## **Executive Summary**

This report informs members of an application for the grant of a Premises Licence - New Application for premises situated at 319 Harehills Lane, Harehills, Leeds, LS9 6AA, trading as Lajkonik.

The premises is intended for continental food and delicatessen retail with alcohol sales as noted in 3.5

The responsible authorities are served with copies of the application by the applicant and Ward Members have been notified of the application.

## 1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a Premises Licence New Application in respect of the above mentioned premises.

#### 5.0 Matters Relevant to the Application

- 5.1 Members of the Licensing Sub Committee must make decisions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:

  - The prevention of public nuisance
  - The protection of children from harm
- In the making of their decision Members are obliged to have regard to the national guidance and the council's licensing policy. Members will be aware they must also have regard to the relevant representations made and evidence they hear.

## 6.0 Options available to members

- The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - Grant the application as requested.
  - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
  - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
  - Refuse to specify the said person as the Designated Premises Supervisor.
  - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 6.2 Members of the Licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be <u>necessary</u> in order to promote the licensing objectives.







Thankyou for your application which is dated 15 April 2011 which was only been received at Millgarth Police Station on 19 April 2011.

This application is for the grant of a new premises licence for the above named premises. This is a new application and seeks the grant of a premises licence for the following activities:

#### Sale of Alcohol

#### Every day 0830hrs x 2300hrs

It is the opinion of West Yorkshire Police, that your application contains insufficient information on how you will achieve the licensing objectives. In particular, we cannot be satisfied at this stage that, if granted the premises would not adversely affect crime and disorder and/or public nuisance in the locality.

A check of Police systems shows that you are linked to other licensed and unlicnesed premises on Harehills Lane. These other premises and the persons linked to them, are known to West Yorkshire Police and HMRC. They are known for their links to crime and the illegal importation of alcohol, cigarette and tobacco into the UK. Action has been taken in relation to the individual premises and the individuals concerned. Some of the premises involved have tried to obtain premises licences to try and legitamise their illegal activities. A number of these applications have failed and no premises licences have been granted.

On 10 May 2011, following information received, 319 Harehills Lane was visited by HMRC Officers. At the time of the visit 2.9KG of mixed, hand rolling tobacco where no duty had been paid was seized. This tobacco was hidden in freezers at the store.

Recent intelligence has also been received in relation to the sale of illegally imported good. This intelligence is borne out by the HMRC seizures.

Whilst the HMRC seizures do not pertain to alcohol there is a pattern of behaviour developing amongst premises within a few meters of one another and this has already been proven to be correct within days of the inteligence being received.

It is my belief that you are involved in this illegal activity and you are also trying to legitamise something which cannot be legitamised.

### FOR THE REASONS SET OUT ABOVE WEST YORKSHIRE POLICE ARE OF THE OPINION THAT THIS APPLICATION SHOULD BE REFUSED IN FULL.

However, if the licensing Sub-Committee are mindful to grant this application, the following conditions are attached for their consideration:

#### Conditions / Crime Prevention Measures to read-:

A suitable CCTV system will be maintained and be operational on the premises at all times when licensed activities are being carried out

CCTV security footage will be made secure and retained for a minimum period of 31 days time to the satisfaction of WYP.

A Supervisors Register will be maintained at the licensed premises, showing the names, addresses and up-to-date contact details for the DPS and all personal licence holders.

The Supervisors Register will state the name of the person who is in overall charge of the premises at each time that licensed activities are carried out, and this information will be retained for a period of twelve months and produced for inspection on request to an authorised officer

The PLH/DPS will ensure that an Incident Report Register is maintained on the premises to record incidents such as anti social behaviour, admissions refusals and ejections from the premises.

The Incident Report Register will contain consecutively numbered pages, the date time and location of the incident, details of the nature of the incident, the names and registration numbers of any door staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and personal licence numbers (if any) of any other staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and numbers of any police officers attending, the police incident and / or crime number, names and addresses of any witnesses and confirmation of whether there is CCTV footage of the incident.

The Incident Report Register will be produced for inspection immediately on the request of an authorised officer

The PLH/DPS staff will ask for proof of age from any person appearing to be under the age of 21 who attempts to purchase alcohol at the premises.
