# **CONFIDENTIAL AND EXEMPT ITEMS**

The reason for confidentiality or exemption is stated on the agenda and on each of the reports in terms of Access to Information Procedure Rules 9.2 or 10.4(1) to (7). The number or numbers stated in the agenda and reports correspond to the reasons for exemption / confidentiality below:

#### 9.0 Confidential information – requirement to exclude public access

9.1 The public must be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that confidential information would be disclosed. Likewise, public access to reports, background papers, and minutes will also be excluded.

#### 9.2 Confidential information means

- (a) information given to the Council by a Government Department on terms which forbid its public disclosure or
- (b) information the disclosure of which to the public is prohibited by or under another Act or by Court Order. Generally personal information which identifies an individual, must not be disclosed under the data protection and human rights rules.

#### **10.0** Exempt information – discretion to exclude public access

- 10.1 The public may be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that exempt information would be disclosed provided:
  - (a) the meeting resolves so to exclude the public, and that resolution identifies the proceedings or part of the proceedings to which it applies, and
  - (b) that resolution states by reference to the descriptions in Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (paragraph 10.4 below) the description of the exempt information giving rise to the exclusion of the public.
  - (c) that resolution states, by reference to reasons given in a relevant report or otherwise, in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.
- 10.2 In these circumstances, public access to reports, background papers and minutes will also be excluded.
- 10.3 Where the meeting will determine any person's civil rights or obligations, or adversely affect their possessions, Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998 establishes a presumption that the meeting will be held in public unless a private hearing is necessary for one of the reasons specified in Article 6.
- 10.4 Exempt information means information falling within the following categories (subject to any condition):
  - 1 Information relating to any individual
  - 2 Information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual.
  - 3 Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information).
  - 4 Information relating to any consultations or negotiations, or contemplated consultations or negotiations, in connection with any labour relations matter arising between the authority or a Minister of the Crown and employees of, or officer-holders under the authority.
  - 5 Information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings.
  - 6 Information which reveals that the authority proposes
    - (a) to give under any enactment a notice under or by virtue of which requirements are imposed on a person; or
    - (b) to make an order or direction under any enactment
  - 7 Information relating to any action taken or to be taken in connection with the prevention, investigation or prosecution of crime

#### **Executive Summary**

To advise the Licensing Sub Committee Members of an application for the certification of a film titled, 'Sambizanga', to be screened as part of Cinema Africa. The Screening is scheduled to take place on the 29<sup>th</sup> October 2023, at Hyde Park Picture House.

With no advance screening being made available the request is made for the film to be awarded an 18 rating, subject to a declaration provided by the distributor. Further information on this element is detailed at 3.3 of this report.

#### 1.0 Purpose of this Report

1.1 This report informs Members with the background, history and issues of an application made under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for the certification of a film that does not currently have a BBFC (British Board of Film Classification) certification. Finally, this report informs Members of the options available to them when considering an application for the certification of films.

#### 2.0 **Background Information**

- 2.1 The Licensing Act 2003 applies to premises which provide film exhibitions. At present there are a total of 8 cinemas licensed in the Leeds district.
- 2.2 The majority of films shown in cinemas will carry a certificate from the BBFC, the categories of which are as follows:

# Category U Universal. Suitable for all.

A U film should be suitable for audiences aged four years and over, although it is impossible to predict what might upset any particular child. U films should be set within a positive framework and should offer reassuring counterbalances to any violence, threat or horror.

# Category PG Parental Guidance. General viewing, but some scenes may be unsuitable for young children.

A PG film should not unsettle a child aged around eight or older. Unaccompanied children of any age may watch, but parents are advised to consider whether the content may upset younger or more sensitive children.

#### Category 12A/12 Suitable for 12 years and over.

Films classified 12A and video works classified 12 contain material that is not generally suitable for children aged under 12. No one younger than 12 may see a 12A film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult. Adults planning to take a child under 12 to view a 12A film should consider whether the film is suitable for that child. To help them decide, the BBFC recommend that thy check the ratings info for that film in advance. No one younger than 12 may rent or buy a 12 rated video work.

#### Category 15 Suitable only for 15 years and over.

No one younger than 15 may see a 15 film in a cinema. No one younger than 15 may rent of buy a 15 rated video work.

