Summary of main issues

- Planning permission 16/02252/FU was granted on 4th August 2016 for the change of use of a vacant office building (B1) and extension of existing building to form Hotel (C1), with ancillary café (A3) and gym (D2), car parking, access, landscaping and other associated works at Bridge Street, Sheepscar, LS2 7QZ. A location plan is attached at **Appendix 2**.
- The off-site highway works are described in detail in para 7.2 below and briefly comprise,
 - Bridge Street closure of the existing vehicular access and replacement with full face kerb and the extension of the existing adopted low retaining wall and parapet (located along the carriageway edge) across the access to be closed.
 - ii) Gower Street construction of a new vehicular access and provision of a continuous full face kerb to both sides of that access to tie in to the existing footway. Relocation of an existing controlled on-street parking bay from the east side to the west side of the site access and the introduction of No Loading/No Waiting restrictions at the site access and along the Gower Street site frontage up to the controlled parking bays.
 - iii) Regent Street / New York Road closure of the existing vehicular access including the replacement with a widened full face kerb which will require the dedication and adoption as highway, of a small section of land from within the development site.

- To meet the requirements of the planning permission and deliver the highway alterations, the applicant has requested that Leeds City Council, as Highway Authority, enters into a Section 278 Agreement to enable the highway works to be carried out.
- This report seeks authority to negotiate terms and enter a Minor S278 Agreement for the highway works in order to allow the developer to complete the detailed design and construction of the works under the supervision of the Council.

Best City Ambition

The Best City ambition is to improve life for the people of Leeds and make our city a better place. The highway works will contribute to this ambition by improving pedestrian facilities in the locality through the closure of existing access points to vehicles and the reinstatement of full height footway along most of the site frontage with Gower Street, on Bridge Street and at the junction of New York Road with Regent Street.

Recommendations

- 1. The Chief Officer (Highways and Transportation) is requested to:
 - i) note the principles of the highway works to provide safe pedestrian and vehicular access to the development site;
 - ii) give authority to incur expenditure of £7,500 TRO costs and £5,000 staff checking and inspection costs, all to be fully rechargeable to the developer through the Section 278 agreement;
 - iii) request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order to introduce double yellow lines indicating No Waiting and No Loading at Any Time at the site access and along the Gower Street site frontage and relocation of a controlled on-street parking bay, as indicated on Drawing No. 70017468-GA-100_P03, included as **Appendix 3** and if no valid objections are received, to make and seal the TRO as advertised.
 - iv) note and approve the changes to the adopted Highway boundary proposed as part of the works as described in section 7.2. The area shown in red on the attached Proposed Adopted Highway Plan, included as **Appendix 4**, will be the resultant area of adopted Highway.
 - v) give authority to negotiate the terms of and enter into an agreement with the developer under the provisions of Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980;

5 Purpose of this report

- 5.1 The purpose of this report is to note the principle of the implementation of highway works associated with the development of a Hotel (C1), with ancillary café (A3) and gym (D2), car parking, access, landscaping and other associated works at Bridge Street, Sheepscar, LS2 7QZ.
- 5.2 To obtain authority to negotiate the terms of and enter into an Agreement under the provisions of Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980, whereby the associated highway works are designed and constructed by the developer at their expense,

- with the Council checking the design and construction, with step in rights, at the developer's expense.
- Indicative details of the proposed waiting restrictions are included on Drawing no. 70017468-GA-100 P03 shown at **Appendix 3**.

6 Background information

- Planning permission 16/02252/FU was granted on 4th August 2016 for the for the change of use of a vacant office building (B1) and extension of existing building to form Hotel (C1), with ancillary café (A3) and gym (D2), car parking, access, landscaping and other associated works at Bridge Street, Sheepscar, LS2 7QZ.
- Highway works are required to provide satisfactory pedestrian and vehicular access and to mitigate the effect of the traffic associated with the development on the adjacent highways. The highway works are shown indicatively on the attached plan Drawing No.70017468-GA-100_P03 shown at **Appendix 3** and detailed in Section 7.2.
- To meet the obligations of the planning permission and deliver the works the applicant has requested that Leeds City Council, as Highway Authority, enters into a Section 278 Agreement to enable the highway works to be carried out.

7 Main issues

- 7.1 Ultra Asset Holdings Ltd received planning permission for (ref: 16/02252/FU) Hotel (C1), with ancillary café (A3) and gym (D2), car parking, access, landscaping and other associated works at Bridge Street, Sheepscar, LS2 7QZ.
- 7.2 Highway works are proposed to provide safe and satisfactory pedestrian and vehicular access to the development. The proposed works comprise:
 - a. Bridge Street closure of the existing vehicular access and replacement with full face kerb and the extension of the existing adopted low retaining wall and parapet (located along the carriageway edge) across the full extent of the access to be closed.
 - b. Gower Street construction of a new vehicular access and provision of a continuous full face kerb to both sides of that access to tie in to the existing footway. Relocation of an existing controlled on-street parking bay from the east side to the west side of the site access and the introduction of No Loading/No Waiting restrictions at the site access and along the Gower Street site frontage up to the controlled parking bays.
 - c. Regent Street/New York Road closure of the existing vehicular access including its replacement with a widened full face kerb. Which will require the dedication and adoption as highway, of a small section of land from within the development site.
 - d. Any works reasonably required following safety audits of the design and construction of the highway works.

