

# Primary 2018 allocations

## Elected Member Briefing note 12/04/18

We have allocated **9595** Reception places for September 2018, (9683 last year, a reduction this year of 88). **88%** of families were successful with their first preference school (87% last year). A total of 10,659 places were available.

**8460 (88%) children were given their 1<sup>st</sup> preference (8458 / 87% last year)**

**578 (6%) children were given their 2<sup>nd</sup> preference (594 / 6% last year)**

**154 (1.5%) children were given their 3<sup>rd</sup> preference (205 / 2% last year)**

**79 (<1%) children were given their 4<sup>th</sup> preference (84 / <1% last year)**

**45 (<1%) children were given their 5<sup>th</sup> preference (58 / <1% last year)**

279 children (3%) were not able to be offered any of their preferences (unplaced) and were made an alternative offer (284 or 3% last year).

### Impact of Learning Places programme

For 2018, the Learning Places programme has:

- Expanded 5 schools to provide 5 forms of entry (FE) or 150 new permanent places.
- Supported the opening of a new Free School – Elements Primary Academy in Middleton, providing 2 new FE or 60 new permanent places
- 1.5 FE (45) additional places as ‘bulge’ cohorts

In the Alwoodley ward, Brodetsky Primary School consulted to reduce their PAN for September 2018, therefore there were 15 fewer places available at the school for September 2018

## Ward level summary

The table attached denotes the offers and preferences for *children living within the ward*. The ward totals include children who live in the relevant ward but who may have gained a place in another Leeds ward or another local authority. As Leeds is a small net importer of children, the total number of offers made to Leeds children is lower than the total number of offers made in Leeds schools outlined above.

## What to do if one of your constituents approaches you for help

If a family has been refused an offer at a preferred school, this will be because the school filled its places with children who met higher priorities of the admissions policy, or met the same priority but lived closer to the school.

We would always advise that families accept the offer they have been made, as declining an offer may mean that they are without a place in September. Accepting an offer does not affect a child's chances of receiving a more preferred offer through the waiting list or appeals process.

The first thing parents can do is to send back the **waiting list** request form by the **deadline of 30 April**. This will ensure that their child is placed on the waiting list for their preferred schools at the earliest point and give them the greatest chance that they may be offered a place. We have already received some late applications and these parents will be offered a place once the waiting lists open following the deadline above.

They can also request an **appeal** for any school they have been refused. In order to hear the appeal at the earliest opportunity they must return the form **by 15 May**. Appeals requested after this will be heard within 40 school days, but this may not be before the end of term.

You may wish to write a letter of support for them or accompany them at an appeal. Only elected members with a direct conflict of interest (who are on the governing body of the school, or have lead responsibility for education) are not able to support parents in this way.

If a genuine mistake has been made we will always seek to correct it without the parent having to go to an appeal.