#### Category 18 Suitable only for adults.

No one younger than 18 may see an 18 film in a cinema. No one younger than 18 may rent of buy an 18 rated video work.

# Category R18 To be shown only in specially licensed cinemas, or supplied only in licensed sex shops and to adults only.

The R18 category is a special and legally restricted classification primarily for explicit works of consenting sex or strong fetish material involving adults. Films may only be shown to adults in specially licensed cinemas, and video works may be supplied to adults only in licensed sex shops. R18 video works may not be supplied by mail order.

- 2.3 In addition to licensing premises for film exhibitions, the licensing authority has a duty under Section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003 to categorise a film which is absent of a certificate from a film classification body such as the BBFC. The licensing authority may also reject or modify a film which has received certification from the BBFC.
- 2.4 A copy of the current BBFC Classification Guidelines are available <u>here</u>.

# 3.0 Main Issues

- 3.1 An application has been received from Hyde Park Picture House to certify the film titled, 'Sambizanga'. The Screening is scheduled to take place on the 29<sup>th</sup> October 2023, at Hyde Park Picture House.
- 3.3 The distributor has been unable to provide an advance screener for Members of the Licensing Sub Committee to view.
- 3.4 There is no requirement for the Committee to view the film as the request is to award an 18 rating subject to a written declaration confirming that the trailers do not contain any content which would more likely than not, render them liable to be classified as R18 if considered in accordance with the BBFC Classification Guidelines.
- 3.5 A report provided by the distributor includes the synopsis, further details on the screening and the declaration referred to above. A copy of this report is available at Appendix A.
- 3.6 A representative of Hyde Park Picture will be contactable by phone should Members of Licensing Sub Committee have any questions.

# 4.0 Implications for Council Policy and Governance

4.1 There are no implications for Council policy and governance in respect of determining this application.

# 5.0 Legal and Resource Implications

5.1 There is no right of appeal to the Magistrates Court against this decision of the Committee.

# 6.0 Recommendations

- 6.1 Members are requested to consider this request for the certification of the films as attached hereto.
- 6.2 Members are recommended to view films prior to the issue of a Certificate.

#### Certification Controls at Hyde Park Picture House

As per our premises licence, the Hyde Park Picture House follows BBFC certification guidance, which is listed with each individual film on our <u>website</u>.

We have several checks in place to manage access to films based on this guidance. These checks are as follows:

- Our <u>terms & conditions page</u> includes clear guidance on certification in a way audiences can understand and which includes a link to the BBFC if further information is required.
- Certificates are added to every listing on our box office system in addition to our website and this limits the tickets available to films where appropriate. E.g. An audience member can't buy a child's ticket for a 15 or 18 certificate film.
- We have also established a Content Warning system which allows us to give additional content information to audiences to help them make informed choices about what they watch. Full guidance on this can be found on our <u>website</u>.
- Adding the cert to the Box Office system also enables our Front of House staff to identify the age restrictions for films. All staff are fully trained to both understand and then manage certification and age restrictions for films, so we can both advise on entry and appropriateness of a film and refuse sales where required.
- All tickets bought in advance or on the day are checked by a staff member on the door to the cinema auditorium so if an underage person has bought a ticket over the phone or internet in advance they would have to engage with a staff member at ticket check point and entry would be refused and ticket refunded.

#### **Summary of Main Issues**

This is an application for the grant of a premises licence made by PJ Corp Stores Limited, for Papa John's, Unit 1, Briggs House, 98 Belle Vue Road, Woodhouse, Leeds, LS3 1HF, trading as a fast food store with delivery service. The applicant has applied for Late Night Refreshment, Monday to Sunday, 23:00 - 05:00.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted representations from West Yorkshire Police and Environmental Health in their capacity as responsible authorities.

Agreements have been reached between the Applicant and West Yorkshire Police, and consequently the representation was withdrawn.

The representation from Environmental Health remains a matter outstanding for the Members' consideration and further details can be found at section 5.3 of the report.

# 1 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a new premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

# 2 History of the Premises

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence for these premises.

# 3 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant's name is PJ Corp Stores Limited.
- 3.2 In summary, the application is for:

Late Night Refreshment Monday to Sunday 23:00 – 05:00

#### Hours the premises proposes to open to the public Monday to Sunday 00:00 – 23:59

#### Non-standard timings

If applicable, an additional hour to the standard and non-standard times on the day when British summertime commences. From the standard start timing on 31st December to the standard start time on the 1st January.

