#### Executive Summary

This report informs members of an application for the grant of a premises licence for premises situated at 10 Lowtown, Pudsey, LS28 7AA, trading as Cafe Liqueur.

The premises propose to offer the licensable activities as detailed at 3.4 of this report and within the hours detailed in 3.5 of this report.

The premises were previously licensed and details of the licensable activities are at 2.1 of this report.

The responsible authorities are served with copies of the application by the applicant and Ward Members have been notified of the application.

#### 1.0 **Purpose of this Report**

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

#### 2.0 History of Premises

2.1 This is the first application for this Premise since the previous Licence was surrendered.

Previously, the premises were only licensed for Sale by Retail of Alcohol (for consumption both on and off the premises)

Monday to Sunday: 11:00 - 22:00

- 6.2 Members of the Licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be <u>necessary</u> in order to promote the licensing objectives.



The application premise is currently vacant and was previously a café. This application is requesting opening hours from 08:00 to 00:30 7 days a week. The current planning approval is for A3 use only and allows for the premises to be open until 22:30 hours only. However it appears that this application is for the premises to be predominately a bar (A4 use) owing to the late opening hours applied for (including live music, dancing and sale of alcohol etc until 00:00 hours) and due to the very small kitchen shown on the plan.



## **Executive Summary**

This report informs members of an application to vary a Premises Licence for premises situated at High Street, Yeadon, Leeds, LS19 7TA trading as Albert Inn.

To add the Provision of Facilities for Dancing, Live Music and Provision of Facilities for Entertainment of a Similar Description for the days and hours as shown in section 3.5 of this report.

## **Purpose of this Report**

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a Premises Licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt to representations.

### 2.0 History of Premises

2.1 An application for the conversion and variation of the Justice's Licence was submitted in July 2005.

No objections to the conversion were received and therefore a Premises Licence was granted relating to the existing days and hours.

The variation application was to extend the hours for the sale of alcohol and recorded music by one hour for the following days and hours

Monday to Saturday11:00 to 00:00 MidnightSunday11:00 to 23:30

The premises would close 30 minutes later.

Objections to the variation application were received and the variation application was therefore referred to the Licensing Sub Committee at their meeting being held on the 7th September 2005.

At the meeting the Licensing Sub Committee resolved to grant the variation in hours in part as follows:-

Monday to Saturday 11:00 to 23:30 Sunday 11:00 to 23:00

The premises would close 30 minutes later.

The Licensing Sub Committee also decided to impose the following conditions:a) Noise shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises after 23:00 hours. b) A suitably trained First Aider or appointed person will be provided when the premises are open.

c) A procedure for dealing with unwell members of the public will be in place.

On the 4th March 2011 a Minor Variation was submitted - this was to add the same activities as detailed in 3.5 on the report

Valid objections to the Minor Variation Application were received and therefore the application was rejected.

2.2 A copy of the existing licence (including all conditions) is attached at Appendix A.

  - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- 7. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.



The premises is situated on High Street, Yeadon. There are other commercial premises on the same parade but this is a predominantly residential area. This department has received an number of complaints relating to noise from loud music up until 2006 but there has been no complaints since this date. The application is for the addition of live music, dancing and karaoke. Karaoke and live music account for a high proportion of the noise complaints that this department receives regarding licensed premises.

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, the Leeds City Council's health and environmental action service considers that the following measures are proportionate and necessary in order to promote the following licensing objective:

• Prevention of public nuisance

### Noise and Vibration

- 1. Licensable activities shall be conducted and the facilities for licensed activities shall be designed and operated so as to prevent the transmission of audible noise or perceptible vibration through the fabric of the building or structure to adjoining properties.
- 2. Noise from a licensable activity at the premises will be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.
- 3. There shall be no external loudspeakers
- 4. Bottles will not be placed in any external receptacle between 11 pm and 7 am the following day to minimise noise disturbance to neighbouring properties.
- 5. The activities of persons using the external areas shall be monitored after 11 pm and they shall be reminded to have regard to the needs of local residents and to refrain from shouting and anti social behaviour etc when necessary.

## **Transport / Pedestrian Movement**

6. Clear and legible notices will be displayed at exits, car parks and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly having regard to the needs of local residents, in particular emphasising the need to refrain from shouting, slamming car doors, sounding horns and loud use of vehicle stereos and anti-social behaviour.