- e. All associated civils works, including (inter alia) reconstruction, tie-ins, resurfacing, lighting, signing, drainage and lining works etc.
- f. Any associated statutory undertakers' works resulting from the works.
- 7.3 Indicative details of the works are included and highlighted on Drawing No. 70017468-GA-100 P03 shown at **Appendix 3**.
- 7.4 Given the scale of the works, it has been agreed that the developer will enter a Minor Section 278 Agreement with the Council whereby the developer will design and procure the highway works at the their expense and the Council will check the design of the work and inspect the construction, with step in powers should the works not be managed or constructed to appropriate standards.
- 7.5 Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980 allows Highways Authorities to enter into agreements with developers for the execution of highway works at the developer's expense. The preconditions for an agreement under Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980 are, first, that the Highway Authority should be satisfied that it will be of benefit to the public to enter into an agreement for the execution of the works and, secondly, that the work must fall within the Highway Authority's powers of road building, improvement and maintenance.

8 Corporate Considerations

8.1 Consultation and Engagement

- 8.1.1 Ward Members: Ward Members were consulted by email dated 31 May 2018. At the time of writing no comments have been received from the Ward Members.
- 8.1.2 Emergency Services and WYCA: The Emergency Services and WYCA were consulted via email dated 31 May 2018. No comments have been received.
- 8.1.3 Internal consultation has taken place with colleagues in the Highways and Transportation Services. Any substantive comments will be taken into account as part of the design checking process.

8.2 Equality and Diversity / Cohesion and Integration

- 8.2.1 An EDCI Impact Assessment has been carried out on the Section 278 Process and is attached as **Appendix 1**. The assessment confirmed that individual designs put forward as part of this process, will take into account the needs of each of the equality characteristics and will aim to meet Section 278 (4) which states that "A highway authority shall not enter into an agreement under this section unless they are satisfied that it will be of benefit to the public". As part of the design and construction process further equality screenings and impact assessments will be undertaken as required.
- 8.2.2 The proposals will ultimately contribute to improved accessibility to the site for pedestrians via improved footways. The works will be designed to accommodate the needs of all users.

8.3 Council Policies and City Priorities

8.3.1 The proposed highway works which allow the development to take place accord with the West Yorkshire Local Transport Plan and other policies in that they provide a safe means of access for all users of the highway, to and around, the development.

8.4 Resources and value for money

8.4.1 The developer will meet the Council's costs, estimated to be £7,500 for traffic regulation order costs and £5,000 fees to check the design and inspect the works, which will be fully funded through the Section 278 agreement.

S278 agreements can be entered into with an individual, but generally they are made between Developers and the Council.

There are three types of S278 agreements:

Mini Section 278 Agreements

A Mini Section 278 Agreement is a formal arrangement to enable developers to carry out extremely minor highway works. This type of agreement covers minor footway crossing works, amendments to paving to provide level access, removal and reinstatement of planters, etc where the Developer designs and constructs the works, but provides a bond as surety. Leeds City Council obtains staff fees for checking the design and supervision of the works and fixed legal costs. This type of agreement is very minor in nature and does not include for commuted sums (payments for maintenance).

Minor Section 278 Agreements

A Minor Section 278 Agreement is a formal arrangement for developers to carry out minor highway works themselves. It follows the same format as a mini S278 agreement but is used for schemes which are slightly more involved than a footway crossing, but not so involved that there is any major requirement for traffic management on a busy road, or likely involvement with statutory undertakers, and the design is not complex in any way. This type of agreement is most often used where the development and highway works are adjacent or make use of the same site, making it very difficult for a separate contractor to be working in the same area, eg re-paving footways, provision of lay-by within a site contractor's working zone. A Minor S278 still requires the provision of a bond but does

also allow for the acquisition of commuted sums for maintenance.

Standard Section 278 Agreements

A Standard Section 278 Agreement is used for all other highway works. The works are designed and supervised by Leeds City Council on behalf of the Developer. This type of agreement is used for most significant off-site highway works associated with planning applications. Standard S278 agreements do not require the provision of a bond as all monies are paid upfront.

Process Review

When considering the requirements of a planning application that will require a S278 agreement to deliver highway works once consent is granted, a pro-forma is completed which considers the following:

- Accessibility using guidelines laid down in the Leeds Core Strategy, Manual for Streets and LCC Street Design Guide (which has been the subject of an EIA) consideration is given to; walkers, cyclists, public transport users, vulnerable road users and impact on services nearby, for example - schools
- Vehicular access safety of this relating to width, radii, visibility splays, crossing opportunities
- Internal layout / servicing / bins shared surface issues. Ability to move around safely.
- Parking safety issues, availability of disabled spaces in line with the Core Strategy and Parking SPD.
- Travel Plan Availability and accessibility of public transport.
- Off site highways works impacts of the development on the surrounding area e.g.
 increased traffic flows, do we need a new set of traffic lights.
- Road safety current statistics and impact on these.
- Planning conditions

These items are considered in terms of the protected characteristics.

S278 (4) states that "A highway authority shall not enter into an agreement under this section unless they are satisfied that it will be of benefit to the public", and any suggested changes are put forward with this in mind.
