Summary of main issues

- 1. There are three cremator machines at Lawnswood of which two machines are coming towards the end of their operational lives.
- 2. There is a reputational risk to the Council if cremation services were to be disrupted for any length of time due to machine break down. In addition, the service is likely to incur increased costs associated with any subsequent maintenance or repairs.
- 3. There is a clear service need to urgently replace one of the three machines with the same suited set as that of the other Crematoria to ensure service continuity, running efficiency and value for money. It is also proposed to install a cold store to bring Lawnswood in line with the other Council managed crematoria
- 4. Funding for this can be met via the Capital programme.

Recommendations

5. The Chief Officer Parks and Countryside is requested to approve the authority to spend as set out within the attached appendix for the urgent replacement of one of the cremators at Lawnswood Crematorium including cold store.

1 Purpose of this report

1.1 The purpose of this report is to request approval to spend from the capital programme in order to replace one of the cremators at Lawnswood Cemetery within the Parks & Countryside service.

2 Background information

- 2.1 Leeds City Council is one of the busiest Crematoria Authorities dealing with over 5,000 cremations per year and manages three crematoria located at Cottingley, Rawdon and Lawnswood.
- 2.2 During the last seven years, the cremator machines have all been replaced following a procurement tender exercise at both Rawdon and Cottingley Crematoria. Facultatieve Technologies Ltd (FT) were successful in both of these recent tenders.
- 2.3 This report relates to one of two cremators at Lawnswood that are coming towards the end of their operational lives.
- 2.4 The current manufacturer has manged to keep two cremators going however, in recent weeks, both machines have required urgent work during the same period of time. Given the age of two of the cremators there is a high risk of disruption to services and reputational risk to the Council due to any length of machine down time and an increase in costs associated with the maintenance service and repair.
- 2.5 It is also proposed to install a secure refrigeration unit for the storage of coffins in the event of any unforeseen emergency or breakdown. This would bring Lawnswood in line with the other two Council managed crematoria.

3 Main issues

- 3.1 Design proposals and full scheme description.
- 3.2 **Programme** The ordering will consist of using the existing manufacturer for which a procurement waiver has been approved to purchase one new cremator. This will be of the same bespoke specialist design as those machines that have already been procured at both Rawdon and Cottingley.
- 3.3 The manufacturer has also confirmed that there will be little if no service disruption as works will be undertaken outside of the normal operational working hours and they will be able to install the new cremator before the end of this financial year.
- 3.4 No additional infrastructure works are required as it involves replacing an existing machine with a new one, utilising the same space and area.
- 3.5 This equipment is of a technical and specialist nature that is required to replace a suite of machines that have been procured at both Rawdon and Cottingely Crematoria and the procurement method is also considered within the confidential appendix and is attached to this report.

4 Corporate considerations

4.1 Consultation and engagement

4.1.1 The Executive Member for Environment & Active Lifestyles has been consulted on these proposals.

4.2 Equality and diversity / cohesion and integration

4.2.1 Due regard has been given throughout the decision making process and a screening document has been prepared and an independent impact assessment is not required for the approvals requested. The screening document has been sent to the equality team to be approved and published.
