1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 The Scrutiny Board (City & Regional Partnerships)) has now completed its inquiry into Skills.
- 1.2 The Board is now in a position to report on its findings and its conclusions and recommendations resulting from the evidence gathered.
- 1.3 Whilst Members of the Scrutiny Board have been given an opportunity to comment on the draft report it is still out for consultation with our partners. In view of the fact that today's meeting is the last in the current municipal year the draft final report and recommendations will be circulated to all Members of the Board on the 5th May 2009 for consideration at today's meeting along with a summary of the evidence considered during the inquiry.

2.0 Consultation

2.1 This is one of the first Scrutiny Board inquiries to which the protocol between scrutiny and statutory public sector partners in Leeds applies. A separate protocol exists for the scrutiny of health. The statutory public sector partners protocol states that

"At the conclusion of an inquiry, Scrutiny Boards usually produce a preliminary report. These reports are drafted by the Scrutiny Support Unit in conjunction with the Scrutiny Board Chair and agreed by the Scrutiny Board. They contain a summary of the evidence submitted and the Board's conclusions and recommendations. Where a Scrutiny Board is considering making recommendations to a named public sector partner it will invite advice from the relevant Chief Executive prior to finalising its recommendations."

- 2.2 Several of the recommendations relate to the Learning and Skills Council (LSC) and its successor bodies and other public sector partners. Advice has been sought from them and will be reported to today's meeting.
- 2.3 Scrutiny Board Procedure Rule 16.3 states that "where a Scrutiny Board is considering making specific recommendations it shall invite advice from the appropriate Director prior to finalising its recommendations. The Director shall consult with the appropriate Executive Member before providing any such advice. The detail of that advice shall be attached to the report".
- 2.4 In this case the specific recommendations involve the Chief Executive, Assistant Chief Executive (Planning Policy and Improvement), Directors of City Development, Resources, Children's Services and Environment and Neighbourhoods and they have been invited to consult with their relevant Executive Board Member and provide any advice that they would wish to provide at this stage, before the Scrutiny Board Members, finalise their report.
- 2.5 Any advice received from the Directors and Executive Board Members will be circulated to all Members of the Board at today's meeting.

3.0 Recommendations

- 3.1 The Board is requested to:-
 - (i) Agree the Board's final report and recommendations having regard to any advice made by our public sector partners and the relevant Directors and Executive Board Members.
 - (ii) Request that the relevant public sector partners and specified Directors in consultation with their Executive Board Members formally respond to the Scrutiny Board's recommendations within 3 months of receipt of the Board's report.

3.1 Recommendation 1

That local MPs be asked to give their support to the view that there should be adequate funding of Higher Education without removing the cap on fees.

Recommendation 2

To complement recommendation 1 MPs and the Chief Executive of Education Leeds should be asked to support the introduction of a single national bursary system that is easy to understand and access through consistent and transparent process.

3.2 Response to Recommendations 1 and 2

These two recommendations were primarily addressed by Rosemary Archer, Director of Children's Services and Chris Edwards, Chief Executive of Education Leeds sending a joint letter to all local MPs outlining the issues and seeking their support. The content of the letter is included as Appendix 1.

3.3 Recommendation 3

That the Director of Children's Services and the Chief Executive of Education Leeds be asked to report back to this board in April 2009 on what initiatives they are developing to promote greater coordination and cooperation and flexibility between the universities and the Council to help improve the information, advice and guidance (IAG) provided for our young people, particularly in relation to university application processes and application for financial support.

3.4 Response to Recommendation 3

The detailed response to Recommendation 3 is given below This response is split into two main sections; current initiatives and services and future initiatives and developments.

3.5 Context

IAG is currently a national priority for DCSF and DIUS, who have identified that in recent years IAG has not met the needs of young people. The Education and Skills Act (2008) placed the duty to deliver information, advice and guidance for young people aged 13-19 (25 for learners with learning difficulties / disabilities) with local authorities. Learning providers are now required to deliver impartial information about all progression opportunities, and careers education becomes statutory for learners from year 7 to year 13. This includes progression to higher education and student financial support.

