CONFIDENTIAL AND EXEMPT ITEMS

The reason for confidentiality or exemption is stated on the agenda and on each of the reports in terms of Access to Information Procedure Rules 9.2 or 10.4(1) to (7). The number or numbers stated in the agenda and reports correspond to the reasons for exemption / confidentiality below:

9.0 Confidential information – requirement to exclude public access

9.1 The public must be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that confidential information would be disclosed. Likewise, public access to reports, background papers, and minutes will also be excluded.

9.2 Confidential information means

- (a) information given to the Council by a Government Department on terms which forbid its public disclosure or
- (b) information the disclosure of which to the public is prohibited by or under another Act or by Court Order. Generally personal information which identifies an individual, must not be disclosed under the data protection and human rights rules.

10.0 Exempt information – discretion to exclude public access

- 10. 1 The public may be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that exempt information would be disclosed provided:
 - (a) the meeting resolves so to exclude the public, and that resolution identifies the proceedings or part of the proceedings to which it applies, and
 - (b) that resolution states by reference to the descriptions in Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (paragraph 10.4 below) the description of the exempt information giving rise to the exclusion of the public.
 - (c) that resolution states, by reference to reasons given in a relevant report or otherwise, in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.
- 10.2 In these circumstances, public access to reports, background papers and minutes will also be excluded.
- 10.3 Where the meeting will determine any person's civil rights or obligations, or adversely affect their possessions, Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998 establishes a presumption that the meeting will be held in public unless a private hearing is necessary for one of the reasons specified in Article 6.
- 10.4 Exempt information means information falling within the following categories (subject to any condition):
 - 1 Information relating to any individual
 - 2 Information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual.
 - 3 Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information).
 - 4 Information relating to any consultations or negotiations, or contemplated consultations or negotiations, in connection with any labour relations matter arising between the authority or a Minister of the Crown and employees of, or officer-holders under the authority.
 - 5 Information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings.
 - 6 Information which reveals that the authority proposes
 - (a) to give under any enactment a notice under or by virtue of which requirements are imposed on a person; or
 - (b) to make an order or direction under any enactment
 - 7 Information relating to any action taken or to be taken in connection with the prevention, investigation or prosecution of crime

Summary of main issues

This is an application for the grant of a premises licence, made by Mr Sarvat Hossaini, for Sam's Mini Market 112 - 112A Dib Lane, Roundhay, Leeds, LS8 3AY.

The application describes the nature of the premises to be a general convenience store.

The application proposes the following: Sale by retail of alcohol, Every Day 07:00 – 23:00. These hours differ from the original application as an agreement was reached with Leeds City Council Environmental Health Team.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

An agreement was reached with West Yorkshire Police prior to them submitting a representation.

The application has attracted representations from a responsible authority. Leeds City council's Environment Heath Team (agreed) from members of the public and a 31 signature petition, which remain a matter outstanding for the licensing sub committees consideration.

1 Purpose of this report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a new premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2 History of the premises

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence for these premises.

3 The application

- 3.1 The applicant's name is Mr Sarvat Hossaini.
- 3.2 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Sarvat Hossaini
- 3.3 In summary the application is for:

Sale by retail of alcohol (off the premises) Every Day 07:00 – 23:00

Above are the amended hours agreed by Leeds City Council's Environmental Health Team.

- 3.4 A redacted version of the application has been attached at **Appendix A**.
- 3.5 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified under Section M of the application.

4 Location

4.1 A map which identifies the location of this premises is attached at **Appendix B**.

5 Representations

5.1 Under the Act representations can be received from anyone but they must be relevant and, in the case of a member of the public, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

Representations from Responsible Authorities

- 5.2 Any representation may be negotiated prior to the hearing. In this instance the operating schedule has been amended to include the measures agreed with Environmental Health. A copy of the agreement may be found at **Appendix C**.
- 5.3 An agreement was reached between the applicant and West Yorkshire Police prior to them making a representation towards the application and the operating schedule has been amended to include the measures agreed. A copy of the representation may be found at **Appendix D**.

Other representations

- 5.4 The application has attracted representation from members of the public (described as 'other persons' in the legislation).
- 5.5 The licensing authority is in receipt of five individual letters of objection, a petition containing thirty one signatures all of which are opposed to this application on the grounds of Crime & Disorder and Public Nuisance.
- 5.6 In order to protect personal data, redacted copies of the representations are attached at **Appendix E** and a redacted version of the petition can be seen attached at **Appendix F**. original copies will be available at the hearing for Members consideration.

6 Licensing hours

- 6.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.6 to 6.13 of the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- 6.2 In brief the Policy states at 6.12 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so.
- 6.3 The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not adversely impact on the licensing objectives.
- 6.4 A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at **Appendix G**.

