Name of Premises: High Farm

Address: The High Farm, Farrar Lane, Adel, Leeds, LS16 7AQ

The premises is situated in a part commercial, part residential area near to Holt Park Shopping Centre. This department has received complaints regarding loud music from June 2009 and the last being May 2010. The complaints related to music noise and use of the outside speakers.

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, the Leeds City Council's environmental action service considers that the following measures are proportionate and necessary in order to promote the following licensing objective:

Prevention of public nuisance

Noise and Vibration

- 1. Noise from a licensable activity at the premises will not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises which are Farrar Lane, Holt Way and Holt Drive.
- 2. The external loudspeakers shall be switched off at 21:00 hours every day. The volume level shall not exceed those set by the Environmental Protection Team.
- 3. Bottles will not be placed in any external receptacle between 11 pm and 7 am the following day to minimise noise disturbance to neighbouring properties.
- 4. Noise from plant or machinery shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant or machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
- The PLH/DPS will ensure patrons use beer gardens, external areas and play areas in a manner which does not cause disturbance to nearby residents and business in the vicinity. Patrons will not use such areas after 11 pm except for access and egress for smoking.
- 6. The activities of persons using the external areas shall be monitored after 11 pm, for the purpose of smoking, shall be reminded to have regard to the needs of local residents and to refrain from shouting and anti social behaviour etc when necessary.
- 7. The PLH/DPS will adopt a "cooling down" period where music volume is reduced towards the closing time of the premises.

Transport / Pedestrian Movement

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- 8. Clear and legible notices will be displayed at exits, car parks and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly having regard to the needs of local residents, in particular emphasising the need to refrain from shouting, slamming car doors, sounding horns and loud use of vehicle stereos and anti-social behaviour.
- 9. A facility will be provided for customers to order hackney taxis/private hire vehicles. Telephone numbers for taxi firms/private hire companies will be displayed in a prominent position on the premises.

I am a 51 year old Mother and Grandmother who has lived in this area for many years and has used the pub regularly over this time.

It is a valuable asset to the community, and although has in the past been troubled with rowdy behavior and drug users the present licensees have spent the past three years getting rid of such persons and cleaned the pub up immensely.

They have done much to support the local community, even having a collection at Christmas and making up Hampers for the Elderly Customers who live alone – there are not many places left who still do such things.

In order for them to compete and continue to attract new customers and keep the business going it is a good thing to have these later hours.

There are gangs of kids roaming the estate causing trouble but perhaps if they felt they could use the High Farm and it had something to offer them and a place to go they would go there and be drinking responsibly rather than being able to buy cheap drink at off licenses.

Without the High Farm, which welcomes people of all ages, children and pets, I would have no place to go where I felt safe to meet with my friends and socialise.

I do not believe that the later hours would cause more disturbance to local people as those of us who use the pub have more respect for the area and it would mean that people would drift off over the last hour or so in smaller groups rather than leaving all at once.

I think that you should give them a chance to prove that they are responsible and help them in their efforts to keep this pub alive.

Dear Mr Nelson

I am writing in relation to the High Farm pub's application for an extension of opening hours, which I understand will be heard before the Licensing Sub Committee on 26 September.

Then pub has applied to extend their opening hours to 11.30pm on Sundays and until 2.00am on Fridays and Saturdays. As you may be aware the High Farm is next to my constituency office and I have had regular contact with the owners. I supported the pub in their Cask Marque award.

The High Farm is a historic local building with a fantastic function room that is currently underused. The extension of their opening hours will allow the pub to increase its business and remain viable, ensuring that this community hub remains open.

The High Farm is an excellent local pub with an older clientele. The pub is looking to enhance the work they already do and the extension of their opening hours would allow them to use their function room more effectively. Many events that could potentially be hosted in the function room would require the extension of the pub's opening hours. The pub have organised numerous charity events, notably for Help the Heroes and the local Ghurkhas, and the extension of the pub's opening hours would allow them to host similar events in the function room, as well as allowing the room to be used by a larger number of local organisations on a more frequent basis.

The High Farm are aware of some noise nuisance in the area but feel that the pub is a great local amenity, which allows the local residents to drink in a safe and social environment. The pub would continue to strictly monitor the level of noise nuisance in the vicinity, but I understand that a large proportion of noise nuisance and anti-social behaviour incidents attributed to the High Farm are often caused by customers from either venues in Leeds City Centre or other local establishments and many problems are also caused by drinks bought elsewhere. I am sure that Leeds City Council will be aware that there have been problems with younger people in the area, but I feel it is clear that they do not drink at the High Farm. Indeed I understand that the High Farm have themselves made complaints about noise from the nearby car park, which is owned by the city council.

Throughout the last two years Tim and Tina have worked hard to involve the local community, in a controlled and positive way, and these efforts have helped to significantly improve the area. They have established a fantastic community pub, and have ensured that

problems previously related to the pub have been resolved. A number of the residents of the sheltered housing complex at Farrar Lane have noted the recent improvements in the area.

The outside of the High Farm is kept clean and broken glass - which can happen occasionally be it from the pub's own customers or outsiders - is swept up regularly. There are pathways adjacent to the pub, which are not their property, but are often littered and this is mainly as a result of products bought elsewhere not at the High Farm. In addition the police have made no objections to the High Farm's application.

I understand that a large number of local residents, who live in the close vicinity of the pub and who would be most adversely affected by potential disturbances, have signed a petition in support of the pub and their application.


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
