suitable amendments which would be acceptable to all parties?

If there are any problems locally, can the granted licence be revoked immediately?

How often does the approved licence get reviewed or changed?

In summary, what cannot be disputed is that there will be:

MORE traffic late at night.

MORE sound late at night.

MORE people in the vicinity late at night.

Therefore, I would hope that any decision taken would make this situation the over-riding factor and the closing times be more sensibly fixed.

I would also ask you to remember that this is a residential area and that any 'local' comments

should be noted and respected.

Come the conclusion: you and your colleagues decisions, be they right or wrong will affect in many ways the many people of Garforth and so I would ask you please to think long and hard about what will benefit the community and what will not.





OPERATING SCHEDULE

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. Alcoholic drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers saved for consumption in external areas provided for that purpose.
- No customers carrying opened bottles of alcoholic drink upon entry shall be admitted to premises at anytime the premises are open to the public.
- It is considered that for the nature of the operation door supervisors will not be required however, the Designated Premises Supervisor will undertake a risk assessment should unusual events takes place and if they consider it appropriate will employ the same.
- Any persons exercising security (as defined by paragraph 21a of schedule 2 of the Private Security Act 2001 shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority).
- 5. Such person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the premises licence.
- A CCTV system shall be installed so as to cover the mair point of entry and the bar servery such images to be maintained for 30 days and to be available upon reasonable request.

Public Safety.

The Premises Licensee will comply with the reasonable requirements of the Fire Officer from time to time.

Public Nuisance

- 1. Noise from a licensable activity at the premises will not cause nuisance to the nearest noise sensitive premises at Bar Lane and White Rose Avenue.
- There shall be no external loudspeakers
- Bottles will not be placed in any external receptacle between 11 pm and 7 am the following day to minimise noise disturbance to neighbouring properties.
- 4. Noise from plant or machinery shall not cause a nuisance to the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant or machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
- The PLH/DPS will ensure patrons use beer gardens, external areas and play areas in a manner which does not cause disturbance to nearby residents and business in the vicinity. Patrons will not undertake licensable activities in such areas after 11 pm.

- 6. The activities of persons using the external areas shall be monitored and they shall be reminded to have regard to the needs of local residents and to refrain from shouting and anti social behaviour etc when necessary.
- 7. The PLH/DPS will adopt a "cooling down" period where music volume is reduced towards the closing time of the premises.
- 8. Clear and legible notices will be displayed at exits, car parks and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly having regard to the needs of local residents, in particular emphasising the need to refrain from shouting, slamming car doors, sounding horns and loud use of vehicle stereos and antisocial behaviour.
- The doors and windows to the premises are to be double glazed.

Protection of Children from Harm

- No films or videos of any description will be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable BBFC/Local Authority certification.
- 2. Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter or remain at the premises after 20:00 unless resident, dining with an adult or attending a pre booked function.
- 3. The Premises shall operate Challenge 21.
