No consideration has been given to reduce the noise levels for residents


The proposed outside bar/servery would lead to more outside functions causing further noise from the garden swearing shouting singing until late evening

The traffic is another issue with cars parking on the brow of the hill and the pavement. 1:13 PM on 30 Aug 2019 Comment: I am very concerned about the increase in traffic using the pub, mainly from outside of the village area, which has now become a serious safety and obstruction problem for local residents. The pub car park capacity was already totally inadequate for the massive increase in usage, thus there is an overflow of vehicles regularly parking on Batley Road immediately outside the pub. These vehicles are parked with little or no consideration for people living on either side of Batley Road. They cause serious problems for local residents trying to exit and enter in their properties in vehicles and other road users. In particular parking on the pavements is a regular occurrence. I and many local residents have personal experience of the obstructing of pavements, which have necessitated pedestrians with pushchairs, wheelchairs and walking frames, having to step onto the road to pass by vehicles. The application to increase the parking is very modest and will not reduce the afore mentioned problems. The car park entry point is not able to facilitate entry and exit by more than one vehicle at a time. The topography of Batley Road at this entry point is the apex of a steep hill. The inadequate access point, combined with vehicles parked stupidly on Batley Road to either side of this access point seriously restrict driver visibility when exiting the car park, with cars trying to enter having to swing into the middle of the road at the brow of a blind hill. The extending of the opening time to 08.00 is during the peak traffic movement time and local school run. Unless there is an improvement to the carpark, access point, restrictions to parking on Batley Road, in the immediate vicinity of the pub and it's car park access point, there is the potential for a serious accident to occur.
