#### **CONFIDENTIAL AND EXEMPT ITEMS**

The reason for confidentiality or exemption is stated on the agenda and on each of the reports in terms of Access to Information Procedure Rules 9.2 or 10.4(1) to (7). The number or numbers stated in the agenda and reports correspond to the reasons for exemption / confidentiality below:

#### 9.0 Confidential information – requirement to exclude public access

9.1 The public must be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that confidential information would be disclosed. Likewise, public access to reports, background papers, and minutes will also be excluded.

#### 9.2 Confidential information means

- (a) information given to the Council by a Government Department on terms which forbid its public disclosure or
- (b) information the disclosure of which to the public is prohibited by or under another Act or by Court Order. Generally personal information which identifies an individual, must not be disclosed under the data protection and human rights rules.

#### **10.0** Exempt information – discretion to exclude public access

- 10. 1 The public may be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that exempt information would be disclosed provided:
  - (a) the meeting resolves so to exclude the public, and that resolution identifies the proceedings or part of the proceedings to which it applies, and
  - (b) that resolution states by reference to the descriptions in Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (paragraph 10.4 below) the description of the exempt information giving rise to the exclusion of the public.
  - (c) that resolution states, by reference to reasons given in a relevant report or otherwise, in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.
- 10.2 In these circumstances, public access to reports, background papers and minutes will also be excluded.
- 10.3 Where the meeting will determine any person's civil rights or obligations, or adversely affect their possessions, Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998 establishes a presumption that the meeting will be held in public unless a private hearing is necessary for one of the reasons specified in Article 6.
- 10.4 Exempt information means information falling within the following categories (subject to any condition):
  - 1 Information relating to any individual
  - 2 Information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual.
  - 3 Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information).
  - 4 Information relating to any consultations or negotiations, or contemplated consultations or negotiations, in connection with any labour relations matter arising between the authority or a Minister of the Crown and employees of, or officer-holders under the authority.
  - 5 Information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings.
  - 6 Information which reveals that the authority proposes
    - (a) to give under any enactment a notice under or by virtue of which requirements are imposed on a person; or
    - (b) to make an order or direction under any enactment
  - 7 Information relating to any action taken or to be taken in connection with the prevention, investigation or prosecution of crime

#### **Executive Summary**

To advise Members of an application for the certification of ten short films to be shown at Leeds City Museum, Leeds Art Gallery and Leeds Big Screen, Millennium Sq. The films will be shown as part of Leeds INDIs Film Festival between the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> February 2023.

#### 1.0 **Purpose of this Report**

This report informs Members with the background, history and issues of an 1.1 application made under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for the certification of films that do not currently have a BBFC (British Board of Film Classification) certification. Finally, this report informs Members of the options available to them when considering an application for the certification of films.

#### 2.0 **Background Information**

- 2.1 The Licensing Act 2003 applies to premises which provide film exhibitions. At present there are a total of 8 cinemas licensed in the Leeds district.
- 2.2 The majority of films shown in cinemas will carry a certificate from the BBFC, the categories of which are as follows:

#### Category U Universal. Suitable for all.

A U film should be suitable for audiences aged four years and over, although it is impossible to predict what might upset any particular child. U films should be set within a positive framework and should offer reassuring counterbalances to any violence, threat or horror.

# Category PG Parental Guidance. General viewing, but some scenes may be unsuitable for young children.

A PG film should not unsettle a child aged around eight or older. Unaccompanied children of any age may watch, but parents are advised to consider whether the content may upset younger or more sensitive children.

#### Category 12A/12 Suitable for 12 years and over.

Films classified 12A and video works classified 12 contain material that is not generally suitable for children aged under 12.

No one younger than 12 may see a 12A film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult. Adults planning to take a child under 12 to view a 12A film should consider whether the film is suitable for that child. To help them decide, the BBFC recommend that thy check the ratings info for that film in advance.

No one younger than 12 may rent or buy a 12 rated video work.

#### Category 15 Suitable only for 15 years and over.

No one younger than 15 may see a 15 film in a cinema.

No one younger than 15 may rent of buy a 15 rated video work.

#### Category 18 Suitable only for adults.

No one younger than 18 may see an 18 film in a cinema.

No one younger than 18 may rent of buy an 18 rated video work.

#### Category R18 To be shown only in specially licensed cinemas, or supplied only in licensed sex shops and to adults only.

The R18 category is a special and legally restricted classification primarily for explicit works of consenting sex or strong fetish material involving adults. Films may only be shown to adults in specially licensed cinemas, and video works may be supplied to adults only in licensed sex shops. R18 video works may not be supplied by mail order.

- 2.3 In addition to licensing premises for film exhibitions, the licensing authority has a duty under Section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003 to categorise a film which is absent of a certificate from a film classification body such as the BBFC. The licensing authority may also reject or modify a film which has received certification from the BBFC.
- 2.4 A copy of the current BBFC Classification Guidelines are available <u>here</u>.