7 Equality and diversity implications

7.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the licensing subcommittee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

8 Options available to Members

- 8.1 The licensing subcommittee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.

8.2 Members of the licensing subcommittee are asked to note that they may not reject the whole or part of the application merely because they consider it desirable to do so. It must be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

CCTV

1.1 The premise are to operate an effective CCTV system which is to be maintained in good working order at all times the premises is open for business.

1.2 The recording medium (e.g. disks / tapes / hard drive, etc.) and associated images are to be retained and securely stored for a minimum period of 28 days and are to be made available to the police / authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

1.3 The premises licence holder or designated premises supervisor is to provide the police with the contact details of at least one other member of staff (or other person(s)) who is trained and familiar with the operation of the equipment so that, at the expense of the premises licence holder, they are able to check that the equipment is operating properly and that they are able to provide copies of recorded data upon request and within no more than 12 hours from the time of the request.

1.4 The premises licence holder / Designated Premises Supervisor must notify the licensing office or the Police in the event of CCTV breakdown as soon as is reasonably practicable and in any event within 24 hours.





As such an important matter for the police to assist in the process of promoting the licensing objectives, it is therefore important that any CCTV condition should be consistent in its wording, which is exactly the intention here.

Based on Home Office guidance, this actual wording is taken from an official Leeds City Council document, which has been consulted on and is used in conjunction with all responsible authorities in Leeds, including the police – I attach the full document for your attention, which shows CCTV at the top of the list.

Therefore, only for these reasons, West Yorkshire Police would ask you to <u>replace</u> this alternative wording for what you have offered, but only with regards to CCTV.



This email is a supplementary addition to my initial email (sent from my personal email account) sent in on 9 March in response to a objection to an application for an alcohol license for Sam's Mini Market, Dib Lane, LS8 3AY.

I have approached my public health colleagues and asked them to run the above postcode through the Leeds Alcohol Data Matrix and I would like to draw the attention of the panel to the following indicators which are rated as high or very high:

- Young people not in education, employment or training (NEET) = very high
- Population under 16 years = high
- Looked after children = high
- Alcohol specific emergency admissions = high
- Alcohol related harm for hospital stays = high
- AUDIT C scores of 16+ or more (indicating higher risk of dependent drinking) = high
- Alcohol treatment (all episodes) = high

For the panel information, data relating to number of off license and on license premises count is available/within the public domain as is alcohol related harm hospital stays. The remainder are data sets which Public Health collates and has access to.

This further investigation by myself I believe adds weight to my argument against the application for another alcohol license within the same parade of shops where people can already purchase alcohol. This area of Leeds already has challenges in relation to anti-social behaviour and the fact there are also high numbers of vulnerable/looked after children and a high population of under 16's must be taken into consideration by the Licensing Committee.

Alcohol is already highly accessible and affordable within LS8 3AY and therefore adding yet another outlet into the mix, will further increase such availability and further exacerbate the problems this area faces.

I thank you for taking this into consideration.

I am a local resident who is so disappointed to see this application notification go up. The address sits on a small parade of shops and where (within 50 meters) there are already two other outlets selling alcohol! How can there be a need for a third? Plus to sell alcohol from 7am until 11pm or midnight I feel is completely unjustified, unnecessary and unethical. It is encouraging the accessibility and availability of alcohol in society and I believe this is wrong.

On the same parade of shops where this mini market is to sit, there are also at least 3 take aways and there is already an issue with associated litter and some anti-social behaviour; I believe adding another alcohol selling outlet into the mix, would further exacerbate this. There is also a public house The Orchard, within 1/4 of a mile from the premises as well.

Alcohol is a substance which can cause great harms to both the individual but also to their friends/families and wider society. It costs individuals beyond the financial and creates additional strain when misused on statutory services including the NHS.


Alongside being a local resident, I work in Public Health and for a number of years had a remit around drugs and alcohol. I know of tools like the Leeds Alcohol Data Matrix which would pull off a profile for this postcode in question – I would urge that a profile is completed for this postcode and for this to be shared at Licensing Committee and also with the applicant. I would like to ask the applicant, how he believes that by his premises selling alcohol, this will add benefit to the local area and local community. What added value exactly is this to bring, other than for his personal financial gain?

Dib Lane sits very close to the wards of Harehills, Boggart Hill and Seacroft, all of which contain large numbers of people experiencing disadvantage – how on earth can a mini market selling alcohol, add any value to the community; one which (like so many) has seen disadvantage increase and people become more isolated.

I urge the members of the alcohol licensing committee to reject this application.