Prospects will take up the new contract for delivery of a universal Connexions service in Leeds from 1 April 2009. Prospects will undertake a full service review during the first 8 weeks of the contract. This review will provide the opportunity to evaluate the existing IAG available to 14-19 learners around higher education, progression and student finance. Partners will be consulted on recommendations through the IYSS Strategic Board and 14-19 Strategy Group. The outcomes of the service review will inform the IYSS Service Plan, 14-19 Education Plan and the Connexions delivery plan.

3.6 Current initiatives and services for IAG around higher education and student finance.

Excellent partnership activity between local and sub regional universities and Leeds 14-19 learning providers can be seen in activities delivered to learners and

parents. The scope of current activity is broad, including widening participation days, curriculum support and development, mentoring by volunteer undergraduates for Leeds schools, primary school activities, gifted and talented programmes, summer schools, speakers for schools and colleges. Many of these activities are organised through formal partnerships e.g. Aimhigher, HEARWY, Compact schemes, etc. All Leeds HEIs are involved in curriculum development through Diploma consortia and higher education is represented at key strategic partnerships.

Leeds HEIs invest heavily in work around raising the aspirations of young people across the city and region through a range of widening participation and Aimhigher activities. Much of this work is focused on providing advice, guidance, support and encouragement for young people who would not generally consider progression to HE as an option. The universities also provide innovative bursary schemes to ensure students from underrepresented groups are not deterred from University.

Schools and colleges make 14-19 learners aware of how information, advice and guidance about higher education and student finance can help them to make decisions about future learning and how to access the services they need through careers education, tutorial support, targeted information at key transition points and initiatives aimed at improving attainment and progression for identified groups (e.g. Aimhigher cohort). Aimhigher fund an Impact Theatre Company performance for all year 9 learners, and this includes HE and student finance. The Aimhigher Roadshow provides more in depth information to identified students.

All schools and colleges review and evaluate their careers education and information advice and guidance delivery as part of their annual self evaluation for OFTSED.

Information about higher education and student finance specifically is available universally to young people usually in 16-19 phase through

- i. school post 16 careers education / tutorial programmes
- ii. FE student support services
- iii. Connexions information booklets and careers libraries
- iv Connexions personal advisers

Information is available in a number of formats, including handbooks produced by schools or colleges, locally produced Unifaqs handbook for sixth form students, nationally produced Connexions resources, letters to parents and carers, visiting speakers, workshops and tutorials in schools and colleges, university visits, open days and targeted widening participation and Aimhigher activity locally and subregionally. An annual UCAS HE convention is hosted in Leeds by Leeds Careers.

A number of local websites currently contain information about progression to HE including Leeds City Council, Leeds Pathways, Wyzup (Leeds Careers), Aimhigher (local and sub regional) and universities' own websites. In addition, national websites including directgov, Aimhigher, UCAS and Student Finance England. Students are signposted to these by schools and colleges and in the publications listed above.

Not all young people in Leeds will consider higher education: targeted work is in place with some young people less likely to progress onto higher education, including looked after children, young people from some black and minority ethnic

groups and young people from some localities or from families with lower income levels. Aimhigher targets resources to widen participation in partnership with schools, colleges and VCFS organisations such as REEMAP. The kids@uni scheme works with primary school children and their parents in targeted schools to widen participation.

Parents and carers receive information about how information, advice and guidance services can help their children at key transition points and how to access services. Resources are produced locally for parents and carers by Connexions and by schools and colleges. Parents / carers are signposted to national websites and publications. Parents / carers receive information about the UCAS HE convention in Leeds. Innovative activities are taking place with carers of looked after children as part of the Stepping Stones project to increase progression for this group of young people.

