1.	LMC update <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Would like to see an equal service across the City • Ensure all children who require support and live in Leeds, can access the service no matter what school they attend • Remove the gap that seems to exist between TaMHS and CaMHS services 	Info
2.	TaMHS service update <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Originally a 3 year pilot • Specialist mental health services working in school clusters, enabling local commissioning decisions within cluster groups • Citywide provision, with a 100% TaMHS service for all schools • TaMHS can refer into the CaMHS service. In the last 2 years, 20 referrals made into the service from 90 schools • Acknowledged some schools had limited engagement with school clusters • Wave 1 – for all pupils, wave 2 – targeted provision, wave 3 – commissioned process • Takes into account NICE guidelines • Funding streams, 87% direct school funding, 13% NHS Leeds CCGs • Schools allocated funding based on deprivation formula. The amount has not increased in the last 5 years • Schools see mental health support services crucial. There is a direct connection that adult mental health problems affecting children's mental health 	Info
3.	GP pilot service <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pilot running in 5 Leeds areas including Bramley, Pudsey, Brigshaw • GPs can refer into the service, single point of access • The service would need to inform the child's school that they are accessing the service, this would be one named individual at the school • GPs updated by letter stating the child is receiving treatment/or signposted to another appropriate service. Summary information only, not specific
