Project Summary
<p>The Breeze Challenge @ Farnley and Wortley Rec's won't just challenge the young person's at the challenge in the fastest time or build the biggest den, in fact that's not the real aim at all. The Challenge aims to encourage young people to engage with each other, learn how to communicate and strengthen new and existing friendships.</p> <p>Team games are a great way to break down barriers and encourage different groups to come together. The young people will register at the Breeze Van and have a short introduction to the challenge being put into a group. Each participant will be given a team score sheet, and within each group rotating designated captain to referee each challenge.</p> <p>Breeze staff will be on hand to support and encourage each group. As a reward we have a Music where each young person is given the opportunity to learn the basics of Djing live from the Breeze. The DJ will also provide a festival atmosphere across the event.</p> <p>To top it off, after what will be an energy sapping challenge the young people can relax with a coffee and take on the quickest lap competition on the games console whilst chatting to their new friends. Once they have completed all the challenges, groups can form new groups and take on the challenge or explore the multi games box.</p>

When will the project run?

On 2 days over the April School Holidays between the hours of 12.00 – 15.00

How many people can attend?

We will be able to actively engage up to 87 young people

Targets for the project and how success will be measured

To engage at least 30 young people in the Breeze Challenge at each event
Through positive feedback from participants on good team work.
Participant information will be recorded for monitoring and feedback purposes.

How the project will be promoted and/or participation encouraged

Using banners erected in advance at each site, social media, flyers distributed in the immediate area and through local partners.

Exit strategy/How the project will continue after the funding

We will use the sessions to direct young people to local provision and to further Breeze events in the area including the Breeze Saturday Night project.

Other organisations involved

We will approach local organisations and services working with young people to gather information through which we can sign post young people into further activity.