3.7 Future initiatives and developments in the context of local change and national reform and policy drivers

- A strategy for careers education and IAG is to be developed as part of the Children and Young People's Plan (details in the 14-19 Education Plan and IYSS Strategic Plan) to support service planning, curriculum development and CE/ IAG delivery. HE partners, including undergraduate students, parents / carers and other stakeholders will be included in the development of the strategy.
- An IAG Curriculum Group is to be convened with representation from all 14-19 stakeholders to support careers education and IAG development across the city, including raising awareness among learning providers of their statutory duty to deliver impartial IAG (Education and Skills Act, 2008).
- A network of IAG will be developed across the city, impacting on 14+ Confederations within the Children Leeds Wedge Partnership arrangements and the 14-19 Curriculum Framework Group and the Diploma delivery consortia will have named IAG leads to ensure comprehensive communication frameworks are in place.
- An IAG development co-ordinator post will be created by Prospects to work across Connexions, 14-19, learning providers and other partners to raise standards and support changes brought about by 14-19 reforms.
- Schools and colleges will be supported to review and evaluate their IAG regarding higher education progression, with an emphasis on student finance within the context of the national quality standards for IAG. There is a target of 75% of providers to meet national quality standards by March 2010 (reference 14-19 Education Plan). All schools and colleges will be required to review their careers education programmes against the national framework for careers education (year 7 13) and the learning outcomes for economic wellbeing and financial capability.
- Connexions Leeds will undertake a full review of information resources in all formats to ensure clarity, accuracy and coherence of information regarding higher education progression, university fees and student finance. Connexions Leeds will be responsible for ensuring this information is fully disseminated to Leeds schools and colleges, accessible by learners and parents / carers and understood by the teachers and advisers supporting learner choice and progression. Further information is available through Aimhigher publications and local websites.
- CPD focusing on HE progression and student finance to be prioritised for all Connexions PAs and professionals working with targeted groups, in line with

- the requirements of the Connexions contract from April 2009. This will include teachers, tutors, PSCHE curriculum planners, Aimhigher organisers, youth workers, parent support assistants, training and apprenticeship providers, etc. Aimhigher will co-ordinate input from Student Finance England. Information has already been circulated to all schools, colleges and personal advisers.
- CPD around IAG, progression and university finance has been identified as a key activity in CYPP for 2009 – 10 for parent partnership workers, STEPS facilitators and other key professionals working with parents and communities. (STEPS is a personal effectiveness programme aimed at raising aspiration and expectations)
- Reforms to the secondary curriculum, including the introduction of Diplomas, are expected to improve outcomes for level 3 learners, with 60% of learners expected to achieve a level 3 qualification by 2015, having a positive impact on future progression to higher education.
- Focus groups with learners during year 12 (decision making), year 13 (application process) and with first year undergraduates (home students) will identify key issues during the guidance process. Focus groups with parents will ask how relevant the information received was to individual circumstance and how this could be improved. Learner focus groups and parent / community based events will be delivered as part of the new Connexions contract. The outcomes of focus groups will be presented to 14-19 Strategy Group and IYSS Board to inform IAG strategy development and curriculum and Connexions service planning.
- The changes to student financial arrangements and the possibility that the government will remove the ceiling on university fees will have an unknown impact on progression to higher education and undergraduate retention. It is possible that a 'HE champion' working across post 16 learning providers in Leeds may be able to counter the potential adverse impact of these changes by working to up-skill teachers, tutors and advisers in and build capacity in delivering IAG and financial information, including the role of bursaries in student financial support, within their organisations. Education Leeds in partnership with Connexions Leeds will discuss with local HEIs the possibility of them investing any underspend from their bursary schemes (see para. 8 Comments and recommendations of Scrutiny Report) in jointly funding a fixed term post. Education Leeds could host the post in the 14-19 team and provide the management function for the postholder. Integrating the role with 14-19 and Connexions activity as part of the 14-19 Education Plan would give immediate outcomes in terms of embedding relevant skills and knowledge in schools, colleges and parent / community interventions. Activity could be offered as a universal offer across the city supported by targeted intervention to meet the widening participation agenda.

Letter to local MPs

University Fees

Leeds City Council's Scrutiny Board (City and Regional Partnerships) considered a request from the University of Leeds Student Union concerning their University fees campaign and the impact students have on the Leeds economy. I attach a copy of a Statement and recommendations made by the Scrutiny Board which I hope you agree makes interesting reading.

