Summary of main issues

This is an application for the grant of a premises licence, made by Siam Square (Leeds) Ltd, for Siam Oriental Restaurant 106A Harrogate Road, Moortown, Leeds, LS7 4LZ.

The application is for Sale by retail of alcohol, live music, recorded music, performance of dance, anything of a similar description, late night refreshment as noted in 3.3.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted representations from other persons and responsible authorities.

The premises are located within an area covered by a Cumulative Impact Policy.

1.0 **Purpose of this Report**

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2.0 History of Premises

- 2.0 This the first application for a premises licence made by Siam Square (Leeds)Ltd.
- 2.1 These premises previously had the benefit of a premises licence. Due to the licence holder entering liquidation the licence lapsed on the 29th July 2013, as no licence transfer was received within the 28 day consultation period.

3.0 The Application

- 3.0 The applicant is Siam Square (Leeds) Ltd,
- 3.1 The application form may be found at Appendix A to this report.
- 3.2 In summary the application is for

Sale by retail of alcohol, live music, recoded music, performance of dance, anything of a similar description.

Late night refreshment

Everyday 23:00 - 03:00

Non Standard Timings

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve until the start of permitted hours New Year's Day. Late night refreshment 23:00 New Year's Eve until 05:00 New Year's Day.

4.0 Other matters relevant to the application

4.0 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

5.0 Steps to promote the Licensing Objectives

5.0 The applicant proposes to take specific steps to promote the licensing objectives identified in section "P" of the application form.

6.0 Puttachat Keassarin intends to be the Designated Premises Supervisor.

8.0 Cumulative Impact Policy

- 8.0 The premises are located within the Cumulative Impact Area 4.
- 8.1 Cumulative impact means the potential impact on the promotion of the licensing ojectives here there are a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area.
- 8.2 An applicant wishing to obtain a new licence for premises falling within any of the cumulative impact areas must identify through the risk assessment process and/or operating schedule the steps that they intends to take so that the council and responsible authorities can be satisfied with that granting of a new licence will not add to the impact already being experienced.
- 8.3 Details of the Cumulative Impact Policy specific to Area 4 and an outline of the evidence behind the reason for setting this Policy is attached at Appendix C.

9.0 Representations

- 9.2.2 The licensing section is in receipt of ten individual letters of objection. All of which are opposed to this application on the grounds of noise nuisance.
- 9.2.3 The application has attracted a representation from the Chapel Allerton ward Councillors. A copy of the same may be found at Appendix E.
- 9.2.4 Copies of the representations will be available at the hearing for Members consideration.

10.0 Options Available to Members

- 10.0 The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.

- Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
- Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
- Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
- Reject the whole or part of the application.





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Cumulative Impact Policy






Cumulative Impact Policy

Area 4 relates to the Chapel Allerton district of Leeds.

It is the council's policy, on receipt of relevant representations, to refuse new and variation applications in Area 4 for licences for pubs, clubs, bars, café bars, restaurants and takeaways, unless the applicant can demonstrate that their application would not impact on the cumulative effect of such licensed premises in the area.

Rationale

The Chapel Allerton CIP has performed well in the four years since its inclusion in the Statement of Licensing Policy. However, over the past four years residents of Chapel Allerton have noticed an increase in the amount of takeaway litter. There is also a concern relating to premises applying to vary their licence to increase the licensed area of their premises. In some cases this includes altering conditions to allow the use of the outside area to facilitate smokers following the smoking ban. This has a knock on effect on nuisance issues.





Fig 2 shows the number of violent crimes in the period between 1^{st} May 2009 and 30^{th} April 2010, compared to the total number of premises closing per 1-hour time slot on any given day of the week (as at 1^{st} May 2010).

As with the comments against the same analysis for Area 2, it is difficult to attribute the violent crime directly to premises which have no control over customers once they have closed.


Although not as closely matched as the figures for Area 2, the above would still suggest that violent crime numbers are affected by the number of premises which close at a given time. Should the number of premises increase, or existing premises extend their hours, it would be expected that the violent crime would react accordingly.

Nuisance reports in Area 4 (2005 – 2010)


Fig 3 shows the number and location of nuisance complaints received by Leeds City Council relevant to licensed premises in Area 4 since 2005.

