#### **CONFIDENTIAL AND EXEMPT ITEMS**

The reason for confidentiality or exemption is stated on the agenda and on each of the reports in terms of Access to Information Procedure Rules 9.2 or 10.4(1) to (7). The number or numbers stated in the agenda and reports correspond to the reasons for exemption / confidentiality below:

### 9.0 Confidential information – requirement to exclude public access

9.1 The public must be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that confidential information would be disclosed. Likewise, public access to reports, background papers, and minutes will also be excluded.

#### 9.2 Confidential information means

- (a) information given to the Council by a Government Department on terms which forbid its public disclosure or
- (b) information the disclosure of which to the public is prohibited by or under another Act or by Court Order. Generally personal information which identifies an individual, must not be disclosed under the data protection and human rights rules.

#### 10.0 Exempt information – discretion to exclude public access

- 10. 1 The public may be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that exempt information would be disclosed provided:
  - (a) the meeting resolves so to exclude the public, and that resolution identifies the proceedings or part of the proceedings to which it applies, and
  - (b) that resolution states by reference to the descriptions in Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (paragraph 10.4 below) the description of the exempt information giving rise to the exclusion of the public.
  - (c) that resolution states, by reference to reasons given in a relevant report or otherwise, in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.
- 10.2 In these circumstances, public access to reports, background papers and minutes will also be excluded.
- 10.3 Where the meeting will determine any person's civil rights or obligations, or adversely affect their possessions, Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998 establishes a presumption that the meeting will be held in public unless a private hearing is necessary for one of the reasons specified in Article 6.
- 10. 4 Exempt information means information falling within the following categories (subject to any condition):
  - 1 Information relating to any individual
  - 2 Information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual.
  - Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information).
  - Information relating to any consultations or negotiations, or contemplated consultations or negotiations, in connection with any labour relations matter arising between the authority or a Minister of the Crown and employees of, or officer-holders under the authority.
  - Information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings.
  - 6 Information which reveals that the authority proposes
    - (a) to give under any enactment a notice under or by virtue of which requirements are imposed on a person; or
    - (b) to make an order or direction under any enactment
  - Information relating to any action taken or to be taken in connection with the prevention, investigation or prosecution of crime

### **Summary of Main Issues**

This is an application to vary a premises licence, made by Ismael Tomas, for Diva's, 246 Dewsbury Road, Hunslet, Leeds, LS11 6JQ.

The premises operate as a café/restaurant and propose to vary the hours of currently authorised licensable activities.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted a representation from Leeds City Council's Environmental Protection Team, suggesting a number of additional measures which include conditions to prevent noise nuisance and to reduce the terminal hour for licensable activities applied for.

The representation by the Environmental Protection Team remains outstanding for Member's consideration.

## 1 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

## 2 History of Premises

2.1 The premises has the benefit of a premises licence granted on the 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2019. The licensable activities/hours authorised are:

Sale of Alcohol

Sunday to Thursday 11:00 to 23:00 Friday & Saturday 11:00 to 00:00

Late Night Refreshment

Friday & Saturday 23:00 to 00:00

2.2 A copy of the existing licence is attached at **Appendix A**.

### 3 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Ismael Tomas.
- 3.2 The application is made to vary the terminal hour of licensable activities as follows:

Sale of Alcohol

Monday to Thursday 11:00 to 22:40 Friday to Sunday 11:00 to 01:30

Late Night Refreshment

Friday to Sunday 23:00 to 01:30

3.3 The proposed opening hours of the premises are as follows:

Monday to Thursday 07:00 to 23:00 Friday to Sunday 08:00 to 02:30

3.4 A copy of the redacted application form is attached at **Appendix B.** 

#### 4 Location

4.1 A map which identifies the location of these premises is attached at **Appendix C** 

### 5 Representations

5.1 Under the Act representations can be received from anyone but must be relevant and, in the case of members of the public, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

### Representations from responsible authorities

- A representation has been received from Leeds City Council Environmental Protection Team in their capacity as a responsible authority. The representation suggests a number of additional measures, including a reduction to the hours for the licensable activities applied for.
- 5.3 The representation submitted by the Environmental Protection Team remains as a matter outstanding for Member's consideration and a copy of the representation can be found at **Appendix D**.

