## **Executive Summary**

This report informs Members of an application for the review of a Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003, sought by West Yorkshire Police in respect of News and Booze, 14 Eldon Terrace, Woodhouse, Leeds, LS2 9AB. The licensing authority is now under a duty to review the premises licence held by these premises.

## 1.0 Purpose of this Report

1.1 This report provides Members with the background and history to the making of the review application made by West Yorkshire Police. The report sets out the relevant law when reviewing licences under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act"), and informs members of the options available to them when reviewing a premises licence.

## 2.0 Background Information

2.1 An application for a premises licence was originally made in July 2008. The application attracted representations from local residents, West Yorkshire Police and Leeds City Council Environmental Health. A committee hearing was scheduled for the 15<sup>th</sup> September where the licensing committee members heard from all parties and noted that agreements had been made with West Yorkshire Police and Environmental Health and that the applicant had amended the application to reduce the hours for sale by retail of alcohol. The sub committee made a decision to grant

the application as they were of the belief that in granting the application would not undermine the licensing objectives.

In October 2011 a licence transfer application specifying Mohammed Akbar Noori as premises licence holder was submitted along with a variation of designated premises supervisor specifying Mohebullah Noori as the authorised person. Both applications were granted as applied for and both individuals are still named on the premises licence.

An application to vary the premises licence was submitted in August 2013 where the applicant sought to vary the hours for sale by retail of alcohol from Monday to Saturday 08:00 – 00:00 and Sunday 10:00 -00:00 to a twenty four hour off licence every day.

Representation was received from West Yorkshire Police on the grounds that the premises were showing a pattern of fraudulent trading and thus undermining the licensing objective of crime and disorder.

The applicant consequently withdrew the application.

#### 3.0 Premises Licence

- 3.1 The premises licence holder is Mr Mohammed Akbar Noori.
- 3.2 A copy of the premises licence can be found at **Appendix A** of this report. In summary, the premises licence permits the following:
  - Sale by Retail of Alcohol

Monday to Saturday 08:00 - 00:00Sunday 10:00 - 00:00

Opening Hours to the public

Monday to Saturday 08:00 – 00:00 Sunday 10:00 – 00:00

#### 4.0 Designated Premises Supervisor

4.1 The Designated Premises Supervisor for the premises is Mr Mohebullah Noori.

#### 5.0 Location

5.1 A map which identifies the location of the premises is attached at **Appendix B**.

## 6.0 Main Issues

6.1 In summary the grounds for the review are that these off-licence premises and the Premises Licence Holder are and have been the subject of an investigation by HM Revenues and Customs.

Over the last 3 consecutive years seizures have been made for counterfeit products and goods which have not had UK duty paid.

Evidence shows that there is persistent and clear intention by the Premises Licence Holder to trade fraudulently at these premises, therefore undermining the licensing objectives as described above.

Member's attention is drawn towards a copy of the review application at **Appendix C** of this report. The application contains more in-depth information on the grounds for review.

# 7.0 Relevant Representations/Letters of Support

- 7.1 Under the Act representations/support can be received from responsible authorities and or other persons. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of other people, must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 7.2 No further representations or letters of support have been received with respect of this application.

## 8.0 Matters Relevant to the Application

- 8.1 Members of the Licensing Sub Committee must make decisions which are appropriate to the promotion of the licensing objectives which are:
  - the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - public safety;
  - the prevention of public nuisance; and
  - the protection of children from harm.
- In making their decision Members are obliged to have regard to guidance issued under Section 182 of the Act. A copy of the relevant section is attached at **Appendix D**. Members must also have regard to the Council's licensing policy, the relevant representations made and evidence they hear.

## 9.0 Implications for Council Policy and Government

9.1 It is the stated licensing policy of the Council that when considering a review the authority will take into account all relevant circumstances, but will view the matters listed in paragraph 13.15 of the policy with particular seriousness.

### 10.0 Legal and Resource Implications

- 10.1 There are no resource implications in determining the review.
- The Act provides the right to appeal on any decision reached on review. The right of appeal is to the Magistrate's Court.

#### 11.0 Recommendations

- 11.1 Members are requested to determine this review. The Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - to modify the conditions of the licence (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition);
  - exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates;

- to remove the Designated Premises Supervisor;
- to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months; and/or
- to revoke the licence.
- 11.2 Members may decide that no action is necessary and that the circumstance of the review does not require the Committee to take any steps to promote the licensing objectives.
- 11.3 Members should note the guidance also suggests it is open to Members to issue an informal warning to the licence holder or to recommend improvement within a particular time. However the Guidance further provides that where responsible authorities have already issued such warnings, the issuing of another warning should not be repeated.
- 11.4 Where the Committee decide that a modification of conditions or exclusion of licensable activities may be imposed, this can either be permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months.
- 11.5 Members are directed to paragraphs 11.25 to 11.31 of the Statutory Guidance which related to reviews arising in connection with crime.
- 11.6 Members of the Licensing Committee are asked to note that they may not take any of the steps outlined above merely because they consider it desirable to do so. It must be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
