Executive Summary

This report informs members of an application for the grant of a Premises Licence for the premises situated at 62 Stainbeck Road, Leeds, LS7 2PW, trading as Naeem's Tandoori.

The application is for a premises wishing to operate as a takeaway with the sole provision of Late Night Refreshment. The proposed hours of operation are noted at 3.3 of this report.

The initial hearing to determine this application took place on Monday 7th February 2011 and was subsequently adjourned. Members were concerned whether or not the measures suggested by West Yorkshire Police are necessary and proportionate for the promotion of the crime prevention objective.

Members adjourned the hearing to allow time for the applicant to collect additional information as detailed at 3.3(vi), of this report.

The responsible authorities are served with copies of the application by the applicant and Ward Members have been notified.

1.0 Purpose of this Report

To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a Premises Licence in respect of Naeem's Tandoori located at 62 Stainbeck Road, Leeds, LS7 2PW. The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2.0 History of Premises

2.1 This is the first application for a Premises Licence for these premises.

3.0 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Mr Abdul Khaled.
- 3.2 The location and proximity to neighboring premises can be seen on the map provided; Members attention is drawn to **Appendix A**.
- 3.3 A copy of the application and operating schedule are attached as **Appendix B** to this report. For the assistance of members, the Operating Schedule shows:

i) Proposed licensable activities

L Late Night Refreshment

ii) Proposed hours of licensable activities

The proposed hours of licensable activities are as follows:

Late Night Refreshment

Sunday to Thursday 23:00 – 00:00 Friday and Saturday 23:00 – 01:00

iii) Proposed times when the premises is open to the public

The premises propose to open to the public between the following hours:

Sunday to Thursday 17:00 – 00:00 Friday and Saturday 17:00 – 01:00

iv) Non-Standard Timings

Non-standard timings are not proposed in this application.

v) Steps to promote licensing objectives

The applicant proposes to take the steps identified in the Pro-Forma Risk Assessment to promote the Licensing Aims. A copy of the Assessment is attached at **Appendix C** of this report.

vi) Adjournment

The application was originally scheduled for hearing on 7th February 2011, where Members were concerned whether or not the measures suggested by West Yorkshire Police are in fact necessary to promote the prevention of crime and disorder. Members require additional information in order to reach a decision on this issue.

The additional information requested is set out below.

- a) The exact capabilities of the existing CCTV system at the premises including details as to its ability to retain images, the length of this retention and the means by which images may be downloaded for production to third parties;
- b) What adjustments, if any, would be required to bring the existing CCTV system up to the standard proposed by West Yorkshire Police; and
- c) The time, details and nature of crimes recorded in the vicinity of the premises over the last 12 months.

4.0 Relevant Representations

- 4.1 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or interested parties. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of an interested party, must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 4.2 The following Responsible Authorities have made representations:
 - West Yorkshire Police

6.0 Matters Relevant to the Application

6.1 Members of the Licensing sub committee must make decisions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:

- 6.2 In making their decision, Members are obliged to have regard to the national Guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy. Members will be aware that they must also have regard to the relevant representations made and the evidence they hear.

- 7.1 The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule
 - Reject whole or part of the application
- 7.2 Members of the Licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be <u>necessary</u> in order to promote the licensing objectives.



This report informs members of an application for the grant of a Premises Licence for premises situated at Unit 1, Waterloo House, Assembly Street, Leeds, LS2 7DE, trading as Cattlegrid.

2.1 The premises are situated in Unit 1 of Waterloo House, Assembly Street, Leeds LS2 7DE.

This unit previously traded as Cafe Rouge and an application for the conversion of the former licences into a Premises Licence was submitted by The Pelican Group Ltd in July 2005. No objections to the conversion application were made and therefore a premises licence covering the existing activities was issued in August 2005.



POLICE - LETTER OF REPRESENTATION - CUMULATIVE IMPACT POLICY:

Thank you for submitting your application for the above premises, received at the address above on 7th January 2011.

The application relates to premises which will fall within one of the areas of Leeds currently subject to a policy of cumulative impact, as detailed in the present Statement of Licensing Policy 2011-2013, issued by Leeds City Council as the licensing authority.

The area concerned in this particular case is Area 1 Leeds City Centre.

Therefore, in line with the current statutory guldance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 Licensing Act 2003, West Yorkshire Police make representations based on the cumulative impact policy of the area concerned and highlighted above, where the licensing objectives and particularly the prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance objectives, are being adversely affected.

There has been a policy of cumulative impact in Leeds City Centre since January 2005, as a part of the original Statement of Licensing Policy issued by Leeds City Council, made to introduce the 'transitional provisions' of Licensing Act 2003 in February 2005 to full implementation in November 2005.

