Executive Summary

This report informs members of an application for the grant of a Premises Licence for premises situated at 38 Call Lane, Leeds, LS1 6DT, trading as Call Lane.

Briefly the application is for a cocktail lounge to ground and first floor of these premises, with provision for food and entertainment. Regulated entertainment is to be provided between the hours of 10.00 am and 04.00 am and late night refreshment between the hours of 23.00 and 04.00. The premises to close half hour beyond these times. Full details of the activities to be provided are listed in paragraph 3 of this report.

The premises are located within an area covered by a Cumulative Impact Policy.

The responsible authorities are served with copies of the application by the applicant and Ward Members have been notified of the application.

1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a Premises Licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to consider this application due to the receipt to representations.

2.0 History of Premises

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence for these premises.

3.0 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Castlegate Leisure Limited.
- 3.2 The location of the premises can be found on the map attached as Appendix A.

5.0 Matters Relevant to the Application

- 5.1 Members of the Licensing Sub Committee must make decisions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm
- 5.2 In the making of their decision Members are obliged to have regard to the national guidance and the council's licensing policy. Members will be aware they must also have regard to the relevant representations made and evidence they hear.
- 5.3 Members should note that these premises fall within a Cumulative Impact Area. The Cumulative Impact Policy for this area reads as follows:

It is the council's policy on receipt of relevant representations to refuse applications in Area 1 for night clubs and for pubs and clubs which are characterised as large capacity vertical drinking premises (sometimes called high volume vertical drinking establishments) which are premises with large capacity used primarily or exclusively for the sale of or consumption of alcohol, and which have little or no seating for patrons. It is also the council's policy on receipt of relevant representations to refuse applications for new premises seeking a licence to provide hot food between 11.00 pm and 5.00 am where the food is purchased to take away from the premises as opposed to premises where the food is to be consumed on the premises and whilst patrons are seated at tables provided for that purpose.

6.0 Options available to members

- 6.1 The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the Designated Premises Supervisor.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 6.2 Members of the Licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be <u>necessary</u> in order to promote the licensing objectives.

Dear Leeds Entertainment Licensing,

Please accept this letter as a formal objection to a premises license being for the above establishment.

I am a resident of Crown Street Buildings (the building situated opposite on Call Lane) and my apartment looks down directly onto this address.

All Crown Street Residents (55 apartments) live in this part of town on the understanding of a certain amount of noise and antisocial behaviour as part of living adjacent to Call Lane.

However we need to be mindful that opening more bars in the local area (especially so close to residents whose apartments back onto Call Lane) will exacerbate the issues that currently exist and will be detrimental to our quality of life. An additional bar can only be a negative thing for all of us who live in Crown Street Buildings and surrounding properties.

I would therefore like to raise my objection with reasons:

Increased Noise

- Taxi Noise There is already a huge problem with noise caused by taxi drivers beeping their horns into the early hours of the morning. Another bar will mean more demand for taxis, therefore further from congested taxis. This will increase the problem not only from taxis on Call Lane but also all the surrounding streets around the building as more people will be attracted to the area. All residents in the building will be affected by this.
- Noise from Patrons Additional intoxicated people in the area will cause further noise, again which is already a problem for the residents of Crown Street Buildings. Presently I have to keep my windows shut at night time otherwise noise from patrons on the street causes me problems sleeping. This is a real issue in the Summer months as windows cannot be opened for ventilation.

 Noise from Bars – Music coming from bars on Call Lane is already a massive problem for residents and an additional bar will cause more noise to be leaked out onto the street and up into the apartments that face Call Lane. Again, this problem is particularly worsened in the Summer when residents windows are open.

Increased Crime

Call Lane is already overcrowded on Friday and Saturday nights and the police regularly attend fights that spill over out of the bars onto the street. An additional bar with more intoxicated people can only increase this likelihood of this type of crime and public disorder. This also causes severe noise problems with shouting and sirens that can be heard even when all the windows in my apartment are closed.

Public Safety

Further intoxicated people in the general area of Call Lane and the Corn Exchange can only increase the existing security risk of unwanted people gaining access to Crown Street Buildings either via the main entrance on Cloth Hall Street or the entrance on Call Lane (which is directly opposed the proposed new venue)

We are residents of Apartment 53 Crown Street Buildings (the buildings opposite the the premises in question) and are writing to object to the aforementioned application.



I live at flat 17 Crown Street Buildings LS2 7DA. My flat faces onto Call Lane and is directly opposite number 38 Call Lane LS1 6DT. I understand that an application for a licence has been made by Castlegate Leisure Ltd in respect of this property. I am writing to object to that application.

There are already a large number of bars along Call Lane and, although a lively nightlife is one of the attractions of living here, I do think that there should be a limit to the number of bars that are allowed in such a small area. My main objection is in respect of the nuisance that another bar will create. Noise is a big problem for this building with all the bars competing with each other for their music to be heard. This competition will worsen if another one opens. In the summer they frequently have their doors open and with people going outside to smoke it is an issue even in the winter. For example, I cannot have my windows open if I want to be able to hear the television or listen for my children and I can hear the music and shouting even with the windows closed. Taxis blocking up the road and beeping their horns constantly is another major cause of noise which will only get worse if demand increases.

My other objections are on the basis of the risk of crime/antisocial behaviour and health and safety. Call Lane is already congested in the evenings and there are frequently fights and arguments. Emergency vehicles often find it difficult to get through and an increase in the number of people will only make this worse. The amount of rubbish including broken glass, thrown away food and vomit makes the area quite unpleasant in the mornings. I am a resident of Crown Street Buildings (the building situated opposite on Call Lane).

I would therefore like to raise my objection with the following reasons:

Increased Noise

- Taxi Noise There is already a huge problem with noise caused by taxi drivers beeping their horns into the early hours of the morning. Another bar will mean more demand for taxis, therefore further from congested taxis. This will increase the problem not only from taxis on Call Lane but also all the surrounding streets around the building as more people will be attracted to the area. All residents in the building will be affected by this.
- Noise from Patrons Additional intoxicated people in the area will cause further noise, again which is already a problem for the residents of Crown Street Buildings. Presently I have to keep my windows shut at night time otherwise noise from patrons on the street causes me problems sleeping. This is a real issue in the Summer months as windows cannot be opened for ventilation.
- Noise from Bars Music coming from bars on Call Lane is already a massive problem for residents and an additional bar will cause more noise to be leaked out onto the street and up into the apartments that face Call Lane. Again, this problem is particularly worsened in the Summer when residents windows are open.

Increased Crime

Call Lane is already overcrowded on Friday and Saturday nights and the police regularly attend fights that spill over out of the bars onto the street. An additional bar with more intoxicated people can only increase this likelihood of this type of crime and public disorder. This also causes severe noise problems with shouting and sirens that can be heard even when all the windows in my apartment are closed.

Public Safety

Further intoxicated people in the general area of Call Lane and the Corn Exchange can only increase the existing security risk of unwanted people gaining access to Crown Street Buildings either via the main entrance on Cloth Hall Street or the entrance on Call Lane (which is directly opposed the proposed new venue) Page 33