#### 3.0 Main Issues

- 3.1 An application has been received from Leeds Film to have a total of 10 short films certified as they are not currently certified by the BBFC. The screenings are planned to take place at Leeds City Museum, Leeds Art Gallery and Leeds Big Screen, Millennium Sq., between 22<sup>nd</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> February 2023.
- 3.2 The details of each film requesting certification are as follows:

3.2.1	Title: Synopsis:	Getting to the Moon A whimsical animation that follows a young astronaut in 1969 as he tries to get to the moon by various means before meeting another astronaut with the same goal.

- 3.3 To assist members with their deliberation officers of the Licensing Authority have viewed each film and can confirm that they have no concerns with applicant's recommended ratings when considered in accordance with BBFC guidelines.
- 3.4 Details of each film including advance screeners have been provided to the Licensing Sub Committee Members in advance of the hearing.
- 3.5 A representative of Leeds Film is expected to attend the hearing to provide additional details.

#### 4.0 Implications for Council Policy and Governance

4.1 There are no implications for Council policy and governance in respect of determining this application.

#### 5.0 Legal and Resource Implications

5.1 There is no right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the decision of the Licensing Sub Committee.

#### 6.0 Recommendations

- 6.1 Members are requested to consider this request for the certification of the films as attached hereto.
- 6.2 Members may take the decision to view any of the films prior to the issue of a Certificate.

#### 7.0 Options Available to Members

#### Summary of main issues

This is an application to vary a premises licence made by Mr Feridon Ghaleh-Tak, for Lord Pizza, 215A Bradford Road, Tingley, Leeds, WF3 2DN.

The applicant has applied for the following:

- To extend late night refreshment until 03:30.
- To add on sales to the licence.
- To extend the sale of alcohol hours to 24 hours, 7 days a week, with on sales only taking place until 03:30.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted representations from other persons, West Yorkshire Police, and Environmental Health. The representation from West Yorkshire Police has been withdrawn as agreements have been reached between them and the applicant. All other representations remain a matter outstanding for member's consideration.

#### 1 Purpose of this report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

#### 2 History of premises

- 2.1 The licensing authority received a new application for a premises licence in August 2005. The application was granted as applied for subject to additional conditions imposed.
- 2.2 A copy of the existing licence is attached at Appendix A.

#### 3 The application

- 3.1 The applicant is Mr Feridon Ghaleh-Tak.
- 3.2 Briefly, the application is to:
  - To extend late night refreshment until 03:30 hours.
  - To add on sales to the licence.
  - To extend the sale of alcohol hours to 24 hours, with on sales only taking place until 03:30.
- 3.3 A copy of the application to vary the premises licence can be found at Appendix B.
- 3.4 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the additional steps identified at section M of the application form.

#### 4 Location

4.1 A map which identifies the location of the premises is attached at Appendix C.

#### 5 Representations

5.1 Under the Act representations can be received from anyone but must be relevant and, in the case of members of the public, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

#### Representations from Responsible Authorities

5.2 Representations have been received from West Yorkshire Police in their capacity as a responsible authority. Any representation may be negotiated prior to the hearing and in this instance the operating schedule has been amended to include the measures agreed with the police. A copy of the agreement may be found at Appendix D.

5.3 A representation has also been received from Environmental Health in their capacity as a responsible authority which suggests a number of measures, including restrictions on the times of operation. No agreement has been reached in this instance and a copy of the representation can be found at Appendix E.

#### Other representations

- 5.4 The application has attracted representations from members of the public (described as 'other persons' in the legislation).
- 5.5 Entertainment Licensing is in receipt of three individual letters of objection, all of which are opposed to this application on the grounds of public nuisance.
- 5.6 In order to protect personal data, redacted copies of the representations are attached at Appendix F, and original copies will be provided to the Licensing Sub Committee Members in advance of the hearing.

#### 6 Licensing hours

- 6.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.8 to 6.15 for the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- 6.2 In brief the Policy states at 6.14 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so. The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not impact on the licensing objectives.
- 6.3 A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at appendix G.

#### 7 Equality and diversity implications

7.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the licensing subcommittee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 8 Options available to Members

- 8.1 The licensing subcommittee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - Grant the variation as requested.
  - Grant the variation whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
  - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
  - Reject the whole or part of the application.

8.2 Members of the licensing subcommittee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives and relevant to the application.

#### Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:
  - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
  - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
  - c. damage
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date or birth and either -

- a. a holographic mark, or
- b. an ultraviolet feature.
- 5. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 of this condition -

- a. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- b. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$  where
  - i. P is the permitted price,
  - ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
  - i. the holder of the premises licence,
  - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises

in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

e. "value added tax" mean value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- 1. Sub-paragraph 2 applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- 2. The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **Embedded Restrictions**

6. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, 8 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day, 10 a.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- c. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- 7. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
  - a. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
  - b. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- 8. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

9. The Licensees's staff will ask for proof of age form any person appearing to be under the age of 18 who attempts to purchase alcohol at the premises.

#### Public safety

10. All fire safety equipment will be checked on a regular basis and recorded inspection when required.

#### The prevention of public nuisance

- 11. Ensure that the area around the premises is kept clean and free from litter.
- 12. The premises will have an adequate supply of litter bins. Notices requiring customers to use the litter bins will be displayed prominently at the premises. Litter bins will be emptied regularly.





  - (b) The premises licence holder / designated premises supervisor will adopt an age verification policy throughout the whole process of operation, so that at any time, if customers are unable to prove they are 18, then the supply of alcohol will be refused at the point of any ordering procedure or facility, on collection at the premises and also on delivery elsewhere.
  - (c) The premises licence holder / designated premises supervisor will ensure that any person engaged in the delivery of alcohol will operate a Challenge 25 proof of age scheme to be undertaken at the point of delivery to any customer, in order that, with the delivery of any items of alcohol previously ordered either-

    - employees of the management of the premises, or
    - via a third-party courier instructed by the management of the premises,

The application premises is a commercial unit on A650 Bradford Road, located among a cluster of commercial premises within a largely residential area. The premises adjoins to a building occupied by a used car dealer. Adjacent to the application premises a fish and chip shop occupies 215 Bradford Road, which opens no later than 11 pm. There are no late-opening premises in the immediate area. Other commercial premises in the immediate vicinity of the application premises include a DIY shop, a sports shop (American Golf), and a library.

The area is largely residential. The closest residences are located at 215 Bradford Road, adjacent to the application premises. Residences are also located 215A Bradford Road. A terrace of houses is located opposite the application premises on Bradford Road. Further residences are located immediately behind the application premises on Millard Way.

We base our qualified objection on the potential for noise nuisance arising from the following:

- Delivery vehicles and customers' vehicles coming and going from the premises, car doors clamming, and music from vehicles.
- Customers coming and going from the premises or gathering outside of the premises, into the early hours of the morning. Sale of alcohol 24/7 may attract customers who are already intoxicated, increasing the likelihood of antisocial behaviour and raised voices.
- The potential for the sources of nuisance described above to continue into hours where such disturbance may adversely affect sleep and other loss of the use and enjoyment of nearby residences, in an area that is predominantly residential and where there are few other late-opening premises.

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, we consider that the following measures are relevant and reasonable in order to meet the following aim of the license:

• Prevention of public nuisance

#### Timings of licensable activities:

- Sale by retail of alcohol (on and off the premises): 09:00 00:00, everyday
- Provision of late night refreshment: 23:00 00:00, everyday (as stipulated on current premises license).

Having reviewed the letter sent to residents near Lord Pizza- I would like to state that I disagree with the granting of extension up to 3:30 and the extension of the alcohol license to 24 hours.

I am against this extension for several reasons;

1. The area is predominantly houses with families and working people - which means that individuals will need to be up early for work and school- with such an extension comes the potential for increase in noise pollution due to more recent shoppers- which may impact sleep. T

2. The area currently has several business which are closed at regular closing times and as such I am confused as to why this particular establishment requires longer opening times or have the need to extend the sale of alcohol beyond their current time. The area is not located in a city centre ( where there is a greater demand for food and alcohol after 23:00) neither is it policed regularly and as such there is the potential for increase in anti social behaviour, increase in traffic into the area, increase in people travelling into the community to purchase alcohol- which may then cause an increase in robbery, drunken and disorderly behaviour.

I also believe that this will mean that we are encouraging people to rely more on alcohol and fast food of which both can have detrimental impact on lives- increasing alcoholism, diabetes, and other medical condition-thereby putting further stress on the NHS and police.

In addition, to this, the location is not a pub nor does it have designated seating area- so I am assuming that you are encouraging the purchasing and drinking of alcohol whilst driving.

3. The above issues will then have a knock on effect on the prices of homes within the area- which is currently growing and gaining a positive status. Should this application be granted we may see the current fabric of the community change and people having to sell their homes and move to areas that are more desirable for their families. This would a real shame as the area needs an increase in family numbers to keep schools open.

4. There is also the fear that we will see an increase in individuals purchasing alcohol and food using the green space next to the library or open lot owned by a housing development company to eat and drink, thereby increasing litter and raucous behaviour. Currently, there have been an increase in teenagers using these areas and being a nuisance -especially when it is warm and sunny. I would not like this to increase or become a habit.

Finally, I would like to know the outcome of this licensing application and whether the voices of the community will be listened to.
