2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

This screening is concerned with the impact of awarding a contract to Leeds Community Foundation for the delivery of the Ideas that Change Lives Investment Fund, without going out to tender.

Leeds Community Foundation has won two consecutive competitive tendering exercises and were the only respondent to a recent (May 2018) market sounding exercise. This indicates that there are no other providers in the market willing or able to deliver the contract (within the budget envelope) and that going out to tender is likely to result in the same current provider being awarded the contract. The risk of challenge by another provider is very low.

Ideas that Change Lives (ItCL) aims to develop the market by encouraging new socially enterprising ideas and services that enable Leeds residents with care and support needs to improve their health and well-being and remain independent.

ItCL, which is currently delivered by Leeds Community Foundation in partnership with SEEAhead, provides business support and financial investment to both individuals and organisations that can develop services with social benefit.

The intended outcomes of the programme are to:

- Improve the quality of life for people with care and support needs
- Provide choice and control for people who have care and support needs
- Ensure value for money and best use of the Leeds pound

The contract period runs from October 2015-October 2018. The new contract is for five years, starting in October 2018.

The fund has two levels: •Kick Start (up to £4k) •Development (up to £15k)

For both Kick Start and Development grants, projects must have a clear economic focus around generating income perhaps through gaining a contract to provide services, or from individuals with the means to pay for a service directly.

The aim of the ItCL investment fund is to create new services and activities which specifically target the following groups of people who have care and support needs to help them remain indepdent and support them to be better connected where they live. :

- Older people
- People with a learning disability; physical disability or sensory impairment
- People with mental health needs
- People with alcohol or substance use issues
- People with long term health conditions
- Carers
- Young people in transition between adults and children's social care services

Services and activities that are developed by ItCL funded social enterprises enable people with care and support needs to participate in areas previously not available to them. The fund also encourages and supports individuals that have care and support needs to develop their own user led social enterprises.

During the current contract period 21 applications to the Fund have been approved, awarding a total of £203,090. Of those:

- 5 targeted learning disabled people
- > 4 were for those needing mental health support
- ➢ 6 were for older people
- > 3 targeted people with physical or sensory impairment
- 2 targeted people with autism
- 1 targeted older LGBT+

The types of services that were piloted or developed include:

- > alternatives to day services including creative / sensory experiences
- cafes / food based training
- support in the home / garden
- > mobility
- > employment

Key findings

The Ideas that Change Lives programme encourages increased contact with different groups and organisations through the provision of events delivered by Leeds Community Foundation or their partner, SEEAhead. All successful applicants to the fund during the new contract period will be invited to participate in peer support networks.

All applicants to the fund will be offered 1:1 business support as experience shows that those in receipt of business support are more likely to be successful at panel.

Applicants are also asked as part of the application process to demonstrate how the proposed socially enterprising idea benefits people with care and support needs and how they have been consulted and involved in developing the idea.

Leeds Community Foundation have over 20 years of experience in managing grant programmes so have a good understanding of the different communities in Leeds and how to make contact with them.

Awarding the contract to Leeds Community Foundation will enable the contract to continue to be delivered to a high standard.

During the current contract period, Leeds Community Foundation has been collecting case studies which will be used to promote the programme across the city when the new contract is launched.

ItCL is widely publicised in various formats – on the Leeds Community Foundation website, through the Leeds Directory newsletter, emails to various networks and umbrella organisations such as Forum Central so information can be shared amongst their members.

Social Enterprises funded through ItCL are encouraged to promote their service by having a listing on the Leeds Directory which averages 8000 unique website visits per month.

Contract monitoring takes place quarterly by the ItCL contract officer in addition to bimonthly progress reporting. The current provider has delivered a high quality service and continued delivery by the provider is likely to produce similar results.