Fig 5 shows the number and location of anti social behaviour offences (data supplied by West Yorkshire Police) between 1^{st} May 2009 and 30^{th} April 2010.

As can be seen from the above three maps of Area 4, there is a clear concentration of nuisance and violent crime problems around the locations dominated by licensed premises, while anti social behaviour is prevalent in the entire of Area 4 – although still with a clear concentration in numbers around licensed premises.

Residents have raised concerns about premises making slight variations to their premises licences, which while individually seem relatively minor, collectively have a large impact on the area. Following further analysis, it has been found that since 2005 there has been 11 variations in Area 4, these can be summarised as follows:

- 4 applications to extend hours
- 3 applications to allow or alter activities in external areas following the introduction of the smoking ban
- 2 applications to increase structural size
- 1 application to remove redundant licence conditions

Extracted from the Final Consultation Report published in December 2010 which presented the findings of the review of the cumulative impact policies and the subsequent public consultation on the amended Statement of Licensing Policy which took place in 2010. The full report is available from Entertainment Licensing.

Thank you for submitting your application for the above premises.

We are of the opinion that your application contains insufficient information about how you intend to meet the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance. We therefore confirm that we are submitting a formal objection to your application.

We base our objection on the following matters:

- 1. The potential for noise disturbance associated with licensable activities passing through the fabric of the building to cause noise and vibration in adjoining residential flats.
- 2. The potential for noise disturbance from the use of outside areas whilst smoking and whilst arriving / leaving, including that from vehicles.
- 3. That the granting the hours of operation applied for would set a precedent in an area already served by late opening venues. The applicant venue can reasonably be expected to add to the existing impact of all licensable premises in that area. The existing impact includes noise from loud music and from sources outside such as from customers.

We base our objection on experience including that specifically associated the area including data relating to complaints received from members of the public.

Having read the matters we describe below if you feel we should consider anything else please do not hesitate to contact us.

Description of the surrounding area:

Chapel Allerton has a vibrant mix of mainly commercial and residential premises. Generally the commercial premises are situated along the main roads that run through the area, with the bulk of the residential premises situated behind. Please see map appendix 1.

Many businesses also have residential flats situated above them. This has caused issues relating to noise due to the close vicinity of noise sensitive premises to premises that open late and offer licensable activities such as live or recorded music.

The map at appendix 1 shows premises that offer licensable activity that are open at later times from midnight. The premises involved and their general opening hours are indicated within on the map by a colour (blue, yellow and red). Please ignore any coloured circles created by the data base. We believe based on the councils database that no premises open later than 02:00 unless they have notified us of a temporary event.

The applicant premises is situated within the Chapel Allerton C.I.P. area. It is the council's policy, on receipt of relevant representations, to refuse new and variation applications for licences for pubs, clubs, bars, café bars, restaurants and takeaways, unless the applicant can demonstrate that their application would not add to the cumulative impact of such licensed premises in the area.

The application has attracted representations from the public, members and other agencies that concern matters related to the public nuisance objective.

Description of the applicant venue and the application:

When considering the map (appendix 1) the applicant venue is situated centrally amongst other commercial and licensable premises. The venue occupies the ground floor and basement of a substantial part of the old Police station premises. It has several flats adjoining it at ground and first floor level.

The applicant has applied for indoor live and recorded music, performances of dance and anything of a similar nature between 12:00 and 03:00 every day of the week. It has also applied for the provision of late night refreshment indoors and the supply of alcohol both inside and off premises over the same period. The hours of opening applied for extend a further half hour until 03:30.

In their accompanying floor plans the applicant has indicated that significant activities known generally to cause complaints about noise are to occur in areas adjoining noise sensitive premises. All the areas specified within the plans are internal areas.

We have invited the applicant through their solicitor to show how they are going to meet the licensing objective relating to public nuisance (Items 8.34 to 8.41 of the AMENDED GUIDANCE ISSUED UNDER SECTION 182 OF THE LICENSING ACT 2003 – October 2012). To date all that we have received is that information given within part M of the application form. The applicant has stated that CCTV will be provided and images retained and service will be provided by waiters and waitresses.