As part of the Comments and Recommendations they recommended that the Director of Children's Services and the Chief Executive of Education Leeds write to all Leeds Members of Parliament seeking their support that there should be adequate funding of Higher Education without removing the cap on fees. The Chair's Summary

The Council in 2008 recognised the importance of reviewing how our partners are contributing to the outcomes, targets and priorities within the Leeds Strategic Plan by establishing this Scrutiny Board.

Whilst acknowledging the enormity of the task ahead we were able to concentrate our efforts for the first time on the effectiveness of our partnership arrangements. We have undertaken this work with vigour and enthusiasm.

I am grateful to all Members of the Board for their support, understanding and encouragement throughout the year. I know that the work we have undertaken thus far has added real value to our understanding of the complexity of this issue and contributed to the effectiveness of the areas we have considered.

A number of Members have served on several working groups and or visits and have given freely of their time which has been particularly helpful.

We have tried throughout the year in accordance with good scrutiny practice to maintain single item agendas for our Board meetings. In the main this has been achieved and has proved to be a valuable tool that allows detailed scrutiny of the matter under review. It has also enabled witnesses to present their evidence and respond to our questions in a more relaxed and less pressured environment.

We undertook a detailed inquiry into the Role of the Voluntary, Community and Faith Sector (VCFS) in Council led community engagement. This was extremely worthwhile and if our recommendations are accepted by the Executive Board will contribute to our Strategic Plan. Our witnesses included a number from the Voluntary and Health Sector who informed me how pleased they were at being asked to give evidence to the Board on this matter.

We held several sessions on our inquiry into skills 19 plus and heard from a wide range of witnesses including the Learning and Skills Council, Heads of FE Colleges, the National Director and Regional Director National Skills Academy Financial Services. This was an extremely complex and difficult inquiry but positive in outcome.

We considered the Council's contract with Marketing Leeds and reviewed its Business Plan for 2009 to 2012.

We also had a number of meetings with representatives of the University Student Unions and Pro-Vice Chancellors of Leeds University and Leeds Metropolitan University on University fees following a request for scrutiny. Our discussions where very beneficial in understanding the issues involved.

There were a number of issues that the Board was unable to pursue because of a lack of time including the development of scrutiny at a regional and sub regional level. I hope at least some of these might be considered in the new municipal year.

I hope that the practice of the Board in making external visits to our partner organisations can continue next year. They were always well received and supported and provided us with a real opportunity to hear from individuals and organisations operating on the front line. It also provided an alternative outlet for them to raise issues and concerns.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who contributed to the work of the Board including witnesses, officers and scrutiny support staff.

Inquiry on the Role of the Voluntary, Community and Faith Sector (VCFS) in Council Led Community Engagement

We considered the published Empowerment White Paper, 'Communities in Control: Real People, Real Power' which sets out new expectations and opportunities for Local Government. We agreed that it was timely to undertake an inquiry into the role of the VCFS in Council led community engagement.

Our Main Recommendation

That the Director of Environment and Neighbourhoods co-ordinates work across the Council to undertake a Compact for Leeds awareness and compliance self assessment. This will enable the Board to assess the extent to which Council services engage with and recognise the value of VCFS in developing and improving their plans and policies in order to deliver a customer based service.



Voluntary Action Leeds

Our other recommendations were:

♦ That through the VCFS Partnership Group the Director of Resources and the Director of Environment and Neighbourhoods

- (a) reviews the period of funding attached to grant awards to VCFS organisations with a view to phasing in 3 5 year awards from April 2010 for appropriate schemes.
- (b) identifies and provides appropriate support to enable VCFS organisations to develop planned exit strategies to better manage expiry of funding awards
- (c) strengthens leadership and collaborative arrangements within the Council and in the VCFS to minimise the potential for the duplication of commissioned activity in order to maximise the effectiveness and efficiency of the services being provided by April 2010.

