EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report informs Members of an application for the variation of a Premises Licence for One Stop Stores, 52 North Lane, Headingley, Leeds, LS6 3HU. The Licensing Authority is under a duty to determine this application.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To advise Members of an application made under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a Premises Licence in respect of One Stop Stores, 52 North Lane, Headingley, Leeds, LS6 3HU.

Cumulative Impact Policy

Members will recall the Council's Licensing Policy was approved in January 2005 and that the Council is applying a special cumulative impact policy to certain areas of the Leeds district. These areas are part of the City Centre, Headingley, Woodhouse Lane and Chapel Allerton.

Although these premises fall within the Cumulative Impact Policy Area, the Cumulative Impact policy does not include off-licences, it relates to applications for new night clubs and for pubs and clubs which are characterised as large capacity vertical drinking premises.

2.0 HISTORY OF PREMISES

2.1 The premises currently have the benefit of:

- A Premise Licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003.
- The existing hours of operation are Monday to Saturday 08.00hrs to 2300hrs and Sunday 10.00hrs to 22.30hrs.