#### Other representations

5.4 There are no other representations.

#### 6 Licensing hours

- 6.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.6 to 6.13 for the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- In brief the Policy states at 6.12 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so. The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not impact on the licensing objectives.
- 6.3 A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at **Appendix E**.

#### 7 Equality and Diversity Implications

7.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the licensing subcommittee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

### 8 Options Available to Members

- 8.1 The licensing subcommittee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - Grant the variation as requested.
  - Grant the variation whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
  - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
  - Reject the whole or part of the application.

8.2 Members of the licensing subcommittee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives and relevant to the application.

#### Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

- 1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:
  - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
  - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
  - c. damage
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date or birth and either -

- a. a holographic mark, or
- b. an ultraviolet feature.
- 5. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 of this condition -

- a. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- b. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$  where
  - i. P is the permitted price,
  - ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
  - i. the holder of the premises licence,
  - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises

in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question;

e. "value added tax" mean value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

#### General - All four licensing objectives

- 6. Regular Training to Staff on all Alcohol Related issues
- 7. Being alert and reporting any antisocial behaviour not only within the premises but within the vicinity to the local PCSO's.
- 8. The premises is a restaurant & café and primary sales are targeted towards serving high quality food, Alcohol sales are therefore an ancillary bi-product to the restaurant.
- 9. A supervisor's register will be maintained at the licensed premises, showing names, addresses and up to date contact details for the DPS and all personal licence holders.
- 10. The supervisors register will state the name of the person who is overall charge of the premises at each time that licensed activities are carried out, and this information will be retained for a period of twelve months and produced for inspection on request to an authorised officer.
- 11. All staff shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption off the premises.
- 12. Only alcohol purchased on the premises will be permitted on site at anytime.

#### The prevention of crime and disorder

13. A suitable closed circuit Television (CCTV) system will be in operation at the premises at all times when it is being used for the provision of licensable activities and/or when members of the public are permitted to be on the premises. The CCTV system will record images to cover all areas of the premises to which the public have access (save for toilets), including any external areas of the premises such as car parks and beer gardens. The CCTV system will be capable of retaining images for a minimum of 31 days, will be of good quality and will contain the correct time and date stamp information. The CCTV system and images will be kept in a secure environment to which members of the public will not be permitted access. At least one member of staff will be on duty at the premises who is capable of operating the system and downloading images recorded by it. These images will downloaded and provided, on request, to an officer of a responsible authority.

- 14. The premises licence holder and/or designated premises supervisor will ensure that an Incident Report Register is maintained on the premises to record incidents such as anti-social behaviour, admissions refusals and ejections from the premises. The Incident Report Register will contain consecutively numbered pages, the date time and location of the incident, details of the nature of the incident, the names and registration numbers of any door staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and personal licence numbers (if any) of any other staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and numbers of any police officers attending, the police incident and/or crime number, names and addresses of any witnesses and confirmation of whether there is CCTV footage of the incident. The Incident Report Register will be retained for a period of twelve months and produced for inspection immediately on the request of an authorised officer.
- 15. The age verification policy adopted by the premises, in respect of the sale or supply of alcohol will be Challenge 25, which means that those seeking to purchase alcohol at the premises who appear to be under the age of 25 will be required to provide acceptable evidence (as approved by West Yorkshire Police) that they are 18 years of age (or older) before any alcohol is sold or supplied to them.
- 16. The premises shall be and remain predominantly food led.
- 17. The sale/supply of alcohol shall only be made to accompany the sale of food. This does not preclude the sale/supply of alcohol to a person waiting to be seated in the restaurant or at the conclusion of the meal.
- 18. A suitable Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) system will be operational at the premises at all times when licensable activities are being carried out and at any other times where members of the public on the premises.
- 19. The CCTV system will contain the correct time and date stamp information.
- 20. The CCTV system will have sufficient storage retention capacity for a minimum of 31 days continuous footage which will be of good quality.
- 21. The CCTV system will cover the main entrance/s and exit/s and designated emergency egress routes from the premises.
- 22. The CCTV footage will be controlled and kept in a secure environment to prevent tampering or unauthorised non-designated member / members of staff at the premises will be authorised to access the CCTV footage and be conversant with operating the CCTV system. At the request of an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority (under the Licensing Act 2003) any CCTV footage, as requested, will be downloaded immediately or secured to prevent any overwriting. The CCTV footage material will be supplied, on request, to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority viewing. A record will be kept of who has accessed the system, the reason why and when.