We have been provided with no detail regarding any noise insulation or limiting devices. We have no further detail regarding the intended management of customers using the outside areas including whilst they arrive and leave the venue.

Despite our suggestion that the applicant considers further the potential for their application to cause public nuisance and in so doing use the proforma risk assessment, we have received no further information.

Complaint history for the area about 200m around the venue:

Please refer again to the map at appendix 1. The red stars indicate the general areas where a complaint has been received concerning noise during the period October 2010 to present. A filled red star indicates complaint/s arising from noise from outside sources such as people on the street. The spread of the complaints is fairly wide within the area.

Over the past three years, we have received twenty three complaints considered relevant to the application. The majority of those complaints related to noise (91%) and the majority of noise complaints related to loud music (60% of all complaints) or from noises such as from patrons outside (39% of all complaints). It should be noted that some complainants alleged noise from both sources.

Please see the outline of the complaints in appendix 2

Complaint history specific to the applicant premises:

We have received no complaints regarding the business premises between October 2010 and now. We have only received two complaints regarding noise during 2005 /6 specific to the applicant premises.

The alleged noise in 2005 was due to loud music and voices beyond the operating hours which were considerably less than that applied for in the current application. The latest activity was licenced until midnight on certain nights. In 2006 it was due to loud music played during the early evening until 23:00 in an un-insulated glazed area.

Comparative complaint levels for context.

Littering is by far the most frequent service request recorded for the city center and is recorded as a result of an observed offence. As a result we have removed littering from the overall figures considered in order to make them comparable. We have also not included noise from buskers in the city center as they are not a source of complaint in Chapel Allerton.

We find that noise from loud music accounts for approximately 68% of all remaining relevant complaints and noise from outside sources, 18% for the city center since October 2010. We have 142 relevant complaints overall for that period in the area 500m from city square [relevant commercial noise (various), odour and lighting issues].

When comparing Chapel Allerton with the city center for the same period, complaints for noise from loud music are similar and also high as a percentage overall. The noise arising from outside sources is much higher in Chapel Allerton 39% as compared with 18% in the city center.

The above figures suggest that the impact of noise from both inside and outside sources can be expected to be high in Chapel Allerton.

Conclusions reached

The applicant has not demonstrated that their application would have no cumulative impact in the area. This is despite an invitation to do so.

We believe that the applicant premises will cause noise disturbance to adjoining and nearby residential premises. We also believe that the business will contribute to the noise from people in the area especially as they leave during the early hours, or whilst they smoke outside.

We believe that the hours of operation would set a precedent that would see other licensed premises require further hours of operation in an area that already experiences issues relating to noise.

We recommend that the Sub-Committee refuse the application according to the C.I.P.


We do not believe that conditions will resolve the application as it stands.

Thank you for submitting your application for the above premises, received at this address on 30th September 2013, via Leeds City Council as an 'electronic application'.

The application relates to premises which fall within one of the areas of Leeds currently subject to a policy of cumulative impact, as detailed in the present Statement of Licensing Policy 2011-2013, issued by Leeds City Council as the licensing authority.

Therefore, in line with the said policy and the current statutory guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 Licensing Act 2003, West Yorkshire Police make representations based on the cumulative impact policy of the area concerned and highlighted above, where the licensing objectives and particularly the prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance objectives, are being adversely affected.

The area concerned in this particular case is currently Area 4 Chapel Allerton.

The Chapel Allerton cumulative impact policy (CIP) first became effective in Leeds on 11th January 2006.

In 2007, with the issue of the first revised version of the policy, it was determined that the CIP for this particular area would remain unchanged both in wording and area.

A second review of the policy took place in Leeds in 2010 and a 3rd edition was issued by Leeds City Council in early January 2011.

The policy of cumulative impact for Chapel Allerton changed with this 3rd edition of the document, by-:

- adding takeaways to the policy for the 1st time, and
- also adding variation applications within the scope of the policy for the first time.

A third review of the Statement of Licensing Policy is currently being undertaken.

With regards to the Chapel Allerton CIP, subject to what may materialise after the consultation period has ended, the intention now is to leave this area unchanged, because, as it has been recorded before and again now, the CIP policy seems to have had the desired effect in this area, with new and variation applications being in the minority since its introduction in 2006.

