CONFIDENTIAL AND EXEMPT ITEMS

The reason for confidentiality or exemption is stated on the agenda and on each of the reports in terms of Access to Information Procedure Rules 9.2 or 10.4(1) to (7). The number or numbers stated in the agenda and reports correspond to the reasons for exemption / confidentiality below:

9.0 Confidential information – requirement to exclude public access

9.1 The public must be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that confidential information would be disclosed. Likewise, public access to reports, background papers, and minutes will also be excluded.

9.2 Confidential information means

- (a) information given to the Council by a Government Department on terms which forbid its public disclosure or
- (b) information the disclosure of which to the public is prohibited by or under another Act or by Court Order. Generally personal information which identifies an individual, must not be disclosed under the data protection and human rights rules.

10.0 Exempt information – discretion to exclude public access

- 10. 1 The public may be excluded from meetings whenever it is likely in view of the nature of the business to be transacted or the nature of the proceedings that exempt information would be disclosed provided:
 - (a) the meeting resolves so to exclude the public, and that resolution identifies the proceedings or part of the proceedings to which it applies, and
 - (b) that resolution states by reference to the descriptions in Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (paragraph 10.4 below) the description of the exempt information giving rise to the exclusion of the public.
 - (c) that resolution states, by reference to reasons given in a relevant report or otherwise, in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information.
- 10.2 In these circumstances, public access to reports, background papers and minutes will also be excluded.
- 10.3 Where the meeting will determine any person's civil rights or obligations, or adversely affect their possessions, Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998 establishes a presumption that the meeting will be held in public unless a private hearing is necessary for one of the reasons specified in Article 6.
- 10. 4 Exempt information means information falling within the following categories (subject to any condition):
 - 1 Information relating to any individual
 - 2 Information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual.
 - Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information).
 - Information relating to any consultations or negotiations, or contemplated consultations or negotiations, in connection with any labour relations matter arising between the authority or a Minister of the Crown and employees of, or officer-holders under the authority.
 - Information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings.
 - 6 Information which reveals that the authority proposes
 - (a) to give under any enactment a notice under or by virtue of which requirements are imposed on a person; or
 - (b) to make an order or direction under any enactment
 - Information relating to any action taken or to be taken in connection with the prevention, investigation or prosecution of crime

Summary of main issues

This is an application for the grant of a premises licence made by Bospa Limited, for Cafe Bospa Ltd, 181A High Street, Boston Spa, Wetherby, LS23 6AA.

The application is made in respect of a Cafe Bar and Deli proposing the provision of Sale by Retail of Alcohol, Regulated Entertainment and Late Night Refreshment.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted representations from other persons.

1 Purpose of this report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a new premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2 History of the premises

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence for these premises.

3 The application

- 3.1 The applicant's name is Bospa Limited.
- 3.2 The proposed designated premises supervisor is Rebecca Louise Leighton.
- 3.3 In summary the application is for:

Supply of Alcohol

Sunday to Thursday: 08:00 – 23:00 Friday & Saturday: 08:00 – 00:00

Late Night Refreshment

Friday & Saturday: 23:00 – 00:00

Recorded Music

Sunday to Thursday: 08:00 – 23:00 Friday & Saturday: 08:00 – 00:00

- 3.4 A redacted version of the application has been attached at **Appendix A.**
- 3.5 The applicant proposes to promote the licensing objectives by taking the steps identified in the application at part M.

4 Location

4.1 A map which identifies the location of this premises is attached at **Appendix B.**

5 Representations

5.1 Under the Act representations can be received from anyone but they must be relevant and, in the case of a member of the public, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

Representations from Responsible Authorities

5.2 There have been no representations from responsible authorities.

Other representations

- The application has attracted representation from members of the public (described as 'other persons' in the legislation).
- The licensing authority is in receipt of 47 individual letters of objection. Local residents have concerns primarily on the grounds of public nuisance and that the proposed licensing hours exceed those of the current planning hours recently been granted.
- In order to protect personal data, redacted copies of the representations are attached at **Appendix C.** Sensitive copies will be available at the hearing for Member's consideration.
- The authority has also received 2 letters of support in relation to this application. Both authors feel the proposed Deli will have a positive impact on the area. Redacted copies can be found at **Appendix D.**

6 Licensing hours

- 6.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.8 to 6.15 of the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- 6.2 In brief the Policy states at 6.14 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so.
- 6.3 The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not adversely impact on the licensing objectives.
- A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at **Appendix E**.

7 Equality and diversity implications

7.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the licensing subcommittee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

8 Options available to Members

- 8.1 The licensing subcommittee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 8.2 Members of the licensing subcommittee are asked to note that they may not reject the whole or part of the application merely because they consider it desirable to do so. It must be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- 1. A suitable CCTV system will be operational at the premises at all times when licensable activities are being carried out and at any other time when members of the public are present on the premises.
- 2. The CCTV system will cover all areas of the premises occupied by the public under the terms of the premises licence, including corridors and stairways (excluding WC's and changing rooms).
- 3. The CCTV system will cover the main entrances and exits and designated emergency egress routes from the premises.
- 4. The CCTV system will contain the correct time and date stamp information.
- 5. The CCTV system will have sufficient storage retention capacity for a maximum of 31 days continuous footage which will be of good quality.
- 6. The CCTV system will be capable of securing relevant pictures for review or export at a later date.
- 7. A designated member/members of staff at the premises will be authorised to access the CCTV footage and be conversant with operating the CCTV system. At the request of an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a responsible authority (under the Licensing Act 2003), any CCTV footage, as requested, will be downloadede immediately or secured to prevent any overwriting. The planning permission granted determined that the unit could be;

- extended & follow the building line of all properties situated this side of the High Street. The process of extending the unit will commence soon.
- Used for A3 Use under the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes)
 Order 1987 as Restaurants and cafés with A3 stated as for the sale of food and drink for consumption on the premises restaurants, snack bars and cafes.

Contrary to some confusion, this unit has not got any planning consent for A4 Drinking Establishment being a Public house or similar.
