Leeds City Council is re-commissioning the Residential and Nursing Care Home provision in the city and intends to undertake a procurement process to implement a new framework agreement which will commence 1st July 2018 and expire 31st March 2023. A procurement process based on an application process will be undertaken to ensure a range and choice of care homes across the city. The documentation to be used has been co-produced with key stakeholders including service providers, service users and their family members. The proposed procurement related activity will not have a direct impact on any individual currently placed in a care home. Access to the services will not be changed and will continue to be based on an assessment of need undertaken by Adults and Health (and for self-funders by the care home themselves) thus there will be no organisational barriers to accessing these services due to the procurement process.

All care home providers are by law required to be registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC) who undertake inspections of the care homes to ensure that the fundamental standards are being met. This will still be the case whilst the procurement process is on-going and throughout the lifetime of the next framework agreement.

The Fundamental Standards inspected against by CQC specifically require service providers to carry out a holistic person centred assessment to ensure that they can meet all of the identified needs and personally identified outcomes of the service user including any such needs deriving from protected characteristics. This ensures that the provider has the staff with the skills, knowledge and experience to ensure both needs and personally identified outcomes can be successfully met.

The findings of such inspections are backed by a series of legally enforceable sanctions available to CQC including removing registration which would in effect be a requirement to close the provision if it continuously fails to meet standards.

Service users and their family members, care staff and care home managers have been consulted about service provision and their views have been incorporated into the revised service specification and quality standards wherever possible. Service providers have given positive feedback about the implementation of a Care Quality Team who though part of LCC, will proactively work with service providers to enhance the quality of services and the proposed changes to the Leeds City Council Adults and Health quality standards which will inform our own monitoring process leading to improved quality ofcare within the city.

LCC monitors data on equality and diversity characteristics of the service users we fund in the independent sector residential and nursing care homes, allowing analysis of profiles to identify differences in representation and then understand the reasons for these differences and this will continue to be the case.

This information will be monitored to identify any potential barriers to accessing the service.
