Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
 - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Location of activity: Indoors

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule relating to the licensing objectives

General – All four licensing objectives

4. The licence holder will monitor the primary use of the premises and if transaction data demonstrates that the premises are excluded premises pursuant to to S.176 of the Licensing Act 2003 the sale of alcohol until such time as the data demonstrates that the premises are not so excluded. Such data will be maintained on a 6 monthly basis and will be available on request to the police and the licensing authority.

The condition will fall away in the event that s. 176 is repealed.

The prevention of crime and disorder

5. A CCTV system will be installed or the existing system maintained, such system to be fit for the purpose.
6. The CCTV system shall be capable of producing immediate copies of recordings on site. Copies of recordings will be capable of being recorded digitally on the CD/DVD or other equivalent medium.
7. Any recording shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 28 days and shall be made available, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation to the police for inspection on request.
8. The system will display, on any recording the correct time and date of the recording.
9. A system will be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image.

10. The CCTV system will be maintained so as to be fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity.
11. The CCTV system will incorporate a camera covering the entrance door and the alcohol display areas and will be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard. The precise positions of the camera may be agreed, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, with the police from time to time.

The prevention of public nuisance

12. Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers shall be provided in and immediately outside the premises.

The protection of children from harm

13. The premises licence holder will ensure that any age verification policy will apply to the premises whereby all cashiers will be trained to ask any customer attempting to purchase alcohol, who appears to be under the age of 25 years (or older if the licence holder elects) to produce before being sold alcohol, identification being a passport or photocard driving licence bearing a holographic mark or other form of identification bearing the customer's photograph, date of birth and Proof of Age Standards Scheme (or similarly accredited scheme) hologram.

Public safety

14. The premises licence holder will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff. Such staff levels will be disclosed on request to the licensing authority and Police.