#### **Public Safety**

- 23. In relation to age restricted sales the company will implement and maintain a refusals log system which will be regularly monitored in compliance with existing company policy.
- 24. Work with Police and local PCSO's in order to resolve any public issues.
- 25. The PLH/DPS will ensure that an Incident Report Register is maintained on the premises to record incidents such as anti-social behaviour, admissions refusals and ejections from the premises.
- 26. Litter collection in daylight hours.

- 27. Drinks, open bottles and glasses will not be taken from the premises at any time. Empty bottles and glasses will be collected regularly and promptly. Glass and other sharp objects will be stored and disposed of safely using suitable receptacles. Receptacles will be secured and not accessible to the customers.
- 28. The PLH/DPS will prominently display notices which inform customers that open bottles or glasses may not be taken off the premises.

#### The prevention of public nuisance

- 29. The PLH/DPS will ensure that litter arising from people using the premises is cleared away regularly and that promotional materials such as flyers do not create litter.
- 30. Ensure deliveries are made between 07:00 and 19:00.
- 31. Refusal to serve drunk and disorderly and underage.
- 32. Noise from plant or machinery shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant or machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
- 33. Staff will make hourly checks around the premises and remove any litter, including food wrappers, cans and bottles
- 34. Provision of waste collection services

#### Protection of children from harm

- 35. All alcohol sale refusals will be recorded in a register which will be retained on the premises for inspection by responsible authorities on request.
- 36. The Premises Licence Holder / Designated Premises Supervisor will ensure that an Incident Report Register is maintained on the premises to record incidents such as anti-social behaviour, and refusal of alcohol sales to minors.
- 37. Alcohol will not be displayed next to the public entrance/exit of the premises.





The application premises is a restaurant/café located on a parade of commercial businesses several having flats above. There are many noise sensitive properties in close proximity with closest being the adjoining first floor flat 254 Dewsbury Road LS11 6JQ

The hours applied for on Friday to Sunday night's i.e. Opening hours until 02:30 hours are not typical for a restaurant/cafe business and have the potential for noise disturbance to nearby residents. Noise is likely to be from customers arriving and leaving until the early hours of the morning and from customers smoking outside.

There is also a history of recent noise complaints concerning loud music and parties. This was witnessed by police officers at 01:10 hours on 29<sup>th</sup> August 2020 which was in breach of not only the Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) ( All Tiers) England Regulations 2020 but also your existing premises licence.

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, we consider that the following measures are relevant and reasonable in order to meet the following aim of the licence:

Prevention of public nuisance

#### Noise and Vibration

- 1. Closing hours for the restaurant/café shall be 23:00 hours Monday to Thursday, 00:00 hours Friday to Sunday.
- Licensable activities shall be conducted and the facilities for licensed activities shall be designed and operated so as to prevent the transmission of audible noise or perceptible vibration through the fabric of the building or structure to adjoining properties.
- Noise from a licensable activity at the premises will not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises at Rowland Terrace and First floor flat, 254 Dewsbury Road, LS11 6JQ.