As a part of the process back then, in 2004 West Yorkshire Police provided detailed statistical analysis of

alcohol related crime and disorder and anti social behaviour, in relation to specific areas of the City Centre.

The original policy only applied to certain isolated parts of Leeds City Centre.

In 2007, as part of the first 3 year review of Leeds City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, further statistical evidence was produced by West Yorkshire Police to ascertain if there was the continuing need for a policy of cumulative impact in Leeds City Centre.

As a result, in December 2007 the revised Statement of Licensing Policy 2007-2010 was issued by Leeds City Council, and whilst the policy of cumulative impact for Leeds City Centre was to continue, there was very little if any relevant change in the wording of the policy and no change at all in the affected areas of the City Centre.

A second review of the Statement of Licensing Policy has taken place in Leeds in 2010 and a 3rd edition has been issued by Leeds City Council as recently as early January 2011.

During this lengthy process, West Yorkshire Police, after being requested to do so, once again provided an up to date 2 year statistical overview of violent offences and anti-social behaviour in Leeds City Centre as a whole.

As a result, on this occasion the policy of cumulative impact for Leeds City Centre has radically changed, both in -:

- 1. a significantly increased geographical area, and
- 2. modification of the wording of the policy, to include all types of alcohol led premises, rather than just a specific type of premises serving alcohol.

The current Statement of Licensing Policy goes into further detail about the significant changes recently made and highlighted above.

For instance-:

- Paragraph 7.16 "In the five years since the cumulative policy for the city centre was introduced, the City Centre has changed. Recent crime statistics show three main hot spots for crime and disorder:
 - 1. Call Lane, Boar Lane and the area behind the Corn Exchange
 - 2. Woodhouse Lane, Merrion Way and Wade Lane
 - 3. The east end of The Headrow and New Briggate.
- Paragraph 7.17 "Other areas of concern include the Eastgate area and Briggate".
- Paragraph 7.19 "On reviewing these facts and the previous cumulative impact policy, the council has amended the geographical area of the cumulative impact policy to incorporate the crime hotspots......".
- Paragraph 7. 20 "In addition there is rising concern about premises which have not been
 included within the scope of the previous policy, such as restaurants serving hot food and drink
 after 11pm. These premises have also contributed to crime, disorder and public nuisance in the
 city centre.

The wording for the current policy of cumulative impact for Leeds City Centre therefore now reads-:

"It is the council's policy, on receipt of relevant representations, to refuse new and variation applications in Area 1 for alcohol led premises such as bars, pubs and nightclubs and for premises seeking late night refreshment such as takeaways and late opening restaurants, unless the applicant can demonstrate that their application would not add to the cumulative impact of such licensed premises in the area".

Whilst it is accepted that this application gives the impression that the premises will operate as a restaurant, the premises will be situated in one of the identified "three main hot spots for crime and disorder" – and specifically the area behind the Corn Exchange.

Therefore, in terms of location, implied description albeit that a description is not actually given and proposed trading until 0200 every day, West Yorkshire Police consider that this application implicates the current policy of cumulative impact for Leeds City Centre in every respect, and would rely on paragraphs 13.29 and 13.30 of the current Section 182 guidance in making this representation.

However, should the applicant at a future hearing before a sub-committee of the licensing authority, be able to persuade the sub-committee to rebut the presumption that applications implicating cumulative impact policies should normally be refused, as outlined in paragraph 13.29 of the said guidance and attached; then West Yorkshire Police propose the following control measures (in <u>addition</u> to those that you may have already offered), are incorporated within the operating schedule of the premises licence as conditions, which are considered relevant, proportionate and necessary in order to promote the following licensing objectives:

- · the prevention of crime & disorder;
- the prevention of public nuisance;
- the protection of children from harm.

West Yorkshire Police are satisfied that the proposed measures are not adequately dealt with by other legislation.

For clarification at this stage by the applicant, there is no indication on the application received by the police as to whether the supply of alcohol will be for consumption:

- · on the premises only? or
- both on and off the premises?

Therefore, the measures shown in red below are included on the assumption that the supply of alcohol will be required for consumption on & off the premises.

If the supply of alcohol is to be for consumption on the premises only, then there is no need for either of the measures shown in red?

West Yorkshire Police would ask the applicant to clarify this point at the hearing.

In addition, the actual number of covers per floor identified on the plans received, are left open to suggestions from the applicant.