3.3 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in section M of the application form. A copy of the application form can be found at Appendix A.

# 4 Location

4.1 A map which identifies the location of the premises is attached at Appendix B.

# 5 Representations

5.1 Under the Act representations can be received from anyone but they must be relevant and, in the case of a member of the public, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

# Representations from Responsible Authorities

5.2 A representation has been received by West Yorkshire Police in their capacity as a responsible authority. Any representation may be negotiated prior to the hearing and in this instance the operating schedule has been amended to include the measures agreed with West Yorkshire Police. A copy of the agreement may be found at Appendix C. 5.3 An outright objection has been submitted by Environmental Health on the grounds of public nuisance. The applicant's representative has liaised with Environmental Health in an attempt to reach an agreement and at the time of writing, no agreement has been reached. A copy of the representation, including the discussions by e-mail, can be found at Appendix D.

#### Other Representations

5.4 There are no other representations from other persons.

# 6 Licensing Hours

- 6.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.8 to 6.15 of the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- 6.2 In brief the Policy states at 6.14 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so.
- 6.3 The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not adversely impact on the licensing objectives.
- 6.4 A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at Appendix E.

# 7 Equality and Diversity Implications

7.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the licensing subcommittee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 8 Options Available to Members

- 8.1 The licensing subcommittee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - Grant the application as requested.
  - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
  - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 8.2 Members of the licensing subcommittee are asked to note that they may not reject the whole or part of the application merely because they consider it desirable to do so. It must be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.



Please find the below agreement with regards a previously submitted qualified representation (a copy of which is attached) for:

PREM/05166/001 - PAPA JOHN'S, UNIT 1 BRIGGS HOUSE, 98 BELLE VUE ROAD, WOODHOUSE, LEEDS, LS3 1HF

A minor amendment has been agreed to the conditions so they should now read:

- A suitable closed-circuit television (CCTV) system shall be in operation whilst members of the public are in attendance. The CCTV system shall record images to cover all areas of the licensed site to which the public have access (save for toilets/showers/changing areas). The CCTV system shall record images to cover external areas used by customers. At least one member of staff shall be on duty at the premises who can operate the system and download recorded images. These images will be downloaded and provided immediately, or where this is not possible as soon as practicable, on request to an officer of a Responsible Authority. The CCTV system shall be capable of retaining images for a minimum of 31 days, will be of good quality and will contain the correct time and date stamp information. The CCTV system and images will be kept in a secure environment to which members of the public will not be permitted access.
- A register shall be maintained on the premises to record all incidents and accidents. Records should include matters such as anti-social behaviour, admission refusals, refusals of service, ejections, seizure of prohibited items, casualties/unwell customers, welfare and safeguarding matters, accidents, and safety incidents. The records shall include the date, time, and location of the incident; nature of the incident; personal details and contact information for all people involved including any witnesses, any crime number and details of police officers attending. A note of the action taken, and where relevant a note of the actions to prevent any reoccurrence should also be included. The records shall be available for inspection by any authorised officer of

the responsible authorities and shall be securely retained by the licence holder for a period of 12 months after the last entry.

Subject to the agreed conditions forming part of the operating schedule I can state on behalf of West Yorkshire Police that we withdraw our objection/ representation to the licence being granted as applied for.



#### Licensing Act 2003 Name and Address of Premises: Papa Johns, Unit 1, 98 Belle Vue Road, Woodhouse, Leeds, LS3 1HF

We refer to your licensing application for the above premises. We believe that your application does not give enough information about how you intend to meet an important objective of the licence, which is to prevent public nuisance. We therefore confirm that we are submitting a formal objection to your application.

