
By customers being able to purchase alcohol with meals ordered in the restaurant and consumed therein will exacerbate noise problems when customers leave the establishment.

I refer tI refer to the above application and wish to lodge a strong objection on behalf of the members of Cross Gates Watch Residents Association. There is currently an appeal by the same applicant against refusal of a planning application and this is under consideration in Bristol concerning this property, where the owner has been attempting to extend the delivery hours to similar hours as requested in this licensing application. The restaurant currently with the existing delivery hours, which are not kept to, causes a great disturbance to nearby residents by reason of the noise and comings and goings attracted to this location.

It is noIIt is not clear from the notice I have received about this licensing applications whether the "sale by retail of alcohol" refers to:

(a) Pr(a) provision only of alcohol with meals ordered in the restaurant and consumed therein;

(b) Pr(b) provision of alcohol with takeaway meals ordered from the restaurant and consumed with the memeal at some other location (having been delivered by the restaurant, or having been collected by the the customer)

Or:Or:

(c) Sal(c) sale of alcohol to customers who carry the alcohol away for consumption in another location.

I would object to any and all of these definitions of "sale by retail of alcohol". Consuming alcohol with meals in this location is likely to exacerbate the existing noise and nuisance problem, and spread it across a wider area. Provision of alcohol with takeaway meals ordered by the customer and taken away for consumption in another location is likely to contribute to noise nuisance and littering with bottles, cans and takeaway cartons in the surrounding area. Sale of alcohol alone to people calling by will do the same, and may exacerbate problems from revellers walking back to Whinmoor around closing time and using the restaurant/takeaway as a "topping up" point. This will spread the nuisance problem further up Pendas Way towards Whinmoor.
