EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this hearing is a pre-hearing for the Licensing Sub-committee to consider whether the application for variation can be dealt with at the hearing scheduled for the 27th November 2006 due to the pending prosecution.

At this hearing the variation application will not be determined by the Licensing Sub committee and due to the confidential nature of the Police Representation the public will be excluded from the proceedings.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

3.0 HISTORY OF PREMISES

- 3.1 The premises currently have the benefit of:
 - ➤ A Premise Licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003.
 - ➤ 3rd February 2006 the Licensing Sub-committee heard an application to vary the Licensable Activities to 03:00am and the removal of certain conditions. The Sub-committee after hearing representations reduced the hours for the Licensable Activities taking place. This being Friday & Saturday 01:00am and midnight the rest of the week.
 - During February August 2006 complaints were received from local residents that the premises were operating outside of the permitted hours, noise disturbance, litter in the vicinity, allegations regarding drugs on the premises.
 - On the 27th August 2006 a joint visit was conducted by Leeds City Council Enforcement Officers and West Yorkshire Police. The visit was conducted 02:15am and during this visit the Officers witnessed unauthorised licensable activities taking place. The DPS Mr Matharu was cautioned and interviewed under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984. Mr Matharu admitted the offences that were taking place.
 - ➤ Leeds City Council has now submitted the Prosecution package. A date of hearing has not yet been determined.