"The VCF Sector has been extremely successful in engaging with communities at grass roots level in areas such as South Leeds and Gipton but this dynamism, flexibility, vision and energy may be lost as a consequence of commissioning and procurement.



- (b) the impacts of current commissioning strategies on smaller organisations and identifies what safeguards could be developed to prevent losing the valuable services of these smaller organisations that provide a valuable service to the local community.
- (c) the opportunities to develop federated or collaborative working across VCFS infrastructure organisations to extend support to a wider range of organisations within the sector and benefit both their organisation and their service user and maximise the impact of public and other resources.
- (d) the opportunities to develop targeted information and support to community organisations to support their development and enable them to address local issues.

Inquiry on University Fees

In July we considered a request for scrutiny from the University of Leeds Student Union concerning their University Fees campaign and the impact students have on the Leeds economy. We established a working group which met with the pro-Vice-Chancellors for the University of Leeds and Leeds Metropolitan University, the City Development department and representatives from the Student Unions. We issued a Statement with the following recommendations:

- That local MPs be asked to give their support to the view that there should be adequate funding of Higher Education without removing the cap on fees.
- ⋄ To complement the above recommendation MPs and the Chief Executive of Education Leeds should be asked to support the introduction of a single national bursary system that is easy to understand and access

processes.

♦ That the Director of Children's Services and the Chief Executive of Education Leeds be asked to report back to this Board in April 2009 on what initiatives they are developing to promote greater coordination and cooperation and flexibility between Universities and the Council to help improve the information, advice and guidance provided to our young people, particularly in relation to university application processes and application for financial support.



Student Protest about University Fees

Inquiry into Skills 19 years Plus

The guidance for the new Comprehensive Area Assessment (CAA) indicates inspectors will explore and expect to see 'how well councils engage with, involve and empower local people to improve their skill levels.

We considered it appropriate that we assess our partnership arrangements in this context and how successful the drivers introduced by the Multi Area Agreement (MAA), Local Area Agreement (LAA) and the review of Further Education (FE) in Leeds would contribute now and in the future to improving skills across the city at all Skill Levels. In particular we wanted to identify what, if any, these new arrangements would have on improving hard to reach young people who have Level 1 skills or less.

Scrutiny Board (Children's Services) is undertaking an inquiry on 14 - 19 year olds and we have restricted our inquiry to 19 years plus but inevitably there has been been an overlap between the two.

- (d) That the intention to submit further reports on the progress made to the Executive Board in May and October 2009 be noted;
- (e) That the engagement with the Member Task Group and Scrutiny Board as part of the process to develop the Local Authority's response to the current challenges which exist in this field be noted.

246 Valuing People Now - Introduction of a National and Local Strategy for People with Learning Disabilities

The Director of Adult Social Services submitted a report advising of the recent publication of the 'Valuing People Now' document, a national 3 year strategy for people with learning disabilities. The report also provided an update on the development of a learning disability strategy and action plan for Leeds.

RESOLVED -

- (d) That a further report be submitted to a future meeting of the Board providing information relating to the agreements reached on the requirement to transfer remaining commissioning responsibility from NHS Leeds (Leeds PCT) to Leeds City Council from the commencement of the 2009/10 financial year in the terms set out within section 6 of the submitted report for the continuing greater benefit of people with learning disabilities.

247 Progress Report on PPP/PFI Programme in Leeds

The Deputy Chief Executive submitted a report providing an update on the Council's current portfolio of PPP/PFI projects and programmes, highlighting the planned key activities of the projects and identifying any potential challenges arising from them. The report also began to address the employment opportunities which would be created as a consequence of the investment programme, commencing with the new Holt Park Well Being Centre.

248 Members' Improvements in the Community and Environment and Ward Based Initiative Schemes

The Director of Resources submitted a report outlining proposals to update the Ward Based Initiative (WBI) scheme and the guidance on the Members Improvements in the Community and Environment (MICE) scheme.