This is intended to give the operator some degree of flexibility in difficult economic times, but any suggested numbers must also materialise in the premises predominantly maintaining the status of a restaurant, especially in considering the policy of cumulative impact in the City Centre.

Again, West Yorkshire Police would ask the applicant to suggest sensible numbers of covers for each floor, to satisfy the police and the licensing authority especially in the context of the City Centre CIP.

Measures / Additional measures proposed:

- A suitable CCTV system will be operational on the premises at all times when licensed activities are being carried out;
- CCTV security footage will be made secure and retained for a minimum period of 31 days time to the satisfaction of WYP;
- At all times that licensable activities are taking place there will be a member of staff on duty
 who is conversant with operating the CCTV system and who is able to download immediately
 any footage requested by an officer from any of the Responsible Authorities or the Licensing
 Authority;

- A Supervisor's Register will be maintained at the licensed premises, showing the names, addresses and up-to-date contact details for the DPS and all personal licence holders;
- The Supervisors Register will state the name of the person who is in overall charge of the
 premises at each time that licensed activities are carried out, and this information will be
 retained for a period of twelve months and produced for inspection on request to an
 authorised officer;
- The Premises Licence Holder/Designated Premises Supervisor and all members of staff will ask for proof of age from any person appearing to be under the age of 21 who attempts to purchase alcohol at the premises:
- The PLH/DPS will belong to a recognised trade body or Pub Watch Scheme where one exists, whose aims include the promotion of the licensing objectives;
- Notices indicating the existence and effect of an Alcohol Designated Public Places Order will be prominently displayed at the exits to the premises;
- No sale / supply of alcohol or any form of regulated entertainment shall take place in any
 external area within the curtilage of the premises at any time;
- Consumption of alcohol within any external area withing the cartilage of the premises, will at
 any time only take place in accordance with a separate street café / pavement licence issued
 and renewed by Leeds City Council;
- The premises will operate predominantly as a restaurant and a substantial menu will be made available at all times that the premises licence has effect;
- A minimum number of X covers will be maintained on the lower ground floor, a minimum number of X covers will be maintained on the upper ground floor and a minimum number of X covers will be maintained on the first floor, at all times that the premises licence has effect.

Evidence of cumulative impact

- 13.26 There should be an evidential basis for the decision to include a special policy within the statement of licensing policy. For example, Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnerships will often have collated information which demonstrates cumulative impact as part of their general role on anti-social behaviour; and crime prevention strategies may have already identified cumulative impact as a local problem. Similarly, environmental health officers may be able to demonstrate concentrations of valid complaints relating to noise disturbance. The open meetings recommended at paragraph 1.22 of this Guidance should also assist licensing authorities in keeping the situation as to whether an area is nearing this point under review.
- 13.27 After considering the available evidence and consulting those individuals and organisations listed in section 5(3) of the 2003 Act and any others, a licensing authority may be satisfied that it is appropriate and necessary to include an approach to cumulative impact in the licensing policy statement. In this case, it should indicate in the statement that it is adopting a special policy of refusing new licences whenever it receives relevant representations about the cumulative impact on the licensing objectives which it concludes after hearing those representations should lead to refusal (see paragraphs 13.29 13.32 below).
- 13.28 The steps to be followed in considering whether to adopt a special policy within the statement of licensing policy are summarised below.

STEPS TO A SPECIAL POLICY

- Identify concern about crime and disorder or public nuisance
- Consider whether there is good evidence that crime and disorder or nuisance are happening and are caused by the customers of licensed premises, or that the risk of cumulative impact is infinitent.
- Identify the boundaries of the area where problems are occurring:
- Consult with those specified in section 5(3) of the 2003 Act; and subject to the outcome of the consultation
- Include and publish details of special policy in licensing policy statement

Effect of special policies

- 13.29 The effect of adopting a special policy of this kind is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences or club premises certificates or variations that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, following relevant representations, unless the applicant can demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives.
- 13.30 However, a special policy must stress that this presumption does not relieve responsible authorities or interested parties of the need to make a relevant representation, referring to information which had been before the licensing authority when it developed its statement of licensing policy, before a licensing authority may lawfully consider giving effect to its special policy. If there are no representations, the licensing authority must grant the application in terms that are consistent with the operating schedule submitted.





Executive Summary

This report informs members of an application received on the 27th January 2011, to transfer a Premises Licence for The Starlight Bar, Shaftesbury Parade, Harehills Lane, Leeds, LS9 6TA. The application is to specify Mr Gavin Mackay Ferguson and Mr Honar Jafar Rafik as the licence holder in accordance with Section 42 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act"), The applicant requested that the application takes immediate effect.

1.0 Purpose of this Report