We base our objection on the following matters:

- The potential for noise disturbance associated with licensable activities passing through the fabric of the building to cause noise and vibration in adjoining residential/business premises.
- The potential for noise disturbance associated with licensable activities to break out of the premises or pass through the fabric of the building to cause noise disturbance to nearby residential/business premises.
- The potential for noise disturbance from the use of outside areas when drivers/customers area arriving/leaving, including that from vehicles. noise from people talking, car radios.
- The potential for the alleged sources of nuisance described in items 1 to 3 above to continue into hours where such disturbance may adversely affect sleep and other loss of the use and enjoyment of a property.
- That the hours of operation applied for would set a precedent in an area by late opening venues. If the precedent was set and other businesses granted such hours then there would be a significant added impact of noise disturbance deeper into the early morning hours to the surrounding residential premises.
- Impacts of increased odour and noise from kitchen extraction equipment. any previous noise assessment of plant and extract equipment would have done against

prevailing daytime background noise levels. Night time background noise levels could be up to 20-30 dB lower than daytime.

We also base our objection on experience including that specifically associated with the premises and the area including data relating to complaints received from members of the public.

Having read the matters we describe below if you feel we should consider anything else please do not hesitate to contact us.

#### Description of the surrounding area

Please refer to Appendix 1 Maps of Surrounding Area

#### Description of the applicant venue and the application:

- The applicant seeks to apply for Late Night refreshment until 5am 7 days a week.
- The premises is located in a primarily residential area, with flats directly above, houses adjacent and opposite.

The onus is on the applicant to demonstrate such matters (Items 8.41 to 8.49 of the amended guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 – April 2018

#### Complaint and other history specific to the applicant premises

21/009994/EPRN04 – complaint received 19<sup>th</sup> February 2021, regarding late night operations.

- Drivers slamming doors until 1am.
- deliveries of stock from 4am.
- drivers ignoring traffic flow system making it dangerous for pedestrians.
- Build up of waste/rubbish attracting vermin.
- People rifling through their bins attracting ASB, street drinking.

Issues appeared to be resolved informally. I gather the business owner may not have been aware someone was using the premises late at night.

#### Conclusions reached

- This application provides no information on how the licensing objective prevention of public nuisance will be met.
- Granting this application will result in increased noise from delivery drivers and customers during sensitive hours.
- Careful activity from drivers/customers would still cause disturbance. This would be exacerbated during summer periods when windows are required to be open for ventilation.
- There will also be increased noise and odour from cooking extraction systems operating through the night.
- Movement inside the premises from cooking activities, talking, walking around, opening/closing doors, radios/music during sleep sensitive hours may also give rise to disturbance

- There are few measures which could be implemented to resolve issues with the comings/goings of drivers and customers. Its difficult to shut a car door quietly!
- Taking action under S79/80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 would be very difficult. A high standard of evidence is required and typical issues such as delivery drivers coming and going are difficult to witness during the early hours of the morning. In our experience complaints relating to the potential issues will often go unresolved.
- Retrofitting measures to reduce noise transference between commercial and domestic properties is costly and disruptive and heavily relies on the business operator, who are often unwilling to do the works.
- Planning hours are restricted: The opening hours for the premises and deliveries of cooked products shall be restricted to 0700 hours to 2300 hours. The hours of servicing to and from these premises shall be restricted to 0800 hours to 2000 hours Monday to Saturday with no servicing on Sundays and Bank Holidays.
- Section 9.45 of the Revised Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act states where businesses have indicated, when applying for a licence under the 2003 Act, that they have also applied for planning permission or that they intend to do so, licensing committees and officers should consider discussion with their planning counterparts prior to determination with the aim of agreeing mutually acceptable operating hours and scheme designs.
- Through the planning process Environmental Health could request a noise assessment to ensure compliance with noise criteria. However this is not always a guarantee problems will be resolved, and the planning process would unlikely resolve issues relating to external noise. So EH would likely recommend refusal.
- A similar application was made in 2016, Papa Johns, 2 The Becketts, 605 Meanwood Road, Meanwood, Leeds, LS6 4AY by the same applicant. This was refused by the committee. The current application is in a much less commercial area and surrounded by more residential. Which will likely cause greater impact than the Meanwood application.


We recommend that the Sub-Committee refuse the application.

We understand that the Sub-Committee may take a different view and grant the application. We recommend that if that is the case we should be given the opportunity to suggest measures as conditions on the licence. We do not say that conditions would effectively prevent public nuisance but that they may go some way to reducing the potential impact.

Thank you for your counter proposal.

Your proposal is effectively asking the applicant to withdraw the application for 5 days of the week which would not reasonable for the reasons in our earlier email.

