Good afternoon.

I am the licensing Police Officer looking over your application for an alcohol licence.

We have received the plans you submitted, but could I ask that you submit plans which also show your table and seating layout for the restaurant.

Please be aware, these plans will form part of your licence should it be granted, meaning that their location on the plans would need to remain the same in the restaurant.

Please be aware that I am in the process of submitting a "Qualified Objection" to your licence application.

What this means, is that there are a few points I have concerns about. I have then offered some conditions which would help reduce my concerns. Should you agree to those conditions I would withdraw my objection. If you do not agree to them, I am happy to have a conversation with you to see what we can agree on. If no agreement is made, then my objection will remain and your licence application would be taken to a hearing.

I am only in the process of this at the minute, and have not formally submitted it.

Some of my recommendations will just be expanding on your offered conditions such as CCTV. Others I feel are necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

At this moment I have concerns regarding the late night operation on your application for Fridays / Saturdays, and that your restaurant will not remain a food led premises.

If you could contact me at your earliest convenience to discuss the matters. I will be happy to visit to speak in person if you prefer.

APPLICATION FOR NEW PREMISES LICENCE – LICENSING ACT 2003:
POLICE – LETTER OF REPRESENTATION – 'QUALIFIED' OBJECTION:**

Thank you for submitting your application for a new premises licence at the above address which we received on 14th January 2019.

West Yorkshire Police are of the opinion that your application contains insufficient information about how you intend to meet the licensing objectives.

We therefore confirm that we are submitting a formal representation against your application on the grounds of:-

1. the prevention of crime & disorder
2. public safety
3. protection of children from harm

However, we are of the opinion that the licensing objectives could be met should you be prepared to incorporate certain identified measures within your operating schedule as conditions.

Please find enclosed a document which at **Part 1** contains the suggested measures which this authority considers are proportionate and appropriate to the nature of your application.

Should you be in agreement with the suggested measures then please signify this by completing and signing **Part 2** of the enclosed form and return the complete document to this office as soon as possible.

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Upon receipt of your consent at **Part 2**, it will be taken that you signify your wishes for the licensing authority to amend your operating schedule to incorporate the proposed measures as conditions.

Alternatively should you disagree with the proposed measures, then please complete **Part 3** and again return the complete document to this office as soon as possible.

PART 1 - to be completed by the Responsible Authority:

West Yorkshire Police propose the following control measures under the Licensing Act 2003 (in addition to those that you may have already offered), for the premises:-

Massawa Restaurant, 87 Roundhay Road Leeds LS85AQ

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, West Yorkshire Police considers that the following measures are relevant, proportionate and necessary in order to promote the following licensing objectives:-

- the prevention of crime & disorder
- public safety
- Protection of children from harm

Measures / Additional measures proposed:

A suitable Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) system will be operational at the premises at all times when licensable activities are being carried out and at any other times where members of the public are present on the premises.

The CCTV system will cover all areas of the premises occupied by the public under the terms of the licence, including corridors and stairways (excluding WCs and changing rooms).

The CCTV system will cover all areas of the premises occupied by the public under the terms of the licence, including corridors and stairways (excluding WCs and changing rooms).

The CCTV system will cover all external areas of the premises occupied by the public, i.e. queuing areas, beer gardens, smoking areas and car parks.

The CCTV system will be of a satisfactory resolution quality which will enable the identification of persons and activities, and other fine details such as vehicle registration number plates.

The CCTV system will contain the correct time and date stamp information.

The CCTV system will have sufficient storage retention capacity for a minimum of 31 days' continuous footage which will be of good quality.

The CCTV footage will be controlled and kept in a secure environment to prevent tampering or unauthorised viewing. A record will be kept of who has accessed the system, the reason why and when.

A designated member / members of staff at the premises will be authorised to access the CCTV footage and be conversant with operating the CCTV system. At the request of an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority (under the Licensing Act 2003) any CCTV footage, as requested, will be downloaded

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immediately or secured to prevent any overwriting. The CCTV footage material will be supplied, on request, to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority.

The CCTV system will be adequately maintained and be capable of transporting recorded material onto a removable media.

The CCTV system replay software must allow an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or Responsible Authority to search the picture footage effectively and see all the information contained in the picture footage.

It must be possible to replay exported files immediately e.g. no re-indexing of files or verification checks.

A Supervisor's Register will be maintained at the licensed premises, showing the names, addresses and up-to-date contact details for the DPS and all personal licence holders.

The Supervisors Register will state the name of the person who is in overall charge of the premises at each time that licensed activities are carried out, and this information will be retained for a period of twelve months and produced for inspection on request to an authorised officer.

The PLH/DPS will ensure that an Incident Report Register is maintained on the premises to record incidents such as anti social behaviour, admissions refusals and ejections from the premises.

The Incident Report Register will contain consecutively numbered pages, the date time and location of the incident, details of the nature of the incident, the names and registration numbers of any door staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and personal licence numbers (if any) of any other staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and numbers of any police officers attending, the police incident and / or crime number, names and addresses of any witnesses and confirmation of whether there is CCTV footage of the incident.

The Incident Report Register will be produced for inspection immediately on the request of an authorised officer.

The PLH/DPS staff will ask for proof of age from any person appearing to be under the age of 25 who attempts to purchase alcohol at the premises.

Drinks, open bottles and glasses will not be taken from the premises at any time. Empty bottles and glasses will be collected regularly and promptly. Glass and other sharp objects will be stored and disposed of safely using suitable receptacles. Receptacles will be secured and not accessible to the customers.

The PLH/DPS will prominently display notices which inform customers that open bottles or glasses may not be taken off the premises.

Notices indicating the existence and effect of a Public Space Protection Order will be prominently displayed at the exits to the premises.

The premises shall be and remain predominantly food led.

At any time that the premises licence has effect the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises will be ancillary to the service of table meals

Waiter/waitress service will be in operation throughout the premises in relation to orders for food and/or alcohol

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West Yorkshire Police are satisfied that the proposed measures are not adequately dealt with by other legislation.

By signing the declaration enclosed overleaf at **Part 2**, the applicant agrees to incorporate the proposed measures within the Operating Schedule for the said premises.

Upon the satisfactory completion of the declaration, West Yorkshire Police will provide notice to the Licensing Authority that our representation is withdrawn in accordance with schedule 10(a) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