- (a) That the revised eligibility criteria for WBI schemes, as outlined in paragraph 3.2 of the submitted report, be approved;
- (b) That authority be given to incur expenditure of £330,000 on the WBI scheme, subject to approvals in line with procedures set out in the Guidance Notes as detailed at Appendix A to the submitted report;
- (c) That the changes to the MICE scheme application process as detailed in paragraph 4.6 of the submitted report, be approved.

DEVELOPMENT AND REGENERATION

249 Deputation to Council - Six Local Associations and Action Groups with regard to the future of the West Park Centre

The Director of City Development submitted a report in response to the deputation to Council from six local associations and action groups on 28th January 2009.

The following options which related to the future of the West Park Centre were detailed within the report. It was noted that in accordance with the resolution of Full Council on 28th January 2009, whichever option was pursued, constructive discussions would be undertaken with all local Ward Members, with a view to keeping facilities for Youth and Community Work on site:

- (i) The Council retain and refurbish all of the current buildings at the Centre:
- (ii) The Council retain and refurbish some of the buildings at the Centre, or consider limited new build, whilst seeking to dispose of the balance of the developable part of the site;
- (iii) To close the Centre and to seek to dispose of the whole of the developable part of the site;
- (iv) To investigate the potential and advisability of transferring the ownership of all of the Centre to the local community;
- (v) To investigate the potential and advisability of transferring the ownership of some of the Centre to the local community or other partnership, and to seek to dispose of the balance of the developable part of the site.

Following consideration of the report appended to the covering report designated as exempt under Access to Information Procedure Rule 10.4(3) which was considered in private at the conclusion of the meeting it was

RESOLVED -

- (a) That the issues raised in the deputation to Council and the responses provided be noted;
- (b) That the resolution of the Full Council meeting held on 28th January 2009 regarding the West Park Centre be noted;

- (c) That the conclusions of the submitted report be noted and that officers be instructed to undertake, as a matter of priority, consultation with the user groups and the community organisations in order to determine how their needs can best be met;
- (d) That officers be instructed to explore the options detailed at paragraph 4.2 of the report, and to report back to the Board in six months time with the results of the consultation and the options appraisal.

250 A65 Quality Bus Initiative - Land Acquisition

The Director of City Development submitted a report regarding the previously approved acquisition of land which was not in the City Council's ownership, in order to progress the A65 Quality Bus Initiative.

RESOLVED – That approval be given to incur expenditure of up to £2,500,000 from the Local Transport Integrated Transport scheme for the acquisition of third party lands necessary for the implementation of the A65 Quality Bus Initiative.

(The matter referred to in this minute was not eligible for Call In on the basis that authorisation to incur expenditure in order to acquire land for this scheme was a necessary consequence of the decision taken by Executive Board on 4th April 2007).

251 Climate Change Strategy

A report was submitted by the Director of City Development providing Executive Board with an opportunity to comment upon the 'Leeds Climate Change Strategy: Vision for Action', prior to its submission to Full Council for formal approval.

RESOLVED -

- (a) That the 'Leeds Climate Change Strategy: Vision for Action' be agreed prior to its submission to Full Council for formal approval;
- (b) That a further report be submitted to the Board outlining the actions which have been undertaken and are proposed to be undertaken in the future in order to meet the aims set out within the strategy.

252 A639 Stourton Landslip

The Director of City Development submitted a report on proposals to develop potential options to rectify a stability problem on the A639, near Leeds Valley Park roundabout resulting from a landslip.

Following consideration of Appendix 1 to the report designed as exempt under Access to Information procedure Rule 10.4(3) and (5) which was considered in private at the conclusion of the meeting it was

RESOLVED – That authority be given to incur additional expenditure of £245,000 to enable the continuation of design options for a solution to the problems on the A639 in the vicinity of the Leeds Valley Park Roundabout

resulting from a landslip which will be funded from Contingency Scheme No 01371 within the approved Capital Programme.

253 City Development Scrutiny Inquiry into Residents' Parking Schemes
The Chief Environmental Services Officer and the Director of City
Development submitted a joint report presenting the proposed response to the
recommendations of the Scrutiny Board (City Development) following the
Board's inquiry into Resident Permit Parking Schemes (RPPS).