Our proposal was a fair compromise in light of the arguments/reasons presented in our earlier email.

However, in a effort to reach an agreement today, my client would be prepared to further reduce the hours as follows:

- The premises shall close to the public at 2am on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays
- The premises shall close to the public at midnight on Sundays to Wednesdays and then operate as a delivery service until 2am

I hope this can be agreed as a vert reasonable compromise, in light of our previous points made in relation to this matter.





Dear Gary,

Hope you are well.

I refer to the email below and our recent telephone conversation regarding this matter.

I am hoping this matter can be resolved by way of an agreement and without the need for a hearing.

The applicant is the Papa John's franchisor and has taken over these premises along with around 25 other sites in the "northern" area, as well as a significant number of premises in other parts of the country.

Several applications were made at the same times as this application, some of which have now been granted a 5am licence including one in York. Some of the others have been granted until 5am for deliveries with an earlier closing time of around 2am.

I take on board your comments about site and location, but you will be aware that these premises are not unique in these respects; in fact they are fairly common and many have a premises licence for later hours, despite being in residential areas.

Therefore, it is possible for residents and businesses like this to co-exist with suitable management controls. As you aware, the Licensing Act is generally permissive.

I note reference to a single complaint in 2021. However, this was before our occupation of the premises and it was two years ago with no further recorded issues. In addition, there seems to be no evidence of the complaint being substantiated or evidence to show that there is an actual noise issue with these premises which cannot be effectively managed.

I also note that reference has been made to planning.

Firstly, the planning department has considered this application and decided not to make a representation. They accepted our second point that planning and licensing are separate regimes; planning policies and considerations should be kept separate from licensing. There is nothing in the guidance which overrides this.

You will be aware that each application is determined on its own merits and the licensing committee is not bound by decisions made in relation to other premises, and certainly not those made 7 years ago.

In fact there are examples of more recent premises licences granted for hours as late as 5am in similar locations, including in Leeds.

There were no representations from the residents which is significant, and there were no other representations other than from the Police who have withdrawn their representation based on the following conditions:

• A suitable closed-circuit television (CCTV) system shall be in operation whilst members of the public are in attendance. The CCTV system shall record images to cover all areas of the licensed

site to which the public have access (save for toilets/showers/changing areas). The CCTV system shall record images to cover external areas used by customers. At least one member of staff shall be on duty at the premises who can operate the system and download recorded images. These images will be downloaded and provided immediately, or where this is not possible as soon as practicable, on request to an officer of a Responsible Authority. The CCTV system shall be capable of retaining images for a minimum of 31 days, will be of good quality and will contain the correct time and date stamp information. The CCTV system and images will be kept in a secure environment to which members of the public will not be permitted access.

• A register shall be maintained on the premises to record all incidents and accidents. Records should include matters such as anti-social behaviour, admission refusals, refusals of service, ejections, seizure of prohibited items, casualties/unwell customers, welfare and safeguarding matters, accidents, and safety incidents. The records shall include the date, time, and location of the incident; nature of the incident; personal details and contact information for all people involved including any witnesses, any crime number and details of police officers attending. A note of the action taken, and where relevant a note of the actions to prevent any reoccurrence should also be included. The records shall be available for inspection by any authorised officer of the responsible authorities and shall be securely retained by the licence holder for a period of 12 months after the last entry.

We are hoping that we can also reach an agreement based on a reduction in hours and conditions, in an effort to work in partnership and avoid a hearing.

Therefore, we are proposing the following as compromise:

- The premises shall close to the public after 01:00 and will then operate solely as a delivery service until 03:00.
- Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
- Delivery drivers shall enter and leave their vehicles (or get on and get off their bikes) quietly and considerately, not leave engines running and with due consideration to neighbours.
- Delivery vehicle horns shall not be used during the provision of late-night refreshment, except in accordance with the Highway Code.

You will see the above includes a significant reduction in hours, and conditions to manage potential noise which have been effectively used in other such cases.

If an agreement can be reached, then it would be helpful if you could please let me have your reply as soon as possible and copy in the licensing authority (copied in), to hopefully avoid them having to do any further work to set up a hearing unnecessarily.

Please also let me know if you would like to discuss any of the above and, of course, the above is subject to a full agreement being reached to avoid a hearing.