The premises subject of this application actually traded up until July of this year as the "Old Police Station".

The premises were first issued with a justices' licence in December 2002 granted under Licensing Act 1964.

As part of the transitional provisions of Licensing Act 2003, in August 2005, the holder of the justices licence at the time, applied to Leeds City Council to convert to a premises licence.

On 2nd September 2005, Leeds City Council issued PREM/01706, to have effect from 24th November 2005.

Based on the hours of the previous licence, together with additional certificates which applied separately to the basement and ground floor parts of the premises, the total extent of the hours for the premises as a whole were midnight Monday to Saturday and 23-30 on a Sunday, which remained unchanged until the licence lapsed on 29th July 2013.

From a police perspective, there were no significant problems with regard to the Old Police Station specifically, over the years that it traded.

This application for a new premises licence described as a "restaurant and bar", is for licensable activities including the supply of alcohol from 1200 to 0300 every day of the week, with an additional $\frac{1}{2}$ hour added until the premises actually close.

Therefore, not only are the hours applied for well in excess of the hours previously issued to these particular premises, they are also well in excess of hours currently in force for premises supplying alcohol clustered in this immediate area.

As we are told by the licensing authority in the policy, few applications to extend the already granted hours in established premises in this area, is one of the reasons why the area has benefited from the existence of the CIP since 2006, granting the hours applied for to these premises, would probably reverse the favourable effect the policy has had over the last 7 years plus.

Further, and directly in relation to the Chapel Allerton CIP, it is the view of West Yorkshire Police, if the applicant successfully tries to argue that they are not strictly speaking a 'new' premises because of the existence of the previous licence now lapsed, these hours applied for would then amount to a variation of that premises licence.

Therefore either way, this application implicates the CIP for Chapel Allerton.

Still on the subject of the proposed hours, West Yorkshire Police take note, that the proposed DPS of the new premises licence application, on 24th September 2013 submitted an application for Temporary Event Notices (TEN's) at these particular premises.

The TEN's were for 3 consecutive weekly periods in October this year, from Wednesday to Sunday each week, and for hours which correspond to the hours applied for with this application.

The police had no grounds to oppose the recent TEN application, and given that the events so far appear to have passed without any concerns to the police, there will be no objections to any future TEN applications unless there are grounds to do so.

In anticipation that the applicant may make mention of these recent TEN's at any scheduled hearing in support of this application, West Yorkshire Police would like to make the following observation in response.

Whilst based on the same licensing objectives, objections to TEN's by the police (& now the Environmental Protection Team also) need to be premises specific.

Conversely, representations to a licence application for a premises situated in an area of cumulative impact, are not based on the licensing objectives being undermined by a specific premises, but by a collection of premises in a designate area.

Applications for TEN's are not included in any of the 5 current CIP areas in Leeds, including Chapel Allerton.

On that basis, in general terms but also specific to this application, West Yorkshire Police give little if any weight at all, to the history of a premises in relation to sporadic applications for temporary events, where the extent of such activities affecting data used to formulate a policy of cumulative impact is unknown, and, which then applies for the same or similar hours in the form of a more permanent authorisation, which will undoubtedly have an effect on such a policy.

Finally, either as a restaurant, or as a bar, or both, the applicant has submitted minimal information to the licensing authority, as to why, in an area of cumulative impact, the presumption that an application would normally be refused, should be rebutted.

Therefore, in terms of location, the lack of information given for the description of the premises given and proposed trading until 03-00 / 03-30, West Yorkshire Police consider that this application implicates the current policy of cumulative impact for Chapel Allerton in every respect.





The premises were granted planning permission for change of use & extension to part of former police station to form restaurant and bar in July 2001 reference number 34/37/01/FU subject to a condition restricting the hours of use of the premises. The proposed hours of use set out in your Premises License application exceed those hours allowed by the planning permission.

We refer to the licence application for the above premises and write to officially register our objection.

Operating until 3am is completely unsuitable for the area with many residences nearby. The hours are in excess of any other licensed premises in the area and are more akin to that of a night club. If granted, the late opening will cause noise disturbance to surrounding homes and put people on the streets of Chapel Allerton at a far later hour, increasing the opportunity for public nuisance and disorder.
